PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Hugh CLIFFORD, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer Administering the Government of the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

HUGH CLIFFORD.

HEREAS the ports of Jaffna, Point Pedro, Valvettitturai, Kankesanturai, Mannar, Pesalai, and Mullaittivu were brought within the operation of "The Masters Attendant's Ordinance, 1865," by a Proclamation dated 20th March, 1880, and certain port rules were from time to time framed and established in respect of the said several ports dated the 20th March, 1880, and the 10th January,

And whereas it is expedient that the said rules mentioned in Schedule E, F1, and F2 to the said Proclamation dated the 10th January, 1896, should be repealed:

Now know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby repeal the said rules, and in lieu thereof establish the rules set out in the schedule hereto marked E, F 1, and F 2 as rules for the said ports of Jaffna, Point Pedro, Valvettitturai, Kankesanturai, Mannar, Pesalai, and Mullaittivu with effect from 15th September, 1907.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-sixth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Seven.

SCHEDULE.

E.

Rules and Scale of Boat Hire for Licnesed Boats for the Ports of Jaffna, Point Pedro, Valvettiturai, Kankesanturai, Mannar, Pesalai, and Mullaittivu.

- 1. Owners and tindals of licensed boats of the above ports shall give notice at the Master Attendant's Office whenever for repairs or other causes their boats are withdrawn from work or from the ports, so that their numbers may be taken off the registers for the time they are so withdrawn.
- 2. The transfer of a licensed boat by the owner shall also be notified at the Master Attendant's Office.
- 3. All licensed cargo and passenger boats within the above ports shall be anchored or moored in such places as may be appointed by the Master Attendant of the port, and no idle or unemployed boat shall remain alongside of any wharf or jetty.
- 4. Any person requiring the service of more than two boats must make arrangements with the licensed boat owners. Any person requiring the service of boats during the day must make arrangements with the licensed boat owners, provided that if the licensed owners of boats unreasonably refuse to comply with the request of any person the matter shall be referred to the Master Attendant for his orders.

Parties engaging a boat, although not having a full load either of cargo or passengers, must pay the full rate of the boat hire according to the size of the boat.

The foregoing rates of charges are during the ordinary weather.

Parties requiring a boat during very stormy weather or during a gale of wind, or to vessels anchored beyond the limits of the ports, to make their own arrangements with the licensed boat owners as to the amount of boat hire.

Questions as to the state of the weather in view of the charges to be made should be settled by the Master Attendant, whose decision shall be considered final.

The rates of boat hire during the night, that is to say, between the hours of six o'clock in the evening and six o'clock in the morning, shall be one-half as much again as the rates for hire during the day.

A fare and a half shall be paid for boats proceeding with cargo for shipment and returning with cargo for landing, but in no case shall a boat be detained over one hour after discharging cargo either on board the vessel or on shore.

RULE REFERRED TO.

14. Delivery in Ceylon: Customs Duty.—The Post Office pays to the Customs the duty on any packet received by British, Foreign, or Indian Parcel Post, and forwards the packet for delivery on payment of the charges and duty. If the addressee considers that duty is erroneously charged, he should not take delivery, and the parcel should be returned for examination by the Customs Officer at the General Post Office. In case of any further dispute the matter must be referred to the Principal Collector of Customs. In places where a local Customs Officer exists, the parcel need not be returned to the General Post Office, but the Principal Collector of Customs, if applied to, will order examination by the local Customs Officer. If delivery is taken before examination by a Customs Officer, no refund that be granted unless it can be shown that duty was charged owing to an obvious clerical mistake.

- 1. It shall be lawful for the Chairman, Local Board, or any person authorized in writing by him for the purpose, to visit and inspect at any time any burial or cremation ground, and all books or documents relating thereto.
- 2. No grave shall be less than 5 feet in depth or at a less distance than 4 feet from another.
- 3. No grave shall be re-opened within three years, nor vault within six months, from the last interment therein, except upon orders from a competent authority.
- 4. The ashes and remains at the spot where any cremation has taken place shall be buried within three days of the cremation at a depth of not less than 3 feet.
- 5. A table of fees for burial and cremation shall be submitted by the keeper of every burial and cremation ground for the approval of the Chairman, Local Board, and only such fees as are approved by the said Chairman, Local Board, shall be charged.
- 6. No burial or cremation shall take place in a registered burial or cremation ground without the permission of the keeper of the said ground, who will be held responsible for the due observance of these by-laws.
- 7. Any person applying to have a burial or cremation in a registered burial or cremation ground shall be bound to obey the lawful orders of the keeper of the said ground.
- 8. Any person entitled to the possession of a burial or cremation ground within the limits of the Local Board town of Bandarawela shall apply in writing to the Government Agent to have the same registered as such, stating the name of the keeper of the ground, and annexing to his application a figure of survey of the premises certified by the Surveyor-General or a duly licensed surveyor. And the person named as keeper in such application shall subscribe the same in acknowledgment of his acceptance of the office and duties of such keeper.
- 9. If no keeper be named, or if the keeper so named shall not have signed the application in manner aforesaid, then the person who shall have made the application for the registration of a burial or cremation ground shall be held to be the keeper of the ground, and shall be responsible for any breach of by-laws in respect thereto.
- 10. In the event of the death or inability from any cause to fulfil his duties of the keeper of a burial or cremation ground, application to have the same registered shall be made as provided in by-law 8 aforesaid, and no burial or cremation shall take place in such ground until registration on such application has been effected, except on the special license of the Government Agent.
- 11. It shall be the duty of the keeper of every burial or cremation ground within the limits of the Local Board town of Bandarawela to keep a register of all burials or cremations carried out on the premises of which he is the keeper in the form prescribed by the Chairman, Local Board, and to cause to be delivered a copy of this register to the office of the Chairman, Local Board, not more than twenty-four hours after a burial or cremation shall have taken place therein.
- 12. It shall be the duty of every keeper of a burial or cremation ground to keep the same clean and in good order to the satisfaction of the Chairman, Local Board.
- 13. Every burial or cremation ground shall be enclosed by a substantial wall or fence approved by the Chairman, Local Board.
- 14. If the keeper of a registered burial or cremation ground is unable from any cause to perform his duties, or if he cannot be found at the time when his services are required, the Government Agent may authorize any fit and proper person to perform any of the duties which by these rules are assigned to keepers of registered burial or cremation grounds.
- 15. Any person who is aggrieved by any order given by the keeper of a registered burial ground, or by any act or omission on his part, may complain to the Government Agent, and the Government Agent shall give such orders as may be necessary to secure the proper observance of these rules.

THE following regulations made by the Local Board, Bandarawela, being the proper authority in that behalf in pursuance of the powers conferred by sections 18 and 23 of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," in respect of the general cemetery at Bandarawela, are published for general information.

REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

1. All applications for graves shall be made to the keeper of the cemetery not less than six hours before the time fixed for the burial of a person for whom the grave is wanted.

2. No one shall be allowed to dig a grave except the persons employed or

approved by the keeper.

3. The keeper shall intimate the line to be followed by the funeral party on arriving at the cemetery, and if more than one party come at the same time, the order in which they are respectively to move to the graves.

4. Should it be necessary for the purposes of preventing the disturbance of one funeral party by another, and not otherwise, the keeper may require that one burial service should be concluded before another is commenced.

5. The keeper shall be entitled to keep order within the cemetery, and his

commands in that behalf shall be obeyed.

6. No grave shall be less than 5 feet in depth or at a less distance than 4 feet from another. No grave shall be re-opened within three years, no vault within six months, from the last interment therein, except upon orders from a competent authority.

7. No dead body shall be buried without the permission of the cemetery keeper;

and such permission shall not be granted until all fees due have been paid.

Provided that on production of a certificate signed by a person especially authorized in that behalf in writing by the Chairman, Local Board, that the relatives and friends of any deceased person are not able to pay the fees therein authorized for the digging of a grave, the keeper of the cemetery shall cause a grave to be dug and the corpse to be buried therein free of charge.

9. For building a vault one foot shall be allowed for each side wall, and the space of ground above specified shall on no account be exceeded, nor shall any

allowance be made for the construction of steps leading into the vault.

10. The keeper of the cemetery thall send to the Chairman, Local Board, monthly a statement of all moneys recovered by him, together with such recoveries.

COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended July 27, 1907, is subjoined (A).

Births.—The total births were 67. The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum was 19.8,* as against 24.5 in the preceding week and 27.1 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 118. The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 34.8,* as against 31.3 in the previous week and 43.9 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—No persons died from cholera, smallpox, or measles; 18 died from diarrhœa and dysentery; 22 from phthisis; 13 from bronchitis and pneumonia; 6 from different kinds of fever; and 7 from infantile convulsions.

Infantile deaths.—Of the 118 total deaths, 20 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 30 in the corresponding week of the previous year.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Hugh Clifford, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer Administering the Government of the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

HUGH CLIFFORD.

W HEREAS by section 28 of "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof, or by a Commissioner of Assize duly appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance, for each of the Circuits into which the Island is divided for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offences—

For the Midland Circuit, three times at least at Kandy, and any other sessions at such other places in such Circuit, as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint; such sessions commencing at Kandy on March 10, on August 1, and on December 1 in every year:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to order that a Criminal Session of the Supreme Court should be holden, on the day hereinafter mentioned, at Badulla, a place included within the said Midland Circuit:

Now therefore, know Ye that We, the said Acting Governor, for sufficient reasons to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do order and appoint that a Criminal Sessien of the Supreme Court shall be holden at Badulla, in the said Midland Circuit, on or about Monday, the Second day of September, 1907.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Second day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Seven.
