PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

In the Name of His Majesty EDWARD THE SEVENTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir HENRY ARTHUR BLAKE, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

HENRY A. BLAKE.

HEREAS by section 25 of "The Irrigation and Paddy Cultivation Ordinance, 1899," it is amongst other things enacted that all rules for the enforcement of ancient customs regarding the irrigation and cultivation of paddy lands within any district in the Island, framed under the provisions of section 13 or section 16 of the said Ordinance, shall when completed be transmitted by the Government Agent to the Governor, for the approval or disallowance thereof by the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and that in case such rules shall be approved, notice of such approval shall be given by Proclamation: and the said rules shall be published in the Government Gazzette and in the district in such manner as to the Government Agent shall seem expedient, and shall thereupon become binding upon all proprietors within the said district, and shall be as legal, valid, and effectual as if the same had been inserted in the said Ordinance:

And whereas it is expedient that the following rule, which has been framed under the provisions of section 13 of the said Ordinance and transmitted by the Government Agent of the Central Province, and approved by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, should be brought into operation in the irrigation district of Uda Hewaheta division of the District of Nuwara Eliya, Central Province:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, in exercise of the power in Us vested as aforesaid, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation give notice of our approval of the said rule for the better enforcement of ancient customs in regard to the cultivation of paddy lands in the irrigation district of Uda Hewaheta division in the District of Nuwara Eliya, Central Province.

Given at Kandy, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Ninth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Six.

Rule referred to.

In the division of Uda Hewaheta in the Nuwara Eliya District of the Central Province, the Vel-muladeniya shall be entitled to receive from the general crop four measures of paddy annually for each amuna of paddy sown as Vel-muladeniya's share. If more than one Vel-muladeniya is appointed the share shall be divided equally between them.

The paddy shall be delivered to the Vel-muladeniya at the threshing floor before

any is removed.

MISCELLANEOUS DEPARTMENTAL NOTICES.

COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended March 10, 1906, is subjoined (A).

Births.—The total births were 136. The birth-rate per 1,000 was 40.9,* as against 40.3 in the preceding week and 24.6 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 102. The death-rate per 1,000 was 30·7,* as against 35·8 in the previous week and 33·2 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—No persons died from cholera, smallpox, or measles; 20 died from diarrhoea and dysentery; 25 from phthis s. bronchitis, and pneumonia; 6 from different kinds of fever; and 9 from infantile convulsions.

Infantile deaths.—Of the 102 total deaths, 28 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 30 in the corresponding week of the previous year.
