OTICE is hereby given, under section 20 and section 40 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, to persons qualified to vote under the 11th and 12th sections of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, under the 2nd section of the Ordinance No. 26 of 1890, and under the 6th section of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1896, that meetings for the election of Councillors for the several divisions of the Municipality of Colombo for the three years next succeeding from January 1, 1906, will be held at the times and places specified hereunder:—

The poll, in the case of a contested election, will be closed at the expiration of two hours after the above-mentioned times, unless there are still in attendance qualified voters who have not yet voted, and in that case the poll will be closed as soon, after the expiration of the said two hours, as such persons have voted.

Every qualified voter who attends in person to vote should bring with him a card or ticket on which the following particulars must be legibly written in English:—

- (1) The progressive number, if any, appearing against his name in the voters' lists
- (2) His name in full.
- (3) The street and number of the house for which he claims to vote.
- (4) Whether he is the proprietor or occupier of the said house.

A qualified voter attending to vote in person, who has more than one vote for the Ward for which the election is being held, should bring a separate card or ticket for each vote that he claims.
