#### MINUTE BY THE GOVERNOR.

NDER instructions from the Secretary of State, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct that pension rights now accorded under section 26 of the Pension Minute to the Mounted Orderlies (now called the Governor's Escort) and members of the Police Force, whether their salary at the time of retirement amounts to or is less than Rs. 250 per annum, be extended to the uniformed and armed staff of Overseers, Sub-Overseers, and Guards of the Prison Department whose salaries amount to Rs. 240 a year and over, and that the following amendment of section 26 giving effect thereto be published for general information:

Mounted Orderlies (now called the Governor's Escort) and members of the Police Force and Prison Department shall be entitled to pension on the scale laid down in section 2, whether their salary at the time of retirement amounts to or is less than Rs. 250 per annum. In the case of the Prison Department pension rights are to be limited strictly to the uniformed and armed staff of Overseers, Sub-Overseers, and Guards whose salaries amount to Rs. 240 and over, and not extended to other Prison employés, whose rights to long service allowances will remain as they are. Men who served in the late Ceylon Rifle Regiment and who enlisted in any department of the Public Service during the months of July and August, 1873, will be allowed to count towards pension one-third of their military service, provided that they are not in the receipt of a military pension.

## PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR.

In the Name of His Majesty EDWARD THE SEVENTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir Henry Arthur Blake, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

HENRY A. BLAKE.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date the 12th day of January, 1893, the tract of forest land mentioned in the schedule to the said Proclamation and within the limits therein specified and set forth was, under the provisions of section 19 of "The Forest Ordinance, 1885," declared to be reserved forest as from and after the 1st day of February, 1893:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient that certain lots of forest land forming part of the tract so reserved as aforesaid shall cease to be reserved:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in exercise of the powers in Us vested by section 30 of the said Ordinance, do by this Our Proclamation direct that the lots of forest land specified and set forth in the schedule hereto shall cease to be reserved as from and after the 24th day of June, 1907.

Given at Kandy, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-eighth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Seven.

## COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended June 22, 1907, is subjoined (A).

Births.—The total births were 80. The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum was 23.6,\* as against 23.0 in the preceding week and 25.3 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 107. The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 31.6,\* as against 31.0 in the previous week and 51.2 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—No persons died from cholera, smallpox, or measles; 13 died from diarrhœa and dysentery; 16 from phthisis; 15 from bronchitis and pneumonia; 13 from different kinds of fever; and 6 from infantile convulsions.

Infantile deaths.—Of the 107 total deaths, 24 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 36 in the corresponding week of the previous year.
