MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance for making final provision for the Supplementary Contingent Charges for the Year 1905.

Preamble.

WHEREAS by Ordinance No. 23 of 1905 it was enacted that the sum of Rs. 2,769,897·65 should be charged upon the revenue of this island for the Supplementary Contingent Services of the year One thousand Nine hundred and Five, in addition to the sum of Rs. 21,393,409 provided by the Ordinance No. 22 of 1904: And whereas an expenditure of Rs. 42,579·83 was incurred and brought to account for the Contingent Services of the year 1905, for which provision is not made by the aforesaid Ordinance: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Rs. 42,579.83 charged upon the revenue of this island of the year 1905 for the final Supplementary Contingent Service of that year.

1 That a sum not exceeding Forty-two thousand Five hundred and Seventy-nine rupees and Eighty-three cents shall be and the same is hereby charged upon the revenue of this island of the said year 1905, for the services hereinafter mentioned; the said expenditure being in conformity with the schedule hereunto annexed, whereof the following is an abstract:

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance for the Establishment of Houses of Detention for Vagrants.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to establish houses of detention for vagrants: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Vagrancy Ordinance, 190 ."

Definition.

2 In this Ordinance the word "vagrant" means—

- (1) Any person found asking for alms;
- (2) Any person not being physically able to earn, or being unwilling to work for, his own livelihood and having no visible means of subsistence

Power of Governor to establish houses of detention.

3 (1) It shall be lawful for the Governor to provide houses of detention at such places as he shall think proper within the colony for the reception of vagrants.

(2) The Governor may from time to time appoint such superintendents and medical and other officers for the management of such houses of detention as he may think fit, and may from time to time at his pleasure dismiss or remove any such superintendent or officer.

(3) Every such superintendent and officer shall be deemed to be a public servant within the meaning of the Ceylon Penal Code.

Detention of vagrants on order of police court.

4 (1) When any person has been convicted of any offence by a police court under its summary jurisdiction, if after due inquiry the police magistrate is of opinion that the person so convicted is a vagrant within the meaning of this Ordinance, he may, in addition to or in substitution for any punishment which he has power to inflict, order such person to be detained in a house of detention. Any such order shall declare that the person against whom it is made is a vagrant, and shall also, if practicable, state any prior date from which, in the opinion of the police magistrate, such person has been in the colony a vagrant as defined by this Ordinance. Such order shall be a sufficient authority to the police for keeping in custody such person on the way to the house of detention and to the superintendent for receiving and detaining him there.

(2) Every person detained in a house of detention under this section shall be detained until work has been found for him, or until he is removed or discharged as hereinafter mentioned.

(3) Every person so detained shall be put to any labour of which the medical officer shall certify him to be capable.

Persons detained may be sent to hospital.

5 Any person detained in a house of detention may, if the medical officer considers it necessary, be sent to a hospital for treatment; but shall be deemed while in hospital to be still an inmate of the house of detention.

Regulations for management of houses of detention.

6 It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make regulations for the management of houses of detention. Such regulations may include among other things rules for—

- (a) The search of the person and clothing of any person admitted to the house;
- (b) The custody or destruction of the clothing and effects;
- (c) The diet, dress, and accommodation of the inmates;
- (d) Personal cleanliness, hours, meals, labour, and general conduct—

and may prescribe punishments for disobedience to such rules to be inflicted by the superintendent not exceeding one week's confinement, or one week's reduced diet (the nature of such confinement and of such reduced diet to be prescribed by the rules), or both such punishments.

Superintendent to endeavour to find employment for vagrants.

7 (1) The superintendent of any house of detention shall use his best endeavours to obtain suitable employment outside the house for the vagrants admitted thereto.

Penalty for refusing employment.

(2) When any such employment is obtained, any vagrant who refuses or neglects to avail himself thereof shall be liable to imprisonment of either description for any term not exceeding one month.

Agreements to leave the colony.

8 (1) Any vagrant detained in a house of detention may enter into an agreement in writing with the Colonial Secretary, binding himself to embark on such ship and at such time as the superintendent of the house of detention may direct, for the purpose of being removed from Ceylon at the expense (if any) of the Government of Ceylon, and not to return to Ceylon within five years.

- (2) Every such agreement shall be exempt from stamp duty, and shall be in the form in the schedule to this Ordinance or to a like effect.
- Enforcement of agreement.** (3) When a vagrant has entered into such agreement, unless in the opinion of the superintendent of the house of detention suitable employment is likely to be speedily found for such vagrant, the superintendent may enforce such agreement and cause such vagrant to be removed from Ceylon, and if he deems it desirable may call in the assistance of the police to place such vagrant on board ship, and such vagrant may be detained on board and shall be deemed in lawful custody while the ship is within the jurisdiction of the colony.
- Removal of vagrants from colony.** 9 (1) If within a reasonable time not exceeding one year from the date when he was committed to such house no suitable employment is obtainable for a vagrant detained in the house of detention, and such vagrant, not being a British subject born in Ceylon, has not entered into such agreement as hereinbefore mentioned, the Governor in Council may order him to be repatriated, and he shall be repatriated accordingly; and any person returning to Ceylon after having been repatriated under this Ordinance shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction thereof to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding six months.
- Discharge of vagrants.** (2) The Governor may at any time order any person detained in a house of detention to be discharged.
- Arrest without warrant of vagrant refusing to appear before police court.** 10 Any person who, being apparently a vagrant, refuses or fails to accompany a police officer, or to appear before a police court when required to do so, for the purposes of this Ordinance, may be arrested without warrant, and shall on conviction before a police court be liable to imprisonment of either description for any term not exceeding three months.
- Penalty on vagrant for escape.** 11 Any vagrant who escapes from the police while committed to their charge under this Ordinance, or who leaves a house of detention without permission of the superintendent, or who, having with such permission left a house of detention for a limited time or a specified purpose, fails to return at the expiration of such time or when such purpose has been accomplished or proves to be impracticable, shall on conviction before a police court be liable to imprisonment of either description for any term not exceeding three months.
- Saving of prosecutions under Ordinance No. 4 of 1841.** 12 Nothing contained in this Ordinance shall be construed to prevent the prosecution of any person for any offence punishable under Ordinance No. 4 of 1841, intituled "An Ordinance to amend the Laws relating to Vagrants."

Form of Agreement to leave the Colony.

Exempt from stamp duty.

Articles of agreement made this _____ day of _____, 190—, between the Colonial Secretary of Ceylon of the one part and A. B. of _____ (the vagrant) of the other part. Each of the parties hereto (so far as relates to the acts on his own part to be performed) hereby agrees with the other of them as follows:—

1. The said A. B. shall embark on board such ship and at such time as the superintendent of the house of detention shall direct.

2. The said A. B. shall remain on board such ship until such ship shall have arrived at the port of _____.*

3. The said A. B. shall not return to Ceylon until five years shall have elapsed from the date of such embarkation, unless he shall be specially permitted to return by the Government of Ceylon.

4. The said Colonial Secretary of Ceylon shall contract with the owner of such ship or his agent for the passage of the said

A. B. on board such ship and for his subsistence during the voyage for which he shall embark as aforesaid.

Statement of Objects and Reasons.

THE object of the draft Ordinance is to provide for the detention, in institutions established for the purpose, of persons who have no means of subsistence and are unable or unwilling to work for their own livelihood.

2. The Ordinance makes provision for the establishment of "houses of detention;" for the appointment of the necessary officers; and for the detention of vagrants, on the order of a magistrate, until they are removed under the Ordinance or discharged by order of the Governor.

3. Superintendents of Houses of Detention are charged with the duty of endeavouring to find employment for the vagrants in their charge; and punishment is provided for vagrants who refuse to take advantage of employment when found for them.

4. The Ordinance contains provisions for the removal of vagrants from the Island under agreement; for the repatriation, in certain cases, of foreign vagrants; and for making regulations for the management and discipline of houses of detention.
