#### COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended March 3, 1.06, is subjoined A:

Bi-ths.—The to al births were 134. The birth-rate per 1,000 wa: 40·3,\* as agains 47·3 in the preceding week and 24·6 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 119. The death-rate per 1,000 was 35.8,\* as against 28.0 in the previous week and 25.8 in the orresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—No persons died from cholera, smallpox, or measles; 20 died from diarrhoea and, dysentery; 30 from phthis s, bronchitis, and pn umonia; 12 from different kinds of fever; and 6 from infantile convulsions.

Injuntile deaths.—Of the 119 total deaths, 27 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 12 in the corresponding week of the previous year.
