7 HEREAS by sections 4 and 5 of "The Village Communities" Ordinance, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to be by him for that purpose issued, to declare from time to time, as he may think desirable, that any Chief Headman's division or part thereof shall be brought from a time to be named therein within the operation of the said Ordinance, and that the same shall be subdivided into villages or convenient groups of villages in such manner as the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall appoint, and that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the like advice, from time to time, to alter and amend such subdivisions:

And whereas by the joint operation of a Proclamation bearing date the 20th December, 1889, and of section 53 of the said Ordinance No. 24 of 1889, the Chief Headman's division known as Bintenna of the Eastern Province was brought within the operation of the said Ordinance, and the said Chief Headman's division was by the said Proclamation subdivided as specified in the schedule annexed to the said Proclamation:

And whereas it is expedient to alter the said subdivisions:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers in Us vested as aforesaid and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the said subdivisions specified in the schedule to the said Proclamation of the 20th December, 1809, as the same are in the schedule thereto specified

Security deposited for Contracts.

SIR,—QUESTIONS having arisen as to the liability of Government to pay interest on moneys deposited with it by way of security for contracts, I am directed to instruct you to make it clear to all depositors of money by way of security that Government admits no liability to pay interest in respect of such deposits of security, save and except in the following circumstances:—

(1) The depositor of money by way of security may ask the Head of the Department concerned, in writing, to place the money at fixed deposit in a local Bank to the credit of the Treasurer, in which case the interest paid by the Bank will be made over to the depositor.

(2) He may deposit four per cent. silver stock of the Government of Ceylon by way of security, which will, of course, earn interest during the period of its deposit.

MISCELLANEOUS DEPARTMENTAL NOTICES.

COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended 12th January, 1907, is subjoined (A).

Births.—The total births were 73. The birth-rate per 1,000 was 21.5,* as against 23.3 in the preceding week and 24.7 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 179. The death-rate per 1,000 was 52.8,* as against 51.3 in the previous week and 37.9 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—Four persons died from cholera; 46 died from diarrhoes and dysentery; 36 from phthisis, bronchitis, and pneumonia; 16 from different kinds of fever; and 15 from infantile convulsions.
