### IRRIGATION DEPARTMENT

The employment of non-Ceylonese labourers without such approval in writing and concurrence is forbidden.

The term Ceylonese shall mean and include—

- (a) A citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration; or
- (b) A British subject who is born in Ceylon one of whose parents was born in Ceylon; or
- (c) A British subject who is a descendant of a person falling within category (b).

The term 'Labour' shall mean skilled and unskilled labour.

15. The contractor shall, whenever required to do so by the Commissioner of Labour, supply him with full particulars of the categories of workers employed by the contractor under the contract for this work.

16. The contractor will be required to supply his own tools, plant and equipment necessary for the satisfactory execution of the work. All necessary materials required for the satisfactory execution and completion of the work unless otherwise stated on the specification, shall be supplied by the contractor.

17. The contractor shall indemnify the Government against any claim by or in respect of any employee of the contractor under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1934, or any statutory modification thereof. Any such claim which may be paid by the Government shall be deducted from and out of any sum or sums of money that shall be due or become due to the contractor under the terms of the agreement.

18. All notices to be served upon the contractor shall be deemed to have been served if given to him personally or to his agent (including in the case of a company the agent or secretary of such company), or sent through the post addressed to his house/office which place the contractor selects for the purpose. Should the contractor change his house/office, he shall forthwith by writing notify to the Engineer the fact of such change and until such notification is communicated to the

Engineer, the posting of such letters, notices or other documents to the address provided in the agreement shall for all purposes be deemed to be and constitute sufficient delivery of the same.

19. Any person employed by the contractor on the works, who in the opinion of the Engineer is incompetent or who shall act in an improper manner shall be dismissed from the works by the contractor at the request of the Engineer and such person shall not be again employed upon the works without the written permission of the Engineer.

20. As far as practicable the Laws of the Dominion of Ceylon shall be applicable to the contract.

21. The contractor shall not be entitled to claim any damages from the Government by reason of not being awarded work up to the extent specified in the contract in the event of any such reduction in the work being deemed necessary by the Engineer in the interests of the work.

22. The Engineer will be entitled to retain an amount equal to 10 per cent. of the value of work executed monthly until the amount so retained aggregates a sum equal to 5 per cent. of the amount of tender.

**INSTRUCTIONS TO CANDIDATES FOR  
CADETSHIPS (PILOTS PRIOR TO COM-  
MISSIONING AS PILOT OFFICERS IN  
THE CEYLON AIR FORCE**

TWELVE vacancies are now offered for Cadetships (Pilots) prior to commissioning as Pilot Officers in the Ceylon Air Force.

2 The applicants for cadetships will be required to fulfil the conditions set out in paragraph 4 below. A preliminary selection will be made from applications received from those who fulfil these conditions, and a final selection will be made after interview of the selected candidates by a Selection Board appointed by the Minister of Defence and External Affairs.

3 The following is the procedure which will be adopted and the rules which will apply in respect of candidates who are selected for the vacancies.

- (a) On being accepted for the cadetships, the candidates must enlist in the Ceylon Air Force on a regular engagement for a period of five years as Aircraftsmen, 2nd Class, Group "D".
- (b) The Cadets will be required to undergo training at such places in Ceylon as decided by the Minister of Defence and External Affairs in consultation with the Commander of the Air Force.
- (c) During the period of training, the status of the cadets will be that of Aircraftsmen and they will be subject to Air Force Law.
- (d) A Cadet, while undergoing training, shall be paid at the rate of Rs. 2 per diem during the first six months of his service. Thereafter, until he is appointed to a commission, he shall be paid at the rate of Rs. 2.50 per diem provided, however, that a Cadet of a recognized Air Force training establishment in Ceylon shall be paid at the rate of Rs. 3.25 per diem on completing twelve months' total service, or on attaining Officer/Cadet status, whichever is later. No cost of living allowance is payable. In addition to the above, the rates of pay will be supplemented by Flying Instructional pay at the rate of 50 cents per diem on commencement of flying training.
- (e) During the period of training, the Cadets will be accommodated in an Air Force Mess, and provided with free food, free uniform and free medical treatment.
- (f) (i) In the event of a Cadet voluntarily terminating his candidature for a commission during training, the parent or guardian will be required to refund to the Ceylon Government all expenses incurred up to that time by the Ceylon Government on account of such Cadet.
  - (ii) If at any time during his course, a Cadet is reported on by the authorities as being unsuitable for reasons of misconduct, or due to causes within his own control, for the issue of a commission, his parent or guardian will be required to refund to the Ceylon Government all expenses incurred on his account by the Ceylon Government.
