#### MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

#### Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, May 10, 1907.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated May 3, 1907.

Present :--Mr. E. M. de C. Short, Chairman; Mr. Chas. Perera; Mr. C. P. Dias; Sir Allan Perry, Kt.; Mr. M. L. M. Zainu Deen; Dr. C. W. van Geyzel; Mr. H. Tiruvilangam; Mr. M. F. Khan; Mr. L. B. Fernando; and Mr. A. Fairlie.

The Minutes of April 12, 1907, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of April 12, 1907, be confirmed.

The Chairman moved that Council do go into Committee.

Mr. M. F. Khan seconded.

# (Council in Committee.)

1. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved-That the valuation contained in the assessment books of 1906 be adopted for the year 1907, in terms of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, with such revisions as may be found practicable, and further that in making such revision the procedure indicated in section 138 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887 be adopted, in order to remove doubts which have arisen as to the effect of the said resolution. and as by reason of the fact that the revisions of the valuation contained in the assessment books of 1906 had at the date of passing the said resolution been already made the procedure indicated in section 138 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887 has become impracticable, that the said resolution be rescinded, and in lieu thereof to

move the following resolution: "That the valuation contained in the assessment books of 1906 with the revisions made prior to the 14th day of December, 1906, as contained in the ten assessment registers of the following wards, viz., Fort, Pettah, Slave Island, Colpetty, Maradana, St. Paul's, New Bazaar, San Sebastian, Kotahena (A), Kotahena (B), and in the Crown lands register of the Municipality of Colombo be adopted for the year 1907," and with leave of Council substituted the word "alterations" in line 1 for the word "revisions."

Sir Allan Perry, Kt., seconded.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved as an amendment—"That the valuation contained in the assessment books of 1906 as contained in the ten assessment registers of the following wards, viz., Fort, Pettah, Slave Island, Colpetty, Maradana, St. Paul's, New Bazaar, San Sebastian, Kotahena (A), Kotahena (B.), and in the Crown lands register of the Municipality of Colombo, be adopted for the year 1907."

Mr. H. Tiruvilangam seconded.

Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of April 24, 1907.

(6) Letter from Medical Officer of Health, No. 83 of March 8, 1907, re increase of pay to the general cemetery coolies.

Recommended that the cemetery coolies pay be placed on the same footing as that of slaughter-house coolies, the increase not to be retrospective.

(8) Letter from Medical Officer of Health, No. 701c of April 17/19, 1907, re amendments in the conservancy contract, and proposals as regards a three-years' contract.

Resolved that the proposed amendments in the wording of the contract be approved, and that the suggested extension of the term of contract to three years be recommended to Council.

(9) Letter from the Medical Officer of Health, No. 124 of April 18, 1907, re proposed reduction of salary of the four new enteric inspectors.

Resolved that the Medical Officer of Health's suggestion in paragraph four of his letter No. 124 of April 18, 1907, be recommended to Council. (See Annexure A.)

Extract from Minutes of Standing Committee on Municipal Works of April 25, 1907.

(8) Estimate for repairs to Grandpass Police Station, Rs. 138.82.

As there is no probability of the building being required for the road for a year or more the vote is passed.

Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of April 26, 1907.

- (9) Papers re provision for cost of acquisition of land for Base Line road.

Recommended to Council that provision be made in the Supplemental Budget for Rs. 90,000, being cost of acquisition in terms of resolution of Council No. 19 of March 9, 1906.

(17) Application from the Superintendent, Fire Brigade, for an assistant-

The Committee recognizes the early necessity of appointing an assistant to the Superintendent, and recommends the appointment on a salary not exceeding Rs. 3,000. The Committee further recommends that the assistant steam-man, to be hereafter called "Leading fireman," be paid at the rate of Rs. 50, and that a man competent to take the place of the steam-man, when necessary, be appointed to the post.

The difference (Rs. 85) to the end of the current year to be met out of savings under the general vote.

- (18) Application from Sophia Fernando, widow of the late peon Sardial Fernando, for a gratuity for her minor child, a posthumous son of the deceased.
  Approved.
- 19. Application from Mr. W. B. de Saram, Revenue Officer, for a travelling allowance. Recommended a second horse allowance of Rs. 50, the Revenue Officer having now more outdoor work than can be done by one horse.

- (20) Joint application from the Revenue Inspectors for an enhanced conveyance allowance.
  - Recommended, in view of the present pressure of work connected with assessment, an extraricks haw allowance of Rs. 12 50 a month up to the end of the year. Provision to be made in the Supplemental Budget.
- (24) Letter from Medical Officer of Health, No. 610c of April 18, 1907, re over-expenditure in 1906, on vote No. 145 "Miscellaneous" (Rs. 48:15), and vote No. 148 "Cost of Disinfectants" (Rs. 164:68.).

Approved.

(25) To strike off irrecoverable water-rate due on No. 43e, 1st Division, Maradana, for 1st quarter, 1907, as the whereabouts of the debtor is not known, Rs. 4.

May be struck off.

The Chairman moved that Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 2, 3, and 4 on the agenda.

Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.

#### (Council in Committee.)

- 2. Sir Allan Perry moved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of April 24, 1907, be adopted.
  - Dr. C. W. van Geyzel' seconded.—Carried. Mr. Chas. Perera dissenting.
- 3. The Chairman moved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of April 25, 1907, be adopted.
  - Mr. M. F. Khan seconded.—Carried.
- 4. The Chairman moved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of April 26, 1907, be adopted, and that with regard to item No. 17, that a Special Committee of the Council consisting of Mr. Chas. Perera, Mr. C. P. Dias, Mr. A. Fairlie, and the Chairman be appointed to inquire and report as to the manner and extent to which expenditure under this head can be recouped as in other European and Indian towns.
  - Dr. C. W. van Geyzel seconded.-Carried.

With regard to item No. 19 of the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of April 26, 1907, it was resolved that in lieu of a second horse allowance the Revenue Officer be allowed a conveyance allowance of Rs. 30 per mensem.

The Chairman moved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of April 26, 1907, as amended in Committee be adopted.

- Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried. Mr. Chas. Perera dissenting on items 17, 18, 19, and 20.
- The Chairman moved that Council do resume, and that the resolutions passed in Committee be adopted.
- Mr. Chas. Perera seconded.—Carried. Mr. Chas. Perera dissenting as in Committee.
- 5. The Council then proceeded to ballot for the election of two members for the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation, in places of Drs. W. H. de Silva and C. T. Griffin, resigned. The result of the ballot was declared by the Chairman to be in favour of Sir Allan Perry and Mr. James Peiris, who were accordingly elected Members of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation.
  - 6. Memorandum from the Chairman re revision of assessment was laid on the table.
- Mr. Chas. Perera moved that a Special Committee consisting of the Chairman, Mr. C. P. Dias, Mr. H. Tiruvilangam, Mr. L. B. Fernando, and himself be appointed to consider and report on the correctness of the information furnished to the Chairman in the matter.
  - Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

With the permission of Council Mr. Chas. Perera withdrew his motion.

7. The Chairman moved that Council do go into Committee to consider the draft Waterworks Ordinance.

#### (Council in Committee.)

It was resolved that the words "if available in the opinion of the Council" be inserted after the words "quantity of water" in line 4 of section 8 of the draft Ordinance.

The Chairman moved that Council do resume, and that the draft Ordinance as amended be adopted.

Mr. M. F. Khan seconded.-Carried.

8. Papers re appointment of an assistant to the Superintendent, Fire Brigade.

This item was withdrawn as it had been already dealt with.

9. Letter from the Director of the Colombo Museum, No. 190 of April 16, 1907, requesting authority to enclose a small piece of the land behind the Museum to make room for a small animal house sanctioned by Government.

The Chairman moved that permission be granted.

Mr. M. F. Khan seconded.—Carried.

10. Letter from Colonial Secretary, No. 74 of May 1, 1907, re deviation of road at Graving Dock, was laid before the Council.

The Chairman moved that Council approves the line of road shown in green in the Municipal Engineeer's plan dated May 8, 1907, and is prepared to allow the deviation to be made on such line.

Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

11. The following insanitary cesspit privies to be closed, the parties concerned having failed to show adequate cause to the contrary, viz.:—Nos. 11 and 43, Prince street; 29, 2nd Cross street; 9, Maliban street; 3/4, Hulftsdorp; 107, 2nd Division, Maradana; and 23, Mitcho's lane.

The Chairman moved that the recommendations of the Medical Officer of Health be adopted.

Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

12.
