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MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Municipal Office on Thursday, November 15, 1906.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated November 8, 1906.

Present :—Mr. B. Horsburgh, Acting Chairman; Mr. Chas. Perera; Mr. C. P. Dias; the Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G.; Sir Allan Perry, Kt.; Mr. James Peiris; Mr. M. L. M. Zainudeen; Dr. C. W. van Geyzel; Dr. W. H. de Silva; Mr. H. Tiruvilangam; Mr. W. Shakspeare; Mr. L. B. Fernando; Mr. A. Fairlie; and Mr. G. H. Alston.

The Minutes of October 12, 1906, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved,—That the Minutes of October 12 be confirmed.

By permission of Council Mr. E. Mansergh read a statement regarding the Colombo Drainage Works.

Mr. Chas. Perera moved a vote of thanks to Mr. Mansergh for this statement.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried unanimously.

1. Pursuant to notice, Mr. L. B. Fernando asked—Why the erection of a latrine for women at Modara and two Horbury latrines for men and women at suitable sites at Mutwal, recommended by the Sanitation Committee on the 6th June, 1905, have not been started yet? and moved for papers.

The Chairman replied that the delay was due to the selection of a suitable site for the erection of the latrines at Mutwal. The site has been recently decided on and the materials are now on order. As regards the latrine for Modara, a site has not been selected yet, but the matter has not been lost sight of.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. L. B. Fernando asked—What steps, if any, have been taken in the following matter, and moved for papers:—In May, 1901, Council sanctioned the road estimate of Rs. 10,417 for the improvement of New Fishers' quarters as soon as the road reservation was formally handed over to the Council. The matter appears to have been brought to the notice of the Chairman in May, 1905, as appears by the Chairman's memorandum of May 22, 1905.

The Chairman replied that the Council had not yet been put in possession of the land reservation by Government, and that when that is done the matter will receive attention. Meanwhile an alternative scheme was being prepared.

3. When item No. 3 on the agenda was taken up, the Chairman intimated that as the matter was a personal one he did not desire to preside during the discussion of the subject, and accordingly he would withdraw, and he moved that Mr. Chas. Perera, as Senior Member of Council, do take the chair.

Mr. G. H. Alston seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman having withdrawn, Mr. Chas. Perera occupied the chair.

Pursuant to notice, Dr. C. W. van Geysel moved—That this Council place on record their due appreciation of the work of the Chairman in cleansing the plague spots of the city, and thus contributing to the health of the city in general.

Sir Allan Perry, Kt., seconded.—Carried unanimously.

(The Chairman here re-entered the Council room and occupied the chair).

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. P. Dias moved—That an increase of salaries be given to also all the Officers of the Council who have served for nine years and upwards, and with the permission of Council amended his motion as follows:—

That a Special Committee consisting of the Chairman, Mr. Chas. Perera, the Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G., Mr. James Peiris, Dr. W. H. de Silva, Mr. A. Fairlie, and the mover be appointed to revise the present salaries of the employés of the Council, excepting those whose salaries were dealt with at the Meeting of Council held on October 12, 1906.

Dr. W. H. de Silva seconded.—Carried.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. James Peiris moved—That a Special Committee be appointed (a) to inquire into and report upon the present system of initiating and conducting prosecutions for the breach of Municipal by-laws, and (b) to report upon the desirability of appointing a Municipal Magistrate who is able to devote the whole of his time to the investigation of Municipal cases, and that the Special Committee consist of the Standing Committee on Law and Messrs. H. A. Jayewardene, A. Fairlie, and the mover.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

6. The second motion standing in Mr. James Peiris' name was withdrawn with the permission of Council.

7. The first motion standing in Mr. Chas. Perera's name was withdrawn with the permission of Council.

8. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Chas. Perera asked—If the Chairman incurred any expenditure of Municipal funds in preventing or lessening the ill-effects of the floods within the Municipal limits this year, and, if so, what was the amount of such expenditure, what was done thereby? and moved for papers.

The Chairman replied that a sum of Rs. 158 was expended for forming a dam at San Sebastian lock to exclude the flood water of the Kelani river from the lake area.

9. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Chas. Perera asked—If the scavenging and night soil conservancy of the town was interfered with during the recent floods, and, if so, what parts of the town and streets were not scavenged, and what number of closets were not conserved in consequence, and what was done in the matter after the abatement of the floods? and moved for papers.

The Chairman replied that the scavenging was interfered with in some parts of the town, and read out a list of the streets interfered with, and similarly in the case of conservancy. He added that as soon as the affected parts were able to be reached the work was attended to.

10. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Chas. Perera moved—That a Special Committee of this Council be appointed (1) to inquire into and ascertain what damage and distress have been caused to person and property within the Municipal limits by the floods; (2) the amount of damage to Municipal property; (3) to report in what manner relief should be afforded to the inhabitants who suffered damage from the floods; (4) to inquire into and ascertain—

(a) What steps were taken since 1866 to prevent or lessen the damage caused by floods?

(b) What outlets to the sea existed during the period of the years 1866 to 1889?

(c) Whether any such outlets have been stopped or rendered ineffective since then?

(d) What are the outlets existing at present?

(e) What steps were taken this year?

(f) Whether any steps are intended to be taken to prevent a recurrence of such damage?

and that the Special Committee consist of the Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G., Mr. James Peiris, Dr. W. H. de Silva, Mr. P. D. Warren, Mr. L. B. Fernando, and the mover.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

11. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Chas. Perera asked—What is the probable cost of the acquisition of land for the modified Mansergh scheme, and what the acquisition of such land up to date has cost? and—

12. What is the probable cost to Council of the acquisition of land for the widening of Panchikawatta road and Skinner's road North and South, &c., for the purpose of the tramway extension.

11 and 12. The Chairman replied that the probable estimated cost of the acquisition of land for the modified Mansergh scheme, as stated by the Government Agent, is Rs. 571,187, and the cost of acquisition up to date Rs. 496,187; and that the probable cost of acquisition of land for widening of Panchikawatta road and Skinner's road North and South, &c., as stated by the Government Agent, is Rs. 800,000, and that a sum of Rs. 424,858.90 had been expended up to date.

13. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Chas. Perera asked—From what fund it is proposed to pay for the acquisition of the lands in questions 11 and 12, and whether any part of the cost or expenses of such acquisitions have been already paid, and, if so, how much?

The Chairman replied that the only fund is the Municipal fund from which it is proposed to pay for the acquisition of lands.
