In the Name of His Majesty EDWARD THE SEVENTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir HENRY ARTHUR BLAKE, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

HENRY A. BLAKE.

HEREAS by section 4 of "The Village Communities' Ordinance, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to be by him for that purpose issued, to declare from time to time, as he may think desirable, that any Chief Headman's division or part thereof shall be brought, from a time to be named therein, within the operation of the said Ordinance:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that from and after the First day of January, 1906, the Chief Headman's division of the Uda, Meda, and Palle pattus of Nawadun korale in the Ratnapura District of the Province of Sabaragamuwa, shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, be brought within the operation of the said Ordinance.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-second day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Five.

WHEREAS by section 8 of "The Police Ordinance, 1865," it is enacted that it shall be awful for the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to establish a police force in any place other than large towns, though such force be not mentioned in the manner prescribed by the said Ordinance, and to declare that certain of the provisions of the said Ordinance shall come into operation at such place, specifying the limits thereof, and such Proclamation from time to time to revoke, alter, or amend:

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the 25th day of January, 1893, a pelice force was established at Kolonnawa in the District of Colombo, Western Province, under the provisions of the above-recited section of the said Ordinance, and it is expedient to revoke the said Proclamation:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, in exercise of the power in Us vested as aforesaid, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation bearing date the 25th day of January, 1893, by which a police force was established as aforesaid at Kolonnawa in the District of Colombo, Western Province.

Given at Kandy, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Third day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Six.

MISCELLANEOUS DEPARTMENTAL NOTICES.

COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended December 23, 1905, is subjoined (A).

Births.—The total births were 70. The birth-rate per 1,000 was 21.5,* as against 27.3 in the

preceding week and 19·1 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 134. The death-rate per 1,000 was 41·1,* as against 41·7 in the

previous week and 28.8 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—2 persons died from measles; 23 died from diarrhæa and dysentery; 24 from phthisis, bronchitis, and pneumonia; 9 from different kinds of fever; and 9 from infantile convulsions.

Infantile deaths.—Of the 134 total deaths, 31 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 36 in the corresponding week of the previous year.

COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended December 30, 1905, is subjoined (A).

Births.—The total births were 61. The birth-rate per 1,000 was 18.7,* as against 21.5 in the preceding week and 19.4 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 146. The death-rate per 1,000 was 44.8,* as against 41.1 in the previous week and 29.7 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—No persons died from cholera, smallpox, or measles; 29 d ed from diarrhœa and dysentery; 38 from phthisis, bronchitis, and pneumonia; 5 from different kinds of fever; and 6 from infantile convulsions.

Infantile deaths.—Of the 146 total deaths, 21 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 26 in the corresponding week of the previous year.

SEALED Tenders (in duplicate), marked on the envelopes "Tenders for the supply of Satinwood," will be received up to noon on Saturday, January 20, 1906, from persons willing to contract to carry out the under-mentioned work.

To fell 150 satinwood trees in Karunkalikulam Proposed Reserve, situated to the east of Vavuniya, and to log, bark, square, transport, and deliver them at the Vavuniya railway station.

50 logs should be delivered before April 15, 1906, and the whole quantity before August 31, 1906. A maximum distance of $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the North-Central road and 12½ miles altogether from the station.

Any person wishing to tender for the above work should deposit in any of the Kachcheries a sum of Rs. 20 and submit the receipt to the Assistant Conservator of Forests, Jaffna, who will thereupon issue to him the form on which the tender must be made.

Tenders should be submitted in duplicate, the original being sent to the Assistant Conservator of Forests, Jaffna, and the duplicate to the Hon. the Auditor-General, both being despatched at the same

Should the person tendering decline to enter into the contract and bond, or fail to furnish security, the deposit made for tender form will be forfeited to the Crown.

A rate per cubic foot of satinwood delivered must be quoted, written both in words and figures.

All alterations in any tender should be initialled by the person signing it. Tenders containing alter-ations not so initialled will be treated as informal and rejected.

Five per cent. of the estimated total sum which will have to be paid for the work must be deposited as security for the due fulfilment of the contract before it is signed.

The Government reserves to itself the right, without

question, of rejecting any or all tenders.
