GOVERNOR.

Examination in Native Languages for Officers of the Irrigation Department.

DROMOTIONS of Irrigation Engineers will be made by His Excellency the Governor on the recommendation of the Director of Irrigation.

- 2. Such promotions will be regulated by the merits and qualifications of the officer concerned, and will not, as a matter of course, follow strict seniority, though claims will be considered in the order of precedence.
- 3. No officer appointed since the 1st January, 1906, will in future be qualified for promotion till he has successfully passed an examination in Sinhalese or Tamil, and all officers serving on probation must pass the examination within their period of probation before receiving promotion.
- 4. Such examination will be colloquial in character. Candidates will be required to converse with a cooly on the common subjects of his work, and be able to give intelligible instructions on such subjects to a Sinhalese or Tamil cooly. The marks required for a pass will be 60 per cent.
- 5. Officers will be required to pass in one of the two languages within two years of appointment, or in the case of officers now serving within two years from the date of this notice.
- The mere passing of the examination will not necessarily be followed by promotion, and there must be at least two years' service in one grade before promotion to the next.

- 7. Promotion will ordinarily follow priority in passing the language tests, but where a junior officer supersedes a senior owing to the possession of such qualification, he will take his place below that senior, provided the latter qualifies within the fixed period of two years, as soon as a vacancy arises, to which the senior may be promoted by order of the Governor.
 - 8. The examination will be held in connection with the quarterly Civil Service Examination.
- 9. Officers passing their examination are entitled to train fare, coach, or steamer fare if travelling by rail, coach, or steamer, and subsistence allowance at the rate of Rs. 7.50 for each day's necessary absence from station.

2. Tenders are to be made in duplicate on forms which will be supplied at the office of the Director of Irrigation or the Government Agent, Southern Province, and no tender will be considered unless furnished on these forms. The original should be forwarded by the tenderers direct to the Director of Irrigation, and the duplicate direct to the Hon. the Controller of Revenue, both to be forwarded at the same time.

- 3. A deposit of Rs. 100 should be made either at the Treasury or at the Kachcheri, and the receipt of the Hon. the Treasurer or the Government Agent should be produced when applying for forms. Should any person decline to enter into the contract and bond after he has tendered, or fail to furnish approved security, his deposit will be forfeited to the Crown. All other deposits will be returned upon the signing of the contract.
- 4. Cash security will be required for the fulfilment of the contract.
