And whereas by section 2 of the said Ordinance it was further enacted that if no claim should be made in pursuance of such notice the said Government Agent should make a report to the Governor of the proceedings taken by him, which report should contain a description of the land together with the boundaries thereof, and should state that no claim had been made thereto; and further, that upon receipt of such report it shall be lawful for the Governor in Executive Council to make order that such land shall be resumed by the Crown, and that the same shall thereupon be resumed by, and become the property of, the Crown free from all encumbrances:

RULES to be observed by Village Committees for the trial of Breaches of Rules under the Ordinance No. 34 of 1884 in the Southern Province.

I.—Form and Manner of Proceedings.

Chairman to keep journal.
To whom complaint to be made.
By whom complaint to be made.
Summary inquiry in certain cases.
When complainant absent.
Mode of hearing, and decision.

- 1. The chairman of the village committee shall keep a journal of proceedings, copy of which shall be forwarded weekly to the kachchéri of the sub-division to which such village committee belongs.
2. Complaints with respect to breaches of rules may be made, verbally or in writing, to the chairman of the village committee, who shall thereupon enter them in his journal (form A).
3. Complaint with respect to breaches of rules may be made either by a private party or by a local headman.
4. When a complaint is made, if the attendance of the defendant can be easily procured, the chairman shall forthwith inquire into and decide the matter summarily, provided the complainant and defendant both consent to abide by such decision of the chairman, and provided that no fine is imposed on such summary inquiry.
4. If on the day appointed for hearing the complainant is absent, the case may be struck off.
6. The chairman and village committee shall endeavour, by all lawful means, to settle the matter complained of amicably. If the parties do not agree to such settlement, the chairman and the village committee shall proceed to hear evidence on both sides and decide the matter. The chairman shall then take down in writing the defence, if any, made by the defendant in answer to the complaint, and short minutes of the evidence given by the witnesses. The opinion of the majority of the committee shall be the judgment, but in case of equality of votes among the members of the committee, the chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to his vote as a member of the committee.

Language of proceedings.

7. The journal of proceedings, forms of process, and minutes of evidence shall be written either in the English or the Sinhalese language, as the chairman and committee may deem best.

Issue of summons.

8. When the attendance of the defendant cannot be secured, as set forth in rule 4, the chairman shall issue a summons addressed to the village headman, who shall thereupon cause the same to be served, and report such service to the chairman (form B). The chairman may likewise issue a summons addressed to the village headman, in order to secure the attendance of the complainant or of any witnesses (form C).

Ex-parte hearing and warrant.

9. If the defendant contumaciously refuse to attend, the chairman and village committee may hear and decide the case in his absence, or such chairman may issue a warrant, upon which it shall be lawful for the village headman to cause the defendant to be arrested and brought before the village committee (form D).

The chairman shall have like power to issue a warrant against a complainant or witness failing to attend when summoned (form E).

Register of fines to be kept by chairman.

10. A register of fines imposed shall be kept by the chairman of the village committee (form G), a duplicate copy of which shall be forwarded monthly to the kachchéri together with the fines recovered.

Application for relief.

11. Application for relief shall be addressed to the Government Agent in the first instance, who shall then call for the record of the case. Failing relief from the Government Agent, the party aggrieved may apply by petition to the Governor.

Chairman to carry out the judgment of the Government Agent or of the Governor. Penalty for disobeying summons.

12. It shall be the duty of the chairman of the village committee to see that the judgment of the Government Agent or of the Governor, as ultimately pronounced, is duly carried out.

Bail in case of arrest.

13. When a summons shall have been issued under rule 8, and the person named in such summons shall, after due service thereof, neglect to attend in obedience to such summons, it shall be lawful for the village committee to impose on such person a fine not exceeding Rs. 2, in addition to the issue of a warrant as provided for in rule 9.

14. When a person is arrested on a warrant issued under rule 9, such person shall be forthwith taken before the chairman who issued the warrant, and the chairman may in his discretion admit him to bail to appear before the village committee at its next sitting. Such bail may be with or without security, but the amount thereof shall not exceed Rs. 50.

Detention when no bail.

15. When no bail is ordered, or the party apprehended is unable to give bail, he shall not be detained in custody for a longer period than forty-eight hours.

Procedure on forfeiture of bonds.

16. Whenever it is proved to the satisfaction of the committee that any bond taken by the committee under the provisions of rule 14 has been forfeited, the committee shall record the grounds of such proof, and may call upon any person bound by such bond to pay the penalty thereof, or to show cause why it should not be paid. If sufficient cause is not shown, and the penalty is not paid, the committee may proceed to recover the same by issuing a warrant under the hand of the chairman for the attachment and sale of the movable or immovable property belonging to such person. Such warrant may be executed within the local limits of the jurisdiction of the committee which issued it, and it shall authorise the distress and sale of any movable or immovable property belonging to such person without such limits, when endorsed by the Government Agent or the chairman of the committee within the local limits of whose jurisdiction such property is found.

The committee may in its discretion remit any portion of the penalty mentioned, and enforce payment in part only.

Re-institution of cases.

17. No case which has been struck off, and no case which has been decided in favour of the defendant, shall be re-instituted before any village committee without leave of the chairman having been first obtained.

Applicants for relief to give security.

18. Whenever an application shall be made under the 9th section of "The Village Communities Ordinance Amendment Ordinance, 1884," to the Government Agent for relief against the judgment of a village committee, such application shall not stay the execution of the judgment of the village committee unless the party applying shall give security in an amount not exceeding Rs. 20 to satisfy the judgment of the committee if it should ultimately be affirmed.

Postponement of cases.

19. No case when summons has been ordered shall be postponed more than once, and no inquiry shall be delayed more than eight days from the date of institution of the case, unless there be special reasons for doing so.

Commitment in default of payment of fine.

20. When the chairman of a village committee has passed sentence of fine only, in pursuance of the powers in him vested by the Ordinance No. 34 of 1884, the party accused shall pay such fine forthwith, and in default of his making such payment the chairman may issue his warrant of commitment in the form H in the schedule herewith.

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

COLOMBO MUNICIPALITY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, January 11, 1889.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M. pursuant to notice dated January 5, 1889.

Present:—Mr. H. H. Cameron (Mayor and Chairman), Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten, Mr. H. W. Green, the Hon. J. J. Grinlinton, Mr. C. E. H. Symons, Mr. E. Walker, Mr. J. S. Driberg, Mr. M. S. J. Akbar, Mr. V. W. Pereira, the Hon. A. De A. Seneviratna, Mr. C. Perera, Mr. James Perera, and Mr. H. Van Cuylenburg.

Read Minutes of December 14 and 21, 1888, which were confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice the Chairman moved "that the Special Committees appointed in 1888 to consider the following questions be re-appointed, in view of the proviso in section 100 of the Ordinance 7 of 1887, viz.:—

- "(1) Incineration of night soil;
- "(2) Purchase of appliances for extinguishing fires and establishment of a Fire Brigade;
- "(3) Hours of lighting public streets."

This motion was, by leave of Council, amended at the instance of the Hon. J. J. Grinlinton, by the substitution of Mr. C. E. H. Symons for Hon. J. J. Grinlinton as a member of the Committee on "Incineration of night soil," and of the Committee "for purchase of appliances for extinguishing fires, &c."

The motion so amended was seconded by Dr. Vanderstraaten, and carried.

2. The Council then proceeded to ballot for the election of five members to form a Standing Committee, in accordance with the 88th section of the Ordinance 7 of 1887, and the result of the ballot was declared by the Chairman to be in favour of Mr. MacBride, Dr. Vanderstraaten, Mr. Coomaraswamy, Mr. Van Cuylenburg, and Mr. C. Perera.

3. Submitted the following recommendations of the Standing Committee of December 21, 1888:—

Extract from Minutes of Standing Committee of Friday, December 21, 1888.

Present:—H. H. Cameron, Esq. (Mayor and Chairman), R. K. MacBride, Esq., Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten, and C. Perera, Esq.

Business.

2. To make further provision for commission to collectors of assessment on account of 1888.

5. Letter from Director of Public Works about Horbury's patent latrines.

Resolved,—That the recommendation in paragraph 2 of the foregoing extract be sanctioned.

Resolved, with reference to paragraph 5, that one of Horbury's 10-seated patent latrines be procured at a total cost not exceeding Rs. 500.

4. Submitted the draft rules relating to pensions prepared by the Special Committee appointed on June 8, 1888, and considered at the Special Meeting of December 21, 1888.

The Chairman having read what transpired at the Special Meeting and also the following motion made by Mr. Driberg, seconded by Mr. MacBride, and laid over for a fuller meeting, viz.:—

"That His Excellency the Governor be requested to concede to all the officers on the Fixed Establishment of the Municipal Council the same privileges as to pension as are enjoyed by Government officers, and that the past services of such Municipal officers be reckoned towards pension."

Mr. Green (in the absence of Mr. Driberg at the time) moved that the above resolution proposed by Mr. Driberg at the Special Meeting of December 21 be adopted.

5. Read the letter No. 450 of December 11, 1888, from the Superintendent of Works, requesting that the Governor may be informed of his desire to be allowed to retire from his present position and to be re-instated in the Public Works Department of Government.

Resolved,—That the application of the Superintendent of Works be forwarded to Government.

9. The statement of Receipts and Disbursements from January to December, 1888, could not be laid on the table, as the Cash Book for December, 1888, had not yet been closed.

7. Submitted a Progress Report of Work done from January to December, 1888.

8. Read a letter No. 352 of December 6, 1888, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating that when the Municipality is prepared to provide filtering beds at Labugama, the Governor will consider the question of the share to be taken therein by Government.

Mr. Driberg moved "that Government be requested to favour the Council by causing estimates to be framed of the cost of providing filtering beds."

Mr. V. W. Pereira seconded.—Carried.

9. Read a letter No. 163 of December 29, 1888, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating that the Governor in Executive Council is unable to grant the application of the Municipal Council, that all applications for liquor and hotel licenses should be made to the Council.

Mr. Walker moved "that this Council regret that in a matter involving the well-being of the inhabitants the Government should be unable to accept the proposal made by the Municipal Council, and that the Government be respectfully requested to inform the Council upon what grounds the refusal of their request is based."

Mr. Akbar seconded.—Carried.

10. Read a letter No. 154 of December 7, 1888, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating that the Attorney-General has been requested to draft an Ordinance in accordance with the Council's proposal relating to quarries within Municipal limits.

11. Read a letter dated December 20, 1888, from Messrs. Freudenberg & Co., intimating that as cable and electric tramways could only be worked in Colombo at such an enormous outlay that no traffic could make the undertaking a financial success, they are not prepared to advise their friends to invest money in an enterprise certain to end in loss of capital; and pointing out the advisability of allowing the option of horse power or mechanical power other than cable power.

Mr. Walker moved "that Messrs. Freudenberg & Co's letter be accepted as equivalent to a withdrawal from the concession granted to them, and that the Council do call for tenders for the construction of tramways within the Municipality in accordance with the concessions already adopted. Applicants to be at liberty to propose any motive power except steam. Further, that a copy of the notice inviting tenders be published in the *Engineer*."

Mr. Akbar seconded.—Carried.

12. Submitted the following estimates furnished by the Superintendent of Works:—

Progress Report of Work done during the year ended December 31, 1888.

The expenditure on the various Upkeep vote, numbers 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, and 8, has been, as far as possible, spread evenly over the twelve months, and the balances remaining are in every case small.

Estimate No. 6: Upkeep of Public Buildings.—There have been 58 sub-estimates under this vote, comprising the following work:—Repairs to latrines; whitewashing, tarring, painting, &c., the Town Hall, the Municipal store, the Salvation Army shed, the Printing office, the Gasworks street stables, the house at Madampitiya, the Gas testing room; repairs to Dean's road market; repairs, painting, &c., Kollupitiya market; painting Edinburgh meat and vegetable markets; repairs to St. John's road boutique; repairs to St. John's road market; repairs to Grandpass market; repairs to Madampitiya slaughter-house buildings; repairs to buffalo shed and cooly lines at Dematagoda slaughter-house; and new gutters to Town Hall roof.

Estimate No. 9: Purchase and Repair of Tools, &c.—This vote has been almost fully expended, but for the year 1889 the vote is omitted—a sum being provided on each estimate for repairs of tools, &c.

Estimate No. 10: Additional Office Accommodation.—There have been 24 sub-estimates under this vote, comprising the following works:—Converting portion of Edinburgh market into court-house and office; laying on water to, and constructing drain from, Town Hall lavatory; building additional stables for Town Hall; building latrine for use of clerks; providing mats and matting for Town Hall.

Estimate No. 11: Repair of Boat at Bridge-of-Boats and purchase of a New Boat.—A new boat was procured from the Government Factory, boat No. 17 was thoroughly repaired, and with the balance available boat No. 10 was repaired.

Estimate No. 12: Glenn Street Latrine.—A cast iron latrine for twenty persons was obtained from Messrs. MacFarlane, of Glasgow, and erected during December near the old latrine.

Estimate No. 13: Polwatta New Road.—This road was completed in December. The roadway is 24 ft. wide, but has only the old 12-ft. bridge over the canal. If this canal is filled up, leaving a drain only, the road can be made the full width, a culvert being substituted for the bridge.

In connection with this road I beg to point out the desirability of completing the road from the mosque to Kollupitiya by putting in side drains and gravelling the full width of the road; also the necessity for a screen wall round the Kollupitiya latrine abutting on the road.

Estimate No. 14: One large Bridge and two smaller ones.—I regret that I was unable to do any of the work under this vote, excepting putting in temporary bridges in place of the two small ones which were dangerous.

Estimate No. 15: Erection of Jubilee Fountain.—I was unable to commence this work before December, and have not yet completed, but hope to have the fountain erected within a short time.

Metal and Gravel Roads.—The following roads or portions of roads were thoroughly remetalled during the year, special votes being sanctioned for the works:—Armour street, Keyzer street, Layard's Broadway, Skinner's road south, Skinner's road north; and the following thoroughly regravelled: Alston place, Bridge street, Galle Face Church road, Hill street, Madampitiya road.

Side Drains, &c.—During the year a length of 7,931 lineal feet of side and open drains has been built, and about 2,000 lineal feet of side drains have received extensive repair, twelve new culverts having also been built, the majority of them being constructed of damaged iron pipes procured from the Waterworks Engineer.

An outlet drain at Korteboom street is now being constructed of cast iron pipes, to replace the old masonry drain, most of which had been washed away by the sea.

Estimate No. 58: Cost of filling in portion of Dean's Road Canal.—This canal has been filled in from Regent street to Forbes road bridge, the length being nearly half a mile, an open waterway for drainage only being left.

Estimate No. 66 : For construction of new Meat Stalls.—A row of six boutiques has been erected at Dhobies pond, Cramer's lane, at a cost of Rs. 2,000. The other meat stalls proposed I hope to have erected early in 1889.

Estimate No. 68 : Erection of Carriage Stands.—Carriage stands for ninety carriages have been erected in six places as follows, the total length being 1,800 lineal feet :—

Estimates Nos. 69 and 70 : For filling up portion of Elie Lane Quarry.—A portion of this quarry has been filled about 3,000 cubic yards of earth being tipped into it, and the boundary wall has been repaired.

Estimate No. 71 : For construction of a boundary wall, Lock-gate Lane.—A short length of boundary wall, which had fallen down, has been reconstructed.

Estimate No. 74.—Six new seats of a new pattern were provided and fixed on Galle Face esplanade during the year. The improvements of Arab lane and of Gintupitiya street have not been commenced, as the necessary land has not yet been acquired.

Latrines.—Buckets of a new pattern have been provided for the latrines and a sample cart has been made. Water has been laid on to twelve latrines.

Dematagoda slaughter-house has had a water supply laid on, and as this will do away with the necessity for drawing water from the old well, a reduction of the number of coolies on the slaughter-house staff might be made.

Before concluding my report I beg to urge the necessity for immediately instituting a stock account, upon which I have already reported, so as to place the store on a more business-like footing, as the present system of obtaining materials, especially road metal, piecemeal as each estimate is sanctioned, not only hampers me very much in my work, but is liable to very great abuse.

I also beg that the Council will, after the above account is established and a regular supply of road metal can be relied on, consider the advisability of procuring an 11-ton steam roller, which, when not in use for roadwork, might be used as a stationary engine for stone-breaking or other similar purpose; but if the Council take over the trunk roads within the Municipal limits, I think there would be constant work for such a roller, and the rapidity of working would, I am confident, save a large sum on supervision, which I am of opinion is at present excessive.

A dredger is required for constant work in the lake, as it would be a great improvement if the lake were deepened 6 ft., or even more, as then the spill-level might be considerably lowered, which would facilitate the surface drainage of a very large area, and the spoil could be utilised for filling up the swamps, raising low lands, and improving the banks of the lake.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall on Friday, December 28, 1888, at 3 o'clock p.m.

Present :—Hon. R. W. D. Moir, Chairman; F. Vine, Esq.; Dr. J. T. Morgan; J. B. Siebel, Esq.; Dr. James Loos; A. Philip, Esq.; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; C. Young, Esq.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Regular Meeting held on November 26 and of the Special Meeting held on December 15 were read and confirmed.

2. The following documents were laid on the table :—Statements of Receipts and Disbursements on account of the Municipal Fund from close of 1887 to November 30, 1888; Progress Report brought up to the same date; Statement of Work performed by the Municipal Magistrate and Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during November, and Report of the Health Officer for November.

Resolved,—That the Statement of Receipts and Disbursements and Progress Report be forwarded to Government together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Ordinance 7 of 1887.

3. In accordance with notice, Mr. Philip brought forward the following motion :—“That a short form of agreement be drawn upon and sent to all householders who have water pipes laid on the premises occupied by them, notifying the Council's charges for any quantity of water used in excess of the allowance; that such form be duly returned to the Secretary, Municipal Council, signed by the party responsible for payment of any charge found due for water in excess of allowance before water is turned on to the premises.”

This was seconded by Mr. C. Young. A discussion took place, in which Messrs. Siebel, Philip, Sproule, and Young took part.

The following amendment was moved by the Chairman, seconded by Dr. Loos :—“That a Special Committee consisting of the Chairman, Dr. Loos, Messrs. Siebel, Sproule, and Philip be appointed to advise the Council what steps should be taken, if any be practicable, with the view of making occupiers, instead of owners, liable for the excess of water used in private houses.”

On the amendment being put to the meeting there were Ayes 6, Noes 2; majority in favour of amendment 4.

On the original motion being put to the meeting there were Ayes 2, Noes 6.

The amendment was declared carried, and the original motion lost.

4. The explanatory remarks by Secretary on judgment of Supreme Court in D. C. Kandy, Case 93,059, “Municipal Council vs. B. A. Grebe,” and which had been circulated and seen by all the members, except one and the Chairman, was laid on the table. On suggestion of the Chairman it was resolved that the consideration of the matter remain over for the next meeting.

5. Read letter No. 38 of December 14 from the Clerk to the Executive Council, intimating the approval by the Governor in Executive Council of an assessment rate of 5 per cent. to be levied for 1889 to meet cost, &c., of police employed for Municipal purposes as adopted by the Municipal Council at their meeting on November 26.

6. Read letter No. 39 of December 14 from the Clerk to the Executive Council, intimating the approval by the Governor in Executive Council of the taxes proposed to be levied by the Municipal Council, Kandy, under authority of sections 128 and 129 of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, as adopted by the Municipal Council at their meeting on November 26.

7. In accordance with notice Mr. C. Young brought forward the following motion :—“That the Council do take

into consideration the desirability of extending the water pipes to the south side of the lake, with a view to giving the householders there the benefit of the water supply.

This was seconded by Mr. J. H. Sproule, and on being put to the meeting was carried.

8. With leave of the Council Mr. C. Young withdrew the motion of which he had given notice, with regard to the erection of lamps on road round the lake.

The Secretary was instructed to obtain an estimate as to the cost of a lamp and annual cost of maintenance.

9. In accordance with notice Mr. Sproule put the following questions:—(1) Whether a case was instituted before the Municipal Magistrate by one of the Council's collectors against a railway official charging him with resistance; (2) by whose authority was the case instituted; (3) what was the result of the case, and to call for papers on the subject.

Reply:—Dain, commutation rate collector, complained on or about October 26 that he had been obstructed by Mr. Hoffman at the railway station while he was about to execute a commutation rate warrant for arrest of defaulter (Meer Mohamed) in employ of railway. He was informed he had his remedy at law, the Municipal Council's Ordinance 7 of 1887 providing that Municipal officers had the right and privileges of "public servants." Case was dismissed, as Dain omitted on day of trial to produce warrant authorising him to make the arrest. He was asked to withdraw the case, and was willing to do so, but appeared at the court on both occasions when case was called, as he feared if absent he would be punished.

Papers laid on table: Police Court Kandy, Case No. 7,436, Register of Warrants showing the liability of Meer Mohamed, the defaulter.
