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MINUTES BY THE GOVERNOR.**THE CEYLON JUDICIAL SERVICE.**

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased, with the approval of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, to direct the publication of the following Minute:—

1. There shall be constituted with effect from July 1, 1939, a Judicial Service consisting of—
 - (a) One officer in the Special Class (District Judge, Colombo)—salary, Rs. 16,800 per annum.
 - (b) Six officers in Class I., Grade 1—salary, Rs. 15,000 per annum.
 - (c) Ten officers in Class I., Grade 2—salary, Rs. 12,000 per annum.
 - (d) Ten officers in Class I., Grade 3—salary, Rs. 10,200 per annum.
 - (e) Eleven officers in Class II., Grade 1—salary, Rs. 9,000 per annum.
 - (f) Eight officers in Class II., Grade 2—salary, Rs. 7,200 per annum.

2. No person shall be eligible for appointment unless he is an Advocate or Proctor of the Supreme Court of Ceylon and has practised as such for a period of not less than six years.

3. First appointments to the Service will not necessarily be made in Grade 2 of Class II., but in any Class or in any Grade of any Class.

4. Appointments to and promotions in the Service will be made by the Governor with the advice of the Judicial Appointments Board and will be subject to the approval of the Secretary of State. The approval of the Secretary of State will, however, not be necessary in the case of the transfer of an officer from one post to another in the same Grade of the Service, or in the case of an officer appointed to act temporarily in any Class or Grade higher than his own.

5. First appointments to the Service will be made on two years' probation. Transfers to the Service of judicial officers holding permanent appointments in any of the posts enumerated in paragraph 9 will not be regarded as first appointments.

6. A vacancy in the Special Class or in any Grade of any Class in the Service other than Grade 2 of Class II. will not necessarily be filled by promotion within the Service.

7. Merit and not seniority will be the criterion for promotion from a lower to a higher Class or Grade.

8. For purposes of leave, discipline, and administration, officers in the Service will be under the general control of the Legal Secretary.

9. The posts designated in the first column will ordinarily be held by officers of the Grade and Class specified in the corresponding entries in the second column hereunder—

Any officer of the Service may at any time be appointed to any post designated above irrespective of the Class or Grade assigned to that post or of the Class to which that officer belongs.

10. An officer in any Grade in Class I. or Class II. may be transferred to any other post of the same Grade of the same Class by the Governor with the advice of the Judicial Appointments Board.

11. An officer in the Service appointed to act temporarily in a Class or Grade higher than his own will be entitled to officiating salary in accordance with the Financial Regulations of Government; but Supernumerary Judges will not be entitled to such officiating salary.

12. Any officer, other than a member of the Ceylon Civil Service, who on the date of the establishment of the Judicial Service holds a permanent appointment in any post designated in the first column of paragraph 9 other than that of Supernumerary Judge will, with effect from that date, be transferred to the Judicial Service, to the Grade or Class specified for that post in the second column of that paragraph on the salary assigned thereto in paragraph 1. Where an officer is so transferred to any Class or Grade of any Class which carries a salary less than that of his appointment prior to such transfer he will continue to draw his salary notwithstanding that it may be higher than the salary of the Class or Grade of the Class to which he is transferred.

RULES.

The general rules published by Notification dated August 12, 1926, in *Gazette* No. 7,542 of August 20, 1926, as last amended by rules published in *Gazette* No. 8,384 of July 29, 1938, are further amended as follows :—

(1) by the substitution, for rules 13, 107, and 108, respectively, of the following new rules :—

" 13. He may with due regard to the needs of the prison and without unduly interfering with the vocational training and labour of the prisoners employ such number and such classes of prisoners, as may from time to time be approved in writing by the Inspector-General, in keeping the prison and the clothing, bedding, furniture, and utensils used therein in a clean and proper condition, and preparing and serving the food of prisoners and at such other tasks as may be necessary for the service of the prison. No prisoner or prison officer shall be employed in the private service of any prison officer or of any other person, and no prison labour shall be hired out to or placed free of cost at the disposal of any local authority or corporation without the sanction of the Executive Committee of Home Affairs."

" 107. The clothing and other property brought at the time of admission into prison by each convicted prisoner, sentenced to imprisonment for a term or two or more terms in the aggregate not exceeding three years, shall be made into a bundle, labelled with the prisoner's name and register number, and kept in store for delivery to him on his discharge."

" 108. (1) The clothing brought at the time of admission into prison by each convicted prisoner sentenced to imprisonment for a term or two or more terms in the aggregate exceeding three years, shall be sold by public auction and the proceeds of such sale shall be credited to public revenue. All such clothing shall be collected, and the collection so made during each quarter shall be sold by public auction on such dates as may be appointed therefor by the Superintendent.

(2) Every prisoner referred to in paragraph (1) shall on his discharge be supplied with clothing at Government expense in accordance with the provisions of Schedule IV. to these rules."

(2) by the substitution in rule 109, for the words " one year ", of the words " three years ".

(3) by the insertion, immediately after rule 109, of the following new rule 109A :—

" 109A. The clothing or other property brought into prison by an unconvicted prisoner at the time of his admission into prison, and remaining unclaimed for a period of three months after his discharge, shall be sold by public auction and the proceeds of such sale shall be credited to public revenue. All such unclaimed clothing or other property shall be collected, and the collection so made during each quarter shall be sold by public auction on such dates as may be appointed therefor by the Superintendent."

(4) in rule 295, by the substitution for paragraph (c) thereof, of the following new paragraph :—

" (c) Any portion not exceeding at any one time one half of the aggregate amount of the prison wages standing at that time to the credit of any prisoner who is in Class I. and whose conduct and industry in prison have been exemplary, may, on application made in that behalf by such prisoner and approved by the Superintendent, be expended by the Superintendent—

(i.) on the purchase for the use of that prisoner of religious or educational books or other books which in the opinion of the Superintendent are suitable for introduction into a prison and are likely to promote the mental and moral development of that prisoner ;

(ii.) on the purchase for the use of that prisoner of such articles of food or drink as may be approved by the Inspector-General in writing ;

(iii.) in rendering financial assistance to any member of the family or dependant of that prisoner, who appears to the Superintendent to be in need of such assistance ;

(iv.) for such other purpose as may be approved by the Inspector-General in writing."

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations the expression "camp area" shall mean the spaces within the boundaries specified in the schedule hereto,

and "Assistant Government Agent" shall mean the Assistant Government Agent of the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts.

2. No person shall camp in any place within the camp area where camping is prohibited by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent.

3. No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at the places provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

4. No person shall deposit any liquid or solid refuse or any rubbish within the camp area, except in the places or receptacles provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

5. (a) No cattle shall be kept within the camp area, except those brought there for slaughter and those permitted by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent to be kept within such area.

(b) No cattle shall be kept in the vicinity of the camp area, except at a place especially appointed as a cattle gala or at a place approved for such use by the Assistant Government Agent.

(c) The person in charge of the cattle shall cause their droppings to be removed to the nearest place provided therefor, and shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by his cattle.

6. All prepared foods sold within the camp area shall be protected from flies and dust by being (a) wrapped in or covered with clean paper or cloth, or (b) kept in closed glass cases, or (c) kept in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer, or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

7. No person who is likely to affect prejudicially the cleanliness of the camp area, and no person who is suffering from an infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the camp area.

8. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, the Assistant Government Agent may direct the pilgrims to leave the place of pilgrimage and may prescribe the routes and methods for their conveyance.

9. (a) Every person within the camp area who is suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and (b) every person who resides with him knowing that he is so suffering shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

10. When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart.

11. No person shall keep bakeries, aereated water manufactories, tea and coffee boutiques, eating-houses or galas within the camp area without previously obtaining a licence from the Assistant Government Agent, permitting him to do so. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

12. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building within the camp area so as to encroach on the main or other streets of the camp.

13. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, discharge fireworks and firearms within the camp area, or within a radius of one mile from the boundaries of such area.

1. The returns required to be furnished under section 179 of the Ordinance by an owner or other person whether resident within the urban area or outside and liable or deemed to be liable to pay taxes in respect of animals or vehicles, shall be made in a schedule which shall be supplied by the Council and shall be filled up and returned within seven days by the person to whom such schedule is addressed.

2. If any person, after having filled up and returned such schedule acquires, keeps, or uses any vehicle or animal, not mentioned in such schedule, he shall, within one month of acquiring any such vehicle or animal, notify the Chairman in writing of the fact of such acquisition, and further furnish true and correct information in respect of every such vehicle or animal so acquired, kept, or used.

3. Subject to the provisions of section 175 of the Ordinance, every person who has furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 shall without further notice be liable, in respect of vehicles or animals entered in such schedule, to pay the tax for the year for which such schedule is furnished, and every person who has sent the written notice required by by-law 2 shall be liable to pay the tax on vehicles or animals referred to in such notice for the year in which such vehicles or animals were acquired by him or otherwise came into his possession.

4. Every person who, having furnished the schedule required by by-law 1 or the written notice required by by-law 2, claims to be exempt from the liability to pay any tax in respect of a vehicle or an animal which has been in his possession for less than 30 days in any year and is entered in or referred to in such schedule or notice shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claim for such exemption specifying the grounds on which such claim is made.

5. The annual tax prescribed under the provisions of section 175 of the Ordinance shall be paid at the office of the Council on or before the thirty-first day of March in each year in respect of all vehicles other than those exempted by the Ordinance, and in respect of every horse, pony, or mule kept or used within the limits of the Council.

6. On payment of the annual tax the Chairman shall issue or cause to be issued in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid, a metal plate with distinguishing letters for the several kinds of vehicles as specified in the schedule hereto, and with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register of vehicles. Where any such plate becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise, the owner shall return it to the Chairman and shall be entitled, on making a payment of 25 cents to receive a fresh plate. The Chairman may, on his being satisfied by affidavit or otherwise that any such plate has been lost or stolen, issue a fresh plate on the application of the owner and on payment by such owner of 50 cents.

7. The owner or person in charge of every vehicle shall affix the plate referred to in by-law 6 on a conspicuous part of the vehicle in respect of which such plate was issued.

8. (1) Every contravention of by-law 1 or by-law 2 shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees.

(2) Every contravention of by-law 7 shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifteen rupees.

3. (1) No person shall use or occupy any stall seat or space in a public market, unless he is the holder of a licence issued by or by the authority of the Chairman, or otherwise than in accordance with these by-laws and with such conditions as may be set out in the licence issued to him.
(2) Every such licence shall be in the form set out in Schedule A hereto.

4. Every holder of a licence shall pay, in respect of the stall seat or space occupied by him, rents or fees at the rates set out in Schedule B hereto.

5. In the case of any public market where the Council does not employ an officer to collect rents or fees, it may lease the right of collecting the rents or fees to any person by private treaty or by public auction.

6. The rent or fee, due for each stall seat or space in a public market, shall be paid in advance to the Chairman or the lessee or to the collector appointed by the Chairman or the lessee.

7. Where by notice exhibited at the spot by or by the authority of the Chairman, the Council sets apart any public market or any part of a public market for the exclusive sale of any article or class of articles, no person shall sell or keep or expose for sale any other article or class of articles in that public market or part of the public market.

8. No person using or occupying any stall seat or space in a public market shall—

- (a) contravene any of the conditions of the licence issued to him; or
- (b) expose or keep for sale therein, any article prohibited by these by-laws or by resolution of the Council; or
- (c) enclose in any way any portion of the market, or erect any awning or screen or fixture of any kind therein; or
- (d) leave any goods in the market between the hours of 10 P.M. and 6 A.M. without the written permission of the Chairman previously obtained; or
- (e) keep his stall seat or space otherwise than in a condition free from filth or rubbish, and clean in all respects; or
- (f) occupy his stall seat or space or take part in any sale therein while he is suffering from any cutaneous, contagious or infectious disease, or employ or permit any person suffering from any such disease to take part in any sale therein; or
- (g) throw any rubbish, bones, skins, or fins or scales of fish, or any other refuse or article likely to be offensive or injurious to the public health, in or upon the market or its premises otherwise than in the receptacle provided for the purpose by the Council; or
- (h) carry on any cooking therein; or
- (i) damage or deface any part of the buildings, fixtures, lamps or other property of the Council in or upon the market or its premises; or
- (j) defile or pollute in any way the water provided for use therein; or
- (k) introduce or cause or permit to be introduced into the market any dog or cat or bird or reptile; or

(l) behave in a disorderly manner or commit any nuisance in or about the market or its premises.

9. It shall be lawful for the Chairman, or for any officer acting under his authority, to inspect any market and to seize any unwholesome articles of food introduced into or exposed for sale in any market, and to convey the same to the Medical Officer of Health or to the District Medical Officer, Puttalam, and if it appears to such Medical Officer that any article of food so seized is unwholesome, such article may be destroyed without the payment of any compensation to the person from whose possession it was seized.

10. Whenever it appears that the use or consumption by the public of any particular article of food is injurious or harmful, it shall be lawful for the Council on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health, by beat of tom-tom or other sufficient notice to prohibit, for such time as to it may appear necessary, the introduction or sale of any such article of food in any market.

11. No cart or vehicle shall remain within any market premises for a longer period than is necessary for loading or unloading. No cart or vehicle shall enter on the cemented portion of the market premises.

12. No meat of any animal not slaughtered at the public slaughter-house provided by the Council, shall be brought into a public or private market except with the special written authority of the Chairman: Provided that this by-law shall not apply to frozen meat, or fish imported into the Island or to game.

13. On the second or any subsequent conviction of any person of a breach of any of these by-laws, the court may in its discretion cancel the licence issued to that person.

14. In the event of the non-compliance by any person with the provisions of any of these by-laws, or of the cancellation of any person's licence by a competent court, it shall be lawful for the Chairman to refuse a fresh licence to that person.

15. Every contravention of any of the foregoing by-laws shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding Rs. 50 and in the case of a continuing offence with an additional fine not exceeding Rs. 10 for every day during which the offence is continued after conviction or written notice from the Chairman of such contravention.

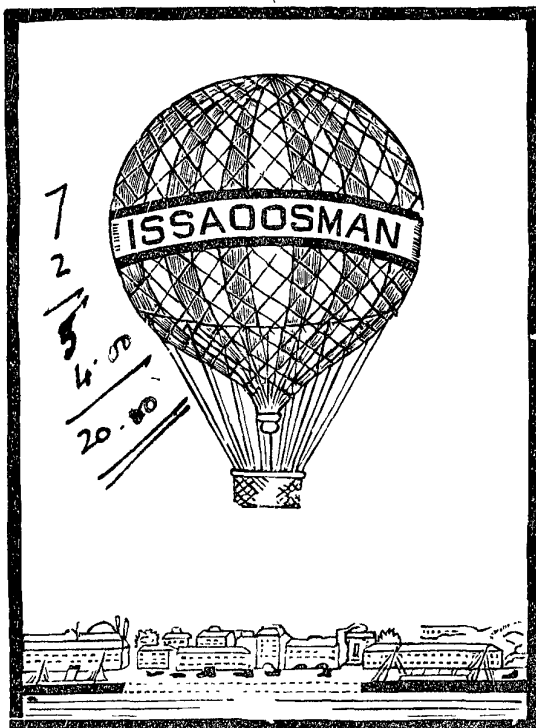

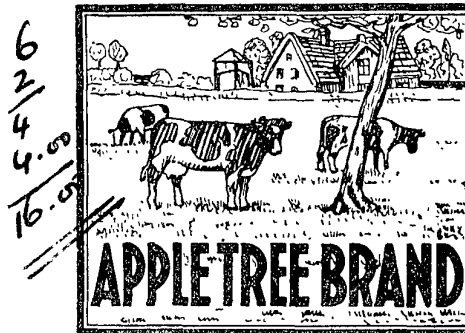

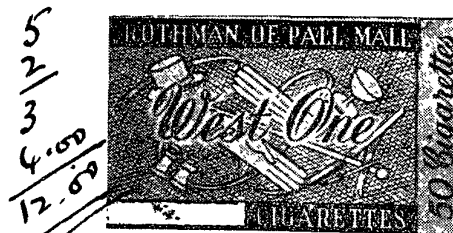
