"PENNY POSTAGE TO EGYPT."

HENRY A. BLAKE.

WHEREAS by section 37 of the Ceylon Postal and Telegraph Ordinance of 1892 it is enacted that the respective rates of postage and fees for registration chargeable on postal packets to be transmitted in or beyond this Island shall be determined from time to time by Proclamation issued by the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, and published in the Government Gazette:

And whereas it is expedient to reduce the rate of postage on letters addressed to Egypt:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby determine that on and from the First day of April, 1906, the rate of postage on letters addressed to Egypt shall be six cents per half ounce.

W HEREAS by section 4 of Ordinance No. 8 of 1901 it is enacted that the Municipal Council may from time to time make, and when made may revoke, amend, alter, or vary such by-laws as may seem necessary or expedient for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the Ordinance No. 7 of 188's'

And whereas by sub-sections 1 and 2 of section 6 of the said Ordinance No. 8 of 1901 it is enacted that no by-law or revocation, amendment, alteration, or variation of any by-law shall have effect unto the same is confirmed by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and that all by-law when so confirmed shall be published in two successive issues of the Government Gazette in the English Sinhalese, and Tamil languages, and shall be laid before the Legislative Council if then in session, and i not then in session, then as soon as possible after the commencement of the next ensuing session; and i within forty days after their being so laid before the said Legislative Council any of such by-laws be objected to by the said Legislative Council, the said Council may by resolution amend or annul any such by-laws; and that all such by-laws so amended, and such by-laws as shall not be amended or annulled by the said Council, shall be proclaimed in two such successive issues of the Government Gazette in the English, Sinhalese, and Tamil languages, and shall come into force upon such Proclamation in the Government Gazette, and shall thereupon be as legal, valid, effectual, and binding as if the same had been enacted in the said Ordinance:

And whereas by-law No. 4 contained in Chapter II. of the by-laws proclaimed on the 12th day of October, 1905, has been amended by the Municipal Council of Colombo, under the provisions of section 4 aforesaid of the said Ordinance No. 8 of 1901, by substituting therefor the amended by-law set out in the schedule hereto, and the same, having under section 6 (1) thereof been confirmed by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, was published in two successive issues of the Government Gazette, namely, on the 2nd and 9th of February, 1906, in the English, Sinhalese, and Tamil languages, and laid before the Legislative Council then being in session:

And whereas the same has not been amended or annulled by the said Legislative Council within forty days after its being so laid before the said Council:

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Governor, in exercise of the power in Us vested as aforesaid, do hereby proclaim the said amended by-law as set forth in the schedule hereto.

The drugs specified in Appendix A will be supplied free to the above Dispensaries by Government on approved requisitions.

. Regulations referred to.

Instructions for the Guidance of Superintendents of Estates, and of Dispensers in Charge of Estate Dispensaries.

An estate or group of estates which maintains a Dispenser and a suitable building for a Dispensary will be allowed a certain amount of drugs free by Government. Government encourages the establishment of such Dispensaries in the hope that treatment being placed within easy reach of the labourer, he will avail himself of it at a much earlier period in his illness than he probably would of that at the Government Dispensary, which is, as a rule, at a considerable distance from him.

At the earlier period the illness would most probably yield to such ordinary treatment as the Estate Dispensers are qulified to give; this would tend to lessen the number requiring Hospital treatment, and eventually the Hospital mortality, but Estate Superintedents are reminded that the employment of a Dispenser does not free them from their obligations to their labourers under the Medical Aid Ordinance, No. 17 of 1880.

Estate Dispensers are not sufficiently trained, and are therefore not considered qualified to treat serious illness, and in all such cases the District Medical Officer should be sent for to see the patient in terms of section 22. Superintendents are requested to see this rule duly carried out.

requested to see this rule duly carried out.

2. Such a Dispensary will be known as an "Estate Dispensary," and the drugs supplied to it being for the exclusive use of the estate labourers must not be put to any other use whatever.

any other use whatever.

3. A list of the drugs which will be supplied free to Estate Dispensaries by the Government is noted in Appendix A.

4. These drugs will be issued only to a certain amount, calculated at the rate of 50 cents per annum for each resident labourer.

5. Requisitions for these drugs are to be forwarded to the Principal Civil Medical Officer and Inspector-General of Hospitals twice a year, only on such forms as will be supplied.

6. The half-yearly requisitions for medicines from Estates Dispensaries in the Central, North-Contral, and Uva Provinces should be sent so as to reach the office of the Principal Civil Medical Officer and Inspector-General of Hospitals, on January 10 and July 10 each year; those in the Southern Province on February 10 and August 10; and those in the Western, North-Western, and Sabaragamuwa Provinces on March 10 and Soptember 10.

7. The half-yearly requisitions will be complied with within a month of their

receipt.

8. Should drugs be required in the interval, they should be applied for on the

form which will be supplied for the purpose.

9. Intermediate requisitions referred to in paragraph 8 will be complied with, with as little delay as possible, provided the cost of the drugs will not exceed the amount allowed by Government.

10. All the columns in the half-yearly and intermediate requisition forms must be carefully and accurately filled in, and the "remaining" column should bear the exact date on which the requisition is made up, and must show the quantities of medicines actually in stock on that date.

11- All requisitions must be signed by the Superintendent, and a certificate according to Appendix B must be attached, otherwise they will not be entertained.

12. Drugs other than those specified in Appendix A (provided they be in stock at the Civil Medical Stores) will be issued on application to the Principal Civil Medical Officer and Inspector-General of Hospitals, but only on prepayment of value.

13. On receipt of an application for drugs on payment, the applicant will first be : informed of its cost, and the drugs will be issued without delay when cheque or postal or money order has been received. Drugs will also be issued per Value-payable Parcel Post when so desired.

14. All cheques or postal or money orders must be crossed, and made payable to the Principal Civil Medical Officer and Inspector-General of Hospitals.

15. Superintendents of scheduled estates can obtain from the Civil Medical Stores any drug on payment in the manner prescribed in paragraphs 12 and 13.

Medicines will not be compounded at the Civil Medical Stores, but such may be obtained from the District Hospitals and Dispensaries.

17. All applications for drugs should give full directions how the drugs are to be forwarded.

18. Surgical instruments and appliances, stationery, and equipment will not be

supplied by Government.

19. Subject to the approval of the Principal Civil Medical Officer and Inspector-General of Hospitals the appointment of a Dispenser to the charge of an Estate Dispensary, continued employment, leave of absence, and the appointment of a temporary substitute shall rest with the Superintendent, who will also pay his salary and supervise his work.

20. It is to be clearly understood that an Estate Dispensary and its Dispenser form no part of the Civil Medical Department or of Government service, and that

no pension rights are attached to the office.

21. The Dispenser may collect for the Superintendent, to be forwarded to the District Medical Officer of the station, all reports of births and deaths on the estate under his charge immediately after they occur. These reports are not to be signed by the Dispenser or any other person on the estate, except by the Superintendent himself, or, in his absence, by the person acting for him. This is a duty imposed on the Superintendent by clause 20 (e) of Ordinance No. 17 of 1880.

The Superintendent may note on the death report whether the patient was attended by the Estate Dispenser; but the fact of his having been so attended does not free the Superintendent of his obligation to send for the District Medical Officer, in terms of clause 20 (d) of the Medical Ordinance. The attendance of the Estate Dispenser cannot be considered as fulfilling the requirements of the Medical Aid

Ordinance in serious cases

The Dispenser shall request the Superintendent of the estate to send for the Medical Officer of the District to see any serious case or cases for which he may require a higher opinion, or in which removal to the hospital might be injurious to the patient, and he shall do so in all cases of prolonged midwifery.

The Dispenser shall bring to the notice of the Superintendent the condition of the lines or their surroundings likely to injuriously effect the occupants, and

suggest remedies.

25. The Dispenser shall submit monthly a return to the Colonial Surgeon of the Province of the diseases treated at the Estate Dispensary on the form which would be supplied him for the purpose.

The Dispenser shall keep a register of the patients treated by him, and a

book in which he is to record all the prescriptions compounded by him.

27. Rules for the guidance of the Dispensor as to hours of attending the Dispensor. sary and visiting lines on the estate will be drawn up by the Superintendent.

28. The supply of drugs to an Estate Dispensary will cease when an estate or group of estates will no longer maintain a Dispenser.

29. Whenever the District Medical Officer or assistant is sent for to see a case on any of the estates provided with a Dispensary, either the one or the other must attend in person. In no case is an unqualified assistant or Apothecary to be sent.

The examination shall be held in two parts: the first part, a qualifying examination in Handwriting, Spelling, and Arithmetic. Any candidate failing to obtain two-thirds of the marks allotted for Handwriting and half those allowed for Spelling and Arithmetic respectively shall be excluded from the remainder of the examination. Special attention will be paid to Handwriting, and candidates whose writing is untidy or illegible or contains defects in the formation of letters will be rigorously excluded. COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended March 24, 1906, is subjoined A).

Births.—The total births were 136. The birth-rate per 1,000 was 40.9,* as against 39.4 in the preceding week and 32.5 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 120. The death-rate per 1,000 was 36·1,* as against 33·4 in the previous week and 31·3 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—No persons died from cholera, smallpox, or measles; 13 died from diarrhœa and dysentery; 31 from phthis s, bronchitis, and pneumonia; 10 from different kinds of fever; and 12 from infantile convulsions.

In/antile deaths.—Of the 120 total deaths, 35 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 30 in the corresponding week of the previous year.
