## MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Saturday, May 17, 1902, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with Notice dated May 13, 1902.

Present:—Hon. Mr. H. Wace, Chairman; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; W. D. Gibbon, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; R. W. Jonklaas, Esq.; Dr. J. Craib; P. T. Habeebo Lebbe, Esq.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on April 19, 1902, were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1901 to April 30, 1902, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date; Health Officer's Report for, and Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during, the month of April, 1902.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries inspected during April and register.

4. The Health Officer's diary was submitted.

5. Resolved—That the Auditor's report on quarter's accounts be circulated.

6. Memorandum E 4, dated May 6, 1902, from the Colonial Secretary, forwarding remarks by the Acting Auditor-General on water supply by-laws adopted at the Meeting on January 18, 1902, was submitted. These had been referred back with remarks in accordance with Mr. Beven's opinion.

Resolved—That the papers be circulated.

7. The following draft of Address of Congratulation to His Majesty King Edward was submitted and read. Resolved—That the address with two verbal alterations be adopted as follows:—

“To His Most Gracious Majesty Edward the Seventh, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

“We, the Chairman and Members of the Municipal Council of Kandy, in the Island of Ceylon, beg, on behalf of ourselves and our fellow-citizens, to approach Your Majesty with the tribute of our humble, but sincere and heartfelt, felicitations on the eventful and memorable occasion of Your Majesty's Coronation.

“Your Majesty's visit to our Mountain Capital in the year 1875 is still fresh in the recollection of many of us, and the more recent visit of Their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Wales last year has given still further proof of the interest which Kandy possesses for Your Royal House, and has afforded the inhabitants of the Central Province of Ceylon the further pleasure of evincing their deep sense of loyalty to Your Throne and Person.

“We desire to convey to Your Majesty the assurance of our continued loyalty and devotion, and our fervent hope that Your Majesty and Your Royal Consort, the Queen, may have a long, happy, and prosperous reign over Your world-wide dominion.

“We remain, with profound respect, Your Majesty's most obedient and faithful subjects.”

8. With reference to Minute 8 of Meeting of April 19, 1902, letter dated May 1, 1902, from the Health Officer, regarding the present sources of water supply for residents at Katugistota, was read. The Chairman stated that he had, as promised, made a personal inspection of the locality, and suggested:—

- (1) That a small portion of the south-west corner of the paddy field—bounded by the Praga-oya on the east—be acquired and a well sunk in it to serve the houses at that end of the bazaar.
- (2) That a well be sunk on the premises of the Public Works Department on the Galeg-lara road to serve the houses at the western end of the bazaar. Two private wells, as pointed out by the Health Officer, require to be deepened and provided with protecting walls above ground level.

Resolved—That the suggestions of the Chairman and Health Officer be approved.

9. As a matter of urgency, the Chairman brought forward the following recommendation of the Standing Committee adopted this day:—That the tenders for scavenging of the town be rejected, and that the Council do carry out the work by its own officers from June 1, 1902, for seven months, to December 31, 1902.

Resolved—That the recommendation be approved.
