PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency EVERARD FERDINAND IM THURN, Esquire, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

EVERARD IM THURN.

WHEREAS by "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof, or by a Commissioner of Assize duly appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance, for each of the Circuits into which the Island is divided for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offence—

For the Southern Circuit, twice at least at Galle and such other places in such Circuit as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint; such Sessions commencing at Galle on April 25th and September 15th in every year:

And whereas it is further provided by the said Ordinance that it shall be competent for the Governor, for sufficient reasons to him appearing, to order, after previous consultation with the Judges, other Sessions to be holden at the places above-mentioned or at any other places in the said Circuit.

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to order that an extra Criminal Session of the Supreme Court should be holden at Matara, a place included within the said Southern Circuit:

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Lieutenant-Governor, for sufficient reasons to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges, do order and appoint that a Criminal Session of the Supreme Court shall be holden at Matara, on Monday, the Fourth day of August, 1902.

Given at Kandy, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-fifth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Two.

And whereas by the said Ordinance it is also provided that it shall be competent for the Governor, for sufficient reasons to him appearing, after previous consultation with the Judges, to alter the dates fixed by the said Ordinance for holding Criminal Sessions of the said Court at any of the places therein mentioned, and to fix any other date for the commencement thereof:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to alter as hereinafter the date fixed for holding the second Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court at Jaffna:

Now know Ye that We, the said Lieutenant-Governor, for sufficient reasons to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do hereby direct and appoint that the Sessions of the Supreme Court appointed by the said Ordinance to be holden at Jaffna in the month of July, shall be holden this year on or about Monday, the 25th day of August, 1902.

For the Midland Circuit three times at least at Kandy and such other places in such Circuit as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint; such Sessions commencing at Kandy on the 10th day of March, 1st day of August, and 1st day of December in every year:

And whereas by the said Ordinance it is also provided that it shall be competent for the Governor, for sufficient reasons to him appearing, after previous consultation with the Judges, to alter the dates fixed by the said Ordinance for holding Criminal Sessions of the said Court at any of the places therein mentioned, and to fix any other date for the commencement thereof:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to alter as hereinafter the date fixed for holding the second Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court at Kandy, namely, the 1st day of August.

Now know Ye that We, the said Lieutenant-Governor, for sufficient reasons to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do hereby direct and appoint that the Sessions of the Supreme Court appointed by the said Ordinance to be holden at Kandy on the 1st day of August shall, instead of that date, commence to be holden this year at Kandy on or about Friday, the 15th day of August, 1902.

Given at Kandy, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-fifth day of July, in the year of our Lord One Thousand Nine hundred and Two.
