Pucific Ocean (South) - Tuamotu or Low Archipelago Ernest Legouvé Reef-Amended Position.

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 180, dated June 20, 1902, issued by this office, the British Admiralty has given further notice (No. 378 of 1902) that the original report of the Captain of the French vessel "Ernest Legouvé" states that he passed on December 17, 1901, at 4 P.M., a reef about 100 yards long, in approximately lat 35° 14′ S., long. 150° 38′ W., and not 152° 58′ W., as given by the authority for the above notice. The second rest was also seen.

Note.—The longitude of 152° 58' W. appears to have been given from the meridian of Paris.

India, West - Malabar Coast-Cochin and Narakul Wreck disappeared-Buoys removed.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 380 of 1992) that the wreck shown on some copies of Admiralty Chart, No. 749, 12 cables N. 83° W. from Cochin lighthouse, has disappeared, and that the buoy marking it, and also the red anchoring buoy, situated about 24 miles S. 73° W. from Narakal light, have been withdrawn; \$1,500.131
