MISCELLANEOUS DEPARTMENTAL NOTICES.

COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended 22nd December, 1906, is subjoined (A).

Births.—The total births were 82. The birth-rate per 1,000 was 24·7,* as against 25·0 in the preceding week and 21·5 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 185. The death-rate per 1,000 was 55·7,* as against 53·0 in the previous week and 41·1 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—No persons died from cholera, smallpox, or measles; 46 died from diarrhoea and dysentery; 37 from phthisis, bronchitis, and pneumonia; 17 from different kinds of fever; and 10 from infantile convulsions.

Infantile deaths.—Of the 185 total deaths, 53 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 31 in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Ceylon Technical College.**SCIENCE COURSES.**

TWO courses of Lectures with Laboratory work will be started in January, 1907, viz. :—

CHEMISTRY .. Professor C. H. Burgess, D.Sc.
(1st Lecture, January 12th)

PHYSICS .. Professor W. S. Templeton,
M.A., B.Sc., F.C.S.
(1st Lecture, January 11th)

The lectures are intended for senior students, male or female, who intend to take up Chemistry or Physics in any of the following examinations of the London University: Intermediate Science Examination, Intermediate Arts Examination, Preliminary Scientific Examination.

The courses will be so framed that they can be taken by students who have no previous acquaintance with the subjects; but no pupil will be allowed to join the course in Physics who is not sufficiently grounded in Mathematics.

Special arrangements will be made for any students who are sufficiently advanced to take up any of the above examinations in 1907.

ADMISSION TO CLASSES.

No student will be admitted who is under 16 years of age. Students over 16, who are attending Government or Grant-in-aid schools, will be admitted on the recommendation of the Principal. Private students who are approved by the Director of Public Instruction will be admitted if there is room for them, but must pay an enhanced fee.

FEES.

The ordinary Session will be from October 1st to July 31st, omitting the month of April and the usual period for school vacation at Christmas. The fee for the full course will be :—

Students from Government and Grant-in-aid schools—

Chemistry Rs. 15; Physics Rs. 15

Private Students—

Chemistry Rs. 30; Physics Rs. 30

In 1907 the fee from January to July 31st will be :—

Students from Government and Grant-in-aid schools—

Chemistry Rs. 10; Physics Rs. 10

Private Students—

Chemistry Rs. 20; Physics Rs. 20

The above fees will include the cost of chemicals and the use of the ordinary laboratory apparatus required for the course.

DEPOSIT.

Every Student will be required to pay a deposit of Rs. 15 for Chemistry and Rs. 10 for Physics to cover the cost of articles damaged or issued for their personal use.

N.B.—All fees and deposits must be paid in advance. Any unexpended balance of deposits will be refunded at the end of the course.
