PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

In the Name of His Majesty EDWARD THE SEVENTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY ARTHUR BLAKE, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

HENRY A. BLAKE.

WHEREAS by the 1st section of the Ordinance No. 19 of 1866, entitled "An Ordinance to prevent the unnecessary Destruction of Fish," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to prohibit the use of certain kinds of nets to be in such Proclamation specified, or to restrict their use to certain places, or to attach such conditions to their use, as shall appear expedient to the Governor with the said advice:

And whereas by a Proclamation dated 8th November, 1901, the use of the drag net called "Arak-kuddivalai" was prohibited within certain boundaries as specified in Schedule B thereto annexed:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to prohibit the use of the said drag net called "Arrakkuddivalai" and of certain other kinds of drag and drift nets and any combination of drag and drift nets within a certain specified area:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation prohibit the use of the said drag net called "Arakkuddivalai" and of certain other kinds of nets specified in the Schedule A hereto annexed along any part of the sea coast in the Northern Province lying within any of the areas described in Schedules B, C, and D annexed hereto.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Fifth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Seven.

SCHEDULE A

- I. The drag net called "Arakkuddivalai."
- 2. The net called "Kudduvalai," which consists of the drift net called "Valivalai," to which are attached one or more bags called "Madivalai," similar to those used with the drag net and weighted or not weighted at the bottom.
- 3. The drift net called "Valivalai" in any form, with or without weights and with or without "Madivalai" or other appendages.

SCHEDULE B.

The area bounded by a line running along the northern shore of the Jaffina lagoon from a point two miles north of the Punnalai causeway to Chundikkulam (the boundary running up the Uppar as far as the Uppar bridg:); thence along the southern shore of the lagoon from Chundikkulam to Kalmunai point, from Kalmunai point to the western point of Palaitivu; thence to the south-western corner of Nayinativu; thence to the southern point of Analaitivu, along the western coast of that Island, and from its northern point to the northern point of Eluvaitivu; thence to the north-western point of Karaitivu; and thence to the point on the shore of the lagoon two miles north of the Punnalai causeway.

SCREDULE C.

The area bounded by a line running from Kalmunai point to the western point of Palaitivu; thence to the western point of Iranaitivu; thence to the western limit of Pesalai village; and thence along the northern shore of Mannar Island, the Mannar causeway, and the western coast of the Northern Province to Kalmunai point.

SCHEDULE D.

The area bounded by a line running from the eastern end of the Tondaimannar bridge along the shore of the lagoon to the northern end of the Vallai bridge; along the Vallai bridge to its southern end; thence along the western shore of the lagoon to the western end of the Tondaimannar bridge, and along that to its eastern end.

SIR,—WITH reference to Mr. Chamberlain's Circular Despatch of the 25th July, 1901, I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony, a copy of an Order of His Majesty in Council giving effect to a Supplementary Convention between the United Kingdom and the United States of America for the extradition of fugitive criminals signed on the 12th April, 1905, the ratifications of which were exchanged at Washington on the 21st December 1906.

ORDER IN COUNCIL. Relating to the United States Extradition Order in Council, 1907.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 11th day of February, 1907.

Present .

The King's Most Excellent Majesty.

Lord President. Lord Chamberlain. Lord Sandhurst. Lord Reay. Lord Tweedmouth Mr. McKenna.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any Foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals. His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such Foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Convention was concluded on the Twelfth day of April, One thousand Nine hundred and Five, between His Majesty and the President of the United States of America, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Convention is in the terms following:—

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and the President of the United States of America, being desirous of enlarging the list of crimes on account of which extradition may be granted under the Conventions concluded between the United States and Great Britain on the Twelfth July, One thousand Eight hundred and Eighty-nine, and the Thirteenth December, One thousand Nine hundred, with a view to the better administration of justice and the prevention of crime in their respective territories and jurisdictions, have resolved to conclude a Supplementary Convention for this purpose, and have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries, to wit:

His Britannic Majesty, the Most Honourable Henry Charles Keith Petty-Fitzmaurice, Marquess of Lansdowne, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs;

And the President of the United States, the Honourable Joseph Hodges Choate, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the United States at the Court of His Britannic Majesty;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, which were found to be in due and proper form, have agreed to and concluded the following Articles:—

ARTICLE 1.

The following crimes are added to the list of crimes numbered one to ten in the first Article of the said Convention of the Twelfth July, One thousand Eight hundred and Eighty-nine, and to the list of crimes numbered eleven to thirteen in Article I. of the Supplementary Convention concluded between the United States and Great Britain on the Thirteenth December, One thousand Nine hundred, that is to say:—

- 14. Bribery, defined to be the offering, giving, or receiving of bribes made criminal by the laws of both countries.
 - 15. Offences, if made criminal by the laws of both countries, against bankruptcy law.

ARTICLE II.

The present Convention shall be considered as an integral part of the said Extradition Conventions of the Twelfth July, One thousand Eight hundred and Eighty-nine, and the Thirteenth December, One thousand Nine hundred, and the first Article of the said Convention of the Twelfth July, One thousand Eight hundred and Eighty-nine, shall be read as if the lists of crimes therein contained had originally comprised the additional crimes specified and numbered fourteen and fifteen in the first Article of the present Convention.

The present Convention shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged either at Washington or London as soon as possible.

It shall come into force ten days after its publication in conformity with the laws of the High Contracting Parties, and it shall continue and terminate in the same manner as the said Convention of the Twelfth July, One thousand Eight hundred and Eighty-nine.

In testimony whereof the respective Plenipotentaries have signed the present Convention in duplicate, and have thereunto affixed their seals.

Done at London, this Twelfth day of April, One thousand Nine hundred and Five.

And whereas the ratifications of the said Convention were exchanged at Washington on the Twenty-first day of December, One thousand Nine hundred and Six:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the Twenty-second day of February, One thousand Nine hundred and Seven, the said Acts shall apply in the case of the United States and of the said Convention with the President of the United States of America.

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominions of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in 1886, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," shall continue in force there, and no longer.

Seamen Deserters in Nicaragua

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 1st day of March, 1907.

Present

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 238 of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," it is provided that where it appears to His Majesty that due facilities are or will be given by the Government of any foreign country for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British ships in that country, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that that section shall apply in the case of such foreign country, subject to any limitations, conditions, and qualifications contained in the Order:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Government of the Republic of Nicaragua will give due facilities for recovering and apprehending seamen who desent from British ships in that country:

Now therefore His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by the hereinbefore recited sub-section (1) of section 238 of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare that the said section 238 of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," shall apply in the case of the Republic of Nicaragua.

Births.—The total births were 94. The birth-rate per 1,000 was 27.7,* as against 22.1 in the preceding week and 25.3 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 99. The death-rate per 1,000 was 29·2,* as against 33·9 in the previous week and 29·5 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—No person died from cholera, smallpox, or measles; 13 died from diarrhea and dysentery; 30 from phthisis, bronchitis, and pneumonia; 6 from different kinds of fever; and 2 from infantile convulsions.

Infantile deaths.—Of the 99 total deaths, 19 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 18 in the corresponding week of the previous year.
