Part I.—Departmental Orders.

1.—All Departmental Orders will in future be published in Part I. of the *Ceylon Police Gazette*, which should be filed separately from Part II., which will consist of the old "Hue and Cry."

2.—The Inspector-General's Circular Guard File is abolished.

Order No. 21.

Remuneration other than the Salary of Police Officers.

NO Police Officer shall accept any remuneration other than the salary of his appointment from any body or individual.

If a Police Officer is offered a present for good work done, he should report the fact to his Superintendent, who may, at his discretion, authorize him to take it.

Subscriptions amongst Sergeants and Constables to make presents to their officers are wholly improper and contrary to the orders of Government. Any Officer, Sergeant, or Constable receiving such a present or paying money to give such a present is liable to dismissal from the Force.

All rewards earned by a Police Officer should invariably be entered in his Pocket Register.
