Notice under Ordinance No. 1 of 1897 as amended by No. 1 of 1899.

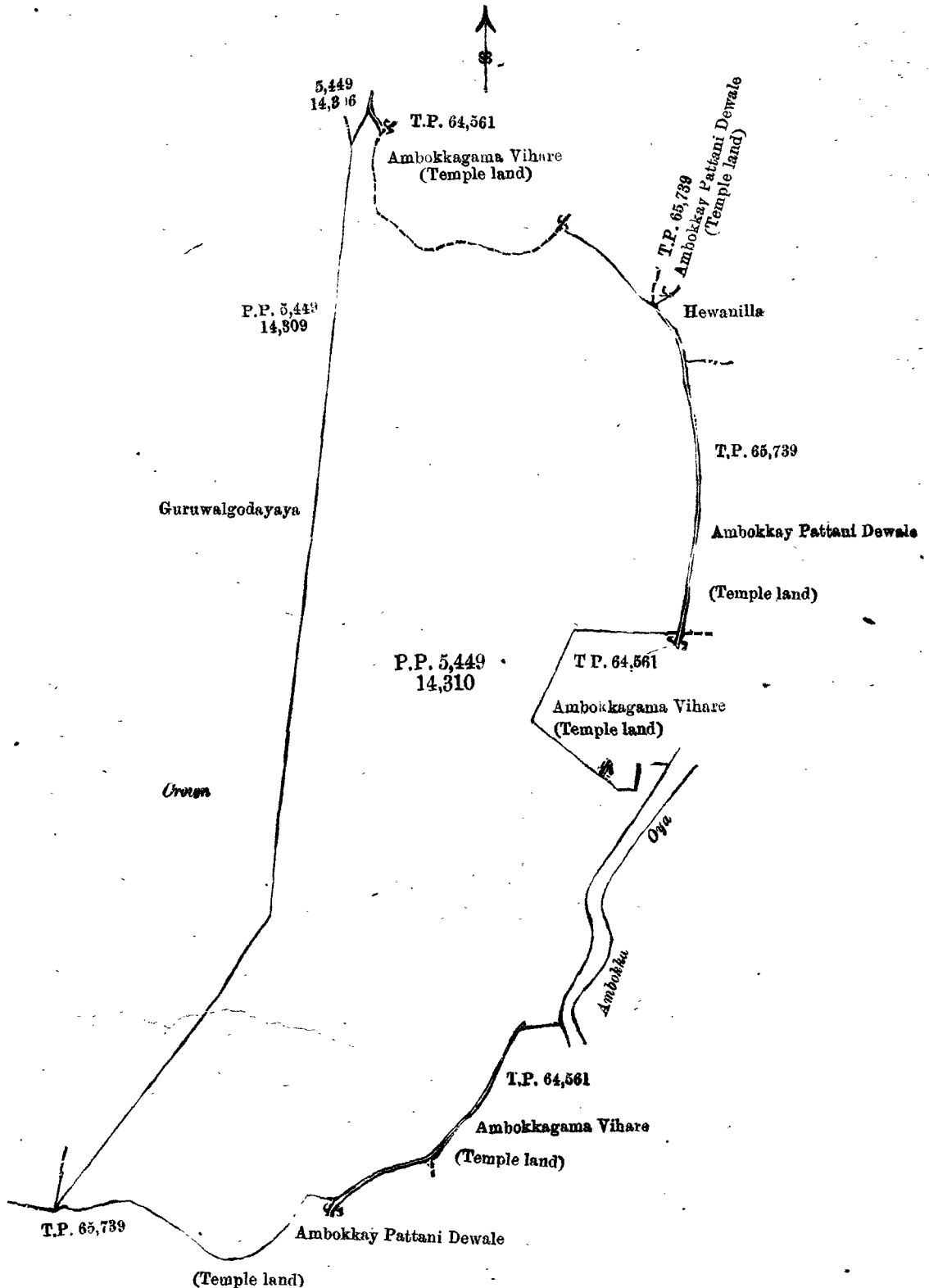

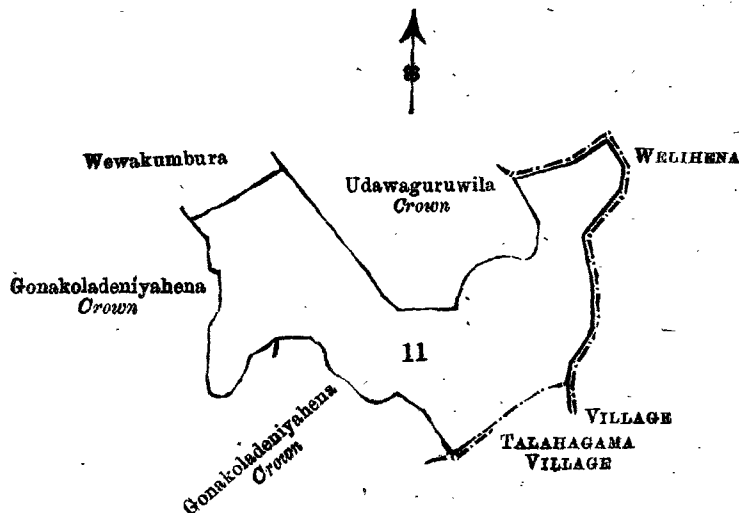

Description of the Land referred to.

The land commonly called or known as Dalukwinnawila, situated at Panadugama in the Gangaboda pattu of the Matara District, Southern Province, containing in extent 10 acres 2 roods and 8 perches, shown as lot No. 11 in block survey preliminary plan No. 70 and in the annexed tracing therefrom, and bounded as follows: on the north by the Crown land known as Udawaguruwila; on the east by the village limit of Welihena; on the south by the village limit of Talahagama and Crown land known as Gonakoladeniyahena; and on the west by the Crown land Gonakoladeniyahena and Wewakumbura, claimed by Geeganage Don Nicholas and others.
