HENRY A. BLAKE.

HEREAS by section 4 of "The Local Boards' Ordinance, 1898," it is enacted that it shall be lawfull for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to be for that purpose published in the Government Gazette, to bring any town or towns under the operation of the said Ordinance, and to define the limits of such town or towns respectively for the purposes of the said Ordinance:

And whereas it is expedient to bring the town of Moratuwa, in Salpiti korale in Colombo District of the Western Province, under the operation of the said Ordinance:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers in Us vested as aforesaid, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation bring the said town of Moratuwa.

in the District of Colombo in the Western Province, under the operation of "The Local Boards' Ordinance, 1898," as from and after the First day of January, One thousand Nine hundred and Eight, and for the purpose of the said Ordinance We hereby define the limits of the said town of Moratuwa to be those set out in the schedule hereto.

THE following by-laws framed by the Board of Health, Central Province, in respect of the town of Talawakele, under section 9 (c) of Ordinance No. 11 of 1900, and confirmed by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, are published for general information.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

- 1. Water snall only be taken from the public standpipes in buckets or other suitable receptacles, and in such a manner as to prevent its flow into any drain, side channel, or on to the surface of any road, footpath, or area.
- 2. No hose, pipe, tube, shoot, or other contrivance of any nature whatsoever shall be attached, either temporarily or permanently, to any public standpipe.
- 3. No automatic self-closing valve or other automatic appliance attached to or forming part of any public standpipe shall be interfered with so as to prevent, either temporarily or permanently, its automatic action.
 - 4. Water shall only be taken from the public standpipes for domestic purposes.
- 5. All public tanks, reservoirs, cisterns, standpipes, fountains, sluices, wells, conduits, pipes, pumps, and other waterworks existing within the town of Talawakele at the time of the coming into operation of these by-laws, or afterwards made, laid, or erected, and all buildings, works, materials, and things connected with or appertaining to such waterworks, shall be vested in the Board of Health.
- 6. The Board of Health may cause such filtering tanks, reservoirs, aqueducts, or other works to be constructed, and such fountains and standpipes to be erected, and such pipes to be laid as it may from time to time consider necessary for the use of the inhabitants of Talawakele.
- 7. In laying down any such pipes the Board of Health may, if it consider it necessary, carry such pipes through, across, or under any street or place laid out or intende I for a street, or under any building, or through any cellar or vault, or into, through, or under any enclosed or other land whatsoever. Provided that the Board of Health shall in every case in which it deals with private property under this by-law give notice of its intention to do so to the owner of such property, and shall on completion of the work pay to him reasonable compensation. If any dispute shall arise as to the amount or apportionment of such compensation, such amount and apportionment shall be summarily ascertained and determined by the Magistrate, whose decision shall be subject to an appeal to the Supreme Court.
- 8. No person shall do anything whereby the water in any reservoir, fountain, cistern, standpipe, pipes, or other waterworks belonging to the Board of Health shall be in any degree polluted, fouled, or corrupted, and no person shall in any way damage or tamper with any such waterworks.
- 9. No person shall bathe or wash any part of his body, or wash any cattle, horse, dog, or other animal whatsoever, or any vehicle, clothes, utensils, or other article whatsoever, at or near any reservoir, standpipe, fountain, cistern, pipe, or other waterworks vested in the Board of Health whether now existing or to be hereafter erected or built in the streets, thoroughfares, or other public places within the Board of Health limits of Talawakele.
- 10. Every person paying the water-rate shall be entitled to have free of further charge in respect thereof a supply of water from the public Board of Health fountains or standpipes for the domestic use of himself and his household.
- 11. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water for horses or cattle or for washing vehicles where such horses, cattle, or vehicles are kept for sale or hire, or a supply for any trade, manufacture, or business, or for fountains or swimming baths, or for any ornamental purposes, or for purposes of irrigation.

MISCELLANEOUS DEPARTMENTAL NOTICES.

COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended March 23, 1907, is subjoined (A).

Births.—The total births were 97. The birth-rate per 1,000 was 28.6,* as against 25 7 in the preceding week and 40.9 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 105. The death-rate per 1,000 was 31.0,* as against 26 8 in the

previous week and 36.1 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—No person died from cholera, smallpox, or measles; 10 died from diarrhoa and dysentery; 37 from phthisis, bronchitis, and pneumonia; 6 from different kinds of fever; and 9 from infantile convulsions.

Infantile deaths.—Of the 105 total deaths, 22 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 35 in the corresponding week of the previous year.

The numbers of births and deaths registered in nineteen other principal towns are shown in list B.
