Recruiting.

SEVERAL instances have lately been brought to my notice of entries of incorrect measurement in the enlistment forms of recruits. They have been found to be deficient in their chest and height "measureenlistment forms of recruits. ments on being re-measured at the Depôt and have had to be sent back to their villages.

2. As this entails unnecessary expense to Government the officer responsible for recording the incorrect

measurements will in future be liable to pay all expenses incurred in the transport of the recruit.

3. The attention of recruiting officers is also drawn to the necessity for their personal inspection of the recruit, and for the expression of their personal opinion as to his suitability for the Police Force, his general appearance, smartness, and intelligence.

4. Certificates as to the good character of the recruit should be forwarded with their enlistment papers.
