HEREAS by section 14 (1) of Ordinance No. 15 of 1896 it is enacted that when it appears to the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time, that by reason of the existence or apprehension of crime and outrage in any district it is desirable to quarter police in such district, or, should a police force have been already established there, to increase the same, he may by Proclamation, which shall be published in the Government Gazette, declare that for the reason aforesaid such district requires police or additional police, and may order police to be quartered in such district or additional police to be employed there:

And whereas it appears to the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, that by reason of the existence of crime and outrage in the district defined in the schedule hereunto annexed, it is desirable to quarter police in the said district:

Now know Ye that We, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that by reason of the existence of crime and outrage therein the said district in the Northern Province requires police, and do hereby order that a police force consisting of one Sergeant and six Constables be quartered in the said district in the said Northern Province as from and after the Twentieth day of October, 1902, for a period of three months.

And We do further hereby define the limits of the said district to be those set out in the schedule hereunto annexed.
