SIR,—I AM directed by the Board of Trade to transmit to you, for the information of the Secretary of State, the accompanying copy of a letter they have received from the Secretary to the Port Adelaide Marine Board respecting the operation of the rules as to marine life-saving appliances. The Merchant Shipping (Life-Saving Appliances) Act, 1888, which provided for the making of the rules in question, contains no limitation as regards the locality within which the rules are to operate. At the same time the Board of Trade do not propose to take steps with regard to the life-saving equipments of vessels leaving ports out of the United Kingdom, but are of opinion that the enforcement or not of the rules in colonies should be left to the discretion of Colonial Authorities. They would consequently suggest, for the consideration of the Secretary of State, that a communication to this effect should be addressed to the various Colonial Governments.

Copies of the Act, of the Rules, and of the Instructions issued thereon by this Department are transmitted herewith.

Life-Saving Appliances for Merchant Ships.

SIR,—REFERRING to an article on the above subject which appears in the *Nautical Magazine* for August, 1889, page 645, I have the honour to inquire whether the regulations therein referred to apply to ships in British Possessions, or whether it is necessary that independent action should be taken in these colonies. In the latter case I shall feel obliged if you will cause me to be furnished with copies of the regulations in question.

CHAPTER 24.

An Act to amend the Law with respect to the Appliances to be carried by British Merchant Ships for saving Life at Sea. [August 10, 1888.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Duty to carry boats and other appliances for saving life.

1 It shall be the duty of the owner and master of every British ship to see that his ship is provided, in accordance with rules under this Act, with such boats, life jackets, and other appliances for saving life at sea as, having regard to the nature of the service on which the ship is employed, and the avoidance of undue encumbrance of the ship's deck, are best adapted for securing the safety of her crew and passengers.

Appointment of consultative committee for framing rules.

2 (1) For the purpose of preparing and advising on rules to be made under this Act, the President of the Board of Trade shall immediately after the passing of this Act, and may from time to time, appoint a committee the members of which shall be nominated by him in accordance with the First Schedule to this Act.

(2) Each member of the committee shall hold office for two years from the date of his appointment, but shall be eligible for re-appointment.

(3) There shall be paid to the members of the committee, out of the Mercantile Marine Fund, such travelling and other allowances as the Board of Trade from time to time may fix.

(4) Her Majesty the Queen may from time to time, by Order in Council, alter the First Schedule to this Act.

Power to make rules as to life-saving appliances.

3 (1) The Board of Trade may from time to time make, rescind, and vary rules with respect to all or any of the matters mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Act.

(2) All rules made under this Act shall have effect as if they had been enacted in this Act, and shall be judicially noticed.

(3) All rules made under this Act shall be laid before Parliament within three weeks after they are made, if Parliament be then sitting, and if Parliament be not sitting, within three weeks after the beginning of the then next meeting of Parliament, and shall not come into operation until they have lain for forty days before both Houses of Parliament during the session of Parliament.

Penalty for breach of rules.

4 (1) In any of the following cases, namely:—

- (a) If any ship required by rules under this Act to be provided with appliances for saving life at sea proceeds on any voyage or excursion without being so provided, in accordance with the rules applicable to the ship; or
- (b) If any of the appliances with which she is so provided are lost or rendered unfit for service in the course of the voyage through the wilful fault, or negligence, of the owner or master; or
- (c) If, in case of any such appliances being lost or injured in the course of the voyage, the master wilfully neglects to replace or repair the same on the first opportunity; or
- (d) If such appliances are not kept so as to be at all times fit and ready for use;

then, if the owner appears to be in fault, he shall incur a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds, and if the master appears to be in fault, he shall incur a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.

17 & 18 Vict. c. 104.

(2) Penalties incurred under this section may be recovered and dealt with in manner provided by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1854, and the Acts amending the same with respect to penalties incurred under those Acts.

Provisions for enforcing rules.

5 In order to enforce compliance with the rules made under this Act, the following steps may be taken, namely:—

- (a) Any surveyor appointed under the Fourth Part of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1854, or any such other person as the Board of Trade may appoint for the purpose, may inspect a ship for the purpose of seeing that the ship is properly provided with appliances for saving life at sea in pursuance of the rules, and shall for that purpose have all the powers given to inspectors by section fourteen of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1854;
- (b) If any such surveyor or person finds that any ship is not so provided, he shall give to the master or owner notice in writing, pointing out the deficiency, and also what is in his opinion requisite to remedy the same;
- (c) Every notice so given shall be communicated, in such manner as the Board of Trade may direct, to the Collector of Customs at any port in which the ship may seek to clear or at which her transire is to be obtained, and a collector to whom any such communication is made shall not clear a ship outwards or grant her a transire, or allow her to proceed to sea, without a certificate under the hand of one of the said surveyors or persons appointed by the Board of Trade as aforesaid, to the effect that the ship is properly provided with appliances for saving life at sea in pursuance of the rules.

Saving as to sea-fishing boats. 31 & 32 Vict. c. 45.

6 The rules made under this Act shall not apply to any sea-fishing boat which is for the time being registered in pursuance of the Sea Fisheries Act, 1868.

Saving as to offences under other laws.

7 (1) Nothing in this Act shall prevent any person from being liable under any other Act, or otherwise, to any other or higher penalty or punishment than is provided for an offence by this Act.

Provided that a person shall not be punished twice for the same offence.

(2) If the court before which a person is charged with an offence punishable by virtue of this Act thinks that proceedings ought to be taken against him for the offence under any other Act or otherwise, the court may adjourn the case to enable such proceedings to be taken.

Repeal.

8 As from the date at which the first rules made under this Act come into operation, the enactments specified in the Third Schedule to this Act shall be repealed to the extent therein mentioned.

Provided that this repeal shall not affect—

- (a) the past operation of any enactment hereby repealed; nor
- (b) anything duly done or suffered thereunder; nor
- (c) any penalty, forfeiture, or punishment incurred in respect of any offence committed against any enactment hereby repealed; nor
- (d) any legal proceeding in respect of any such penalty, forfeiture, or punishment.

Construction of Act.

9 Expressions used in this Act shall have the same meaning as in the Merchant Shipping Act, 1854, and the Acts amending the same.

Short title.

10 This Act may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Life-Saving Appliances) Act, 1888.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Constitution of the Committee.

Section 2.

- (1) Three shipowners selected by the Council of the Chamber of Shipping of the United Kingdom.
- (2) One shipowner selected by the Shipowners' Associations of Glasgow and one shipowner selected by the Liverpool Steamship Owners' Association and the Liverpool Shipowners' Association conjointly.
- (3) Two shipbuilders selected by the Council of the Institution of Naval Architects.
- (4) Three persons practically acquainted with the navigation of vessels selected by the shipmasters' societies recognised by the President of the Board of Trade for this purpose.
- (5) Three persons being or having been able-bodied seamen selected by the seamen's societies recognised by the President of the Board of Trade for this purpose.
- (6) Two persons selected conjointly by the Committee of Lloyd's, the Committee of Lloyd's Register Society, and the Committee of the Institute of London Underwriters.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Matters for which the Rules are to provide.

Section 3.

- (1) The arranging of British ships into classes, having regard to the services in which they are employed, to the nature and duration of the voyage, and to the number of persons carried.
- (2) The number and description of the boats, life-boats, life-rafts, life-jackets, and life-buoys to be carried by British ships, according to the class in which they are arranged, and the mode of their construction; also the equipments to be carried by the boats and rafts, and the methods to be provided to get the boats and other life-saving appliances into the water; such methods may include oil for use in stormy weather.
- (3) The quantity, quality, and description of buoyant apparatus to be carried on board ships carrying passengers, either in addition to or in substitution for boats, life-boats, life-rafts, life-jackets, and life-buoys.

In pursuance of the provisions of the Merchant Shipping (Life-Saving Appliances) Act, 1888, the Board of Trade do hereby make the annexed rules relating to Life-Saving Appliances. These rules shall come into effect on March 31, 1890.

"MERCHANT SHIPPING (LIFE-SAVING APPLIANCES) ACT, 1888."

For the purposes of these rules, British ships shall be arranged into the following classes:—

Class 1.—Division (A.)

Steamships carrying emigrant passengers subject to all the provisions of the "Passengers' Acts."

Class 1.—Division (B.)

Sailing ships carrying emigrant passengers subject to all the provisions of the "Passengers' Acts."

Class 2.—Division (A.)

Foreign-going steamships having passenger certificates under the "Merchant Shipping Acts."

Class 2.—Division (B.)

Foreign-going sailing ships carrying passengers, but *not* subject to all the provisions of the "Passengers' Acts."

Class 3.—Division (A.)

Foreign-going steamships *not* certified to carry passengers.

Class 3.—Division (B.)

Foreign-going sailing ships *not* carrying passengers.

Class 4.—Division (A.)

Steamships having passenger certificates under the "Merchant Shipping Acts" authorising them to carry passengers anywhere within the home trade limits; that is to say, between places in the United Kingdom or between the United Kingdom and ports in Europe between the River Elbe and Brest.

Class 4.—Division (B.)

Steamships in the same trades *not* certified to carry passengers.

Class 4.—Division (C.)

Sailing ships in the same trades *not* carrying passengers.

Class 5.

Steamships having passenger certificates authorising them to carry passengers within certain specified limits of the home trade; that is to say, on short specified passages along the coasts of the United Kingdom or between Great Britain and Ireland, or between Great Britain or Ireland and the Isle of Man.

Class 6.

Steamships carrying passengers on short excursions or pleasure trips, to sea, or in estuaries or mouths of rivers during daylight, or across the Straits of Dover.

Class 7.

Steamships carrying passengers on rivers (and) (or) lakes, but not going to sea or into rough waters.

General rules.

CLASS 1.—DIVISION (A.)

RULES and TABLE for STEAMSHIPS carrying EMIGRANT PASSENGERS subject to all the PROVISIONS of the "PASSENGERS' ACTS."

(a) Ships of this division shall carry boats placed under davits having proper appliances for getting them into the water, in number and capacity not less than are given in the following table; the boats to be equipped and of the description defined in the General Rules appended hereto

(b) Provided that no ship of this division shall be required to carry more boats so placed than will furnish sufficient accommodation for all persons on board.

(c) Masters or owners of ships of this division, claiming to carry fewer boats than are given in the following table must declare before the Collector or other officer of Customs, at the time of clearance, that the boats actually placed under davits are sufficient to accommodate all persons on board, allowing 10 (ten) cubic feet of boat capacity per Rule (2), page 413, for each adult person, or "statute adult."

Note.—Where in vessels already fitted the required cubic contents of boats placed under davits is provided, although by a smaller number of boats than the minimum required by this table, such boats shall be regarded as complying with these rules.

(e) Not less than half the number of boats placed under davits shall be boats of Section (A), page 413, or Section (B), page 413. The remaining boats may also be of such description, or may, in the option of the shipowner, conform to Section (C), page 413, or Section (D), page 413, provided that not more than two boats shall be of Section (D).

(f) If the boats placed under davits in accordance with the foregoing table (d) do not furnish sufficient accommodation for all persons on board, then additional wood, metal, collapsible or other boats of approved description (whether placed under davits or otherwise) or approved life rafts shall be carried.

Subject to the provision contained in paragraph (b) of these rules, such additional boats or rafts shall be of at least such carrying capacity that they and the boats required to be placed under davits by table (d) provide together in the aggregate double the *minimum* cubic contents required by column 3 of that table.

All such additional boats or rafts shall be placed as conveniently for being available as the ship's arrangements admit of, having regard to the avoidance of undue encumbrance of the ship's deck, and to the safety of the ship for her voyage.

(g) When ships are divided into efficient water-tight compartments, so that, with any two of them in free communication with the sea, the ship will remain afloat in moderate weather, they shall only be required to carry additional boats or life-rafts of one-half of the capacity required by paragraph (f) of these rules.

(h) In addition to the life-saving appliances before-mentioned, ships of this Division shall carry not less than one approved life-buoy (Rule 11 (a) or 11 (b), page 414) for every boat placed under davits. They shall also carry approved life-belts (Rule 10, page 414) or other similar approved articles of equal buoyancy suitable for being worn on the person, so that there may be at least one for each person on board the ship.

CLASS 1.—DIVISION (B).

RULES FOR SAILING SHIPS carrying EMIGRANT PASSENGERS subject to all the PROVISIONS of the "PASSENGERS' ACTS."

(a) Ships of this Division shall carry boats in accordance with the table (d) provided for Division A of this class, and such boats shall be, as far as practicable, placed under davits, with proper appliances for getting them into the water, to the satisfaction of the Board of Trade officer; such of these boats as are not placed under davits being so carried that they can also be readily got into the water, to the satisfaction of the Board of Trade officer.

(b) If the boats so carried do not furnish sufficient accommodation for all persons on board, then additional life-saving appliances shall be supplied as for ships in Division (A) of this class.

(c) Provided that no ship in this Division shall be required to carry more boats than will furnish accommodation for all persons on board.

(d) Approved life-belts (Rule 10, page 414) or other similar approved articles shall be carried as required for ships of Class 1, Division (A), and also one life-buoy (Rule 11 (a) or 11 (b), page 414) for each boat of wood or metal.

CLASS 2.—DIVISION (A).

RULES FOR FOREIGN-GOING STEAMSHIPS having PASSENGER CERTIFICATES under the "MERCHANT SHIPPING ACTS."

Ships of this Division shall be subject to the same requirements as those in Class 1, Division (A).

CLASS 2.—DIVISION (B).

RULES FOR FOREIGN-GOING SAILING SHIPS carrying PASSENGERS, but not subject to all the PROVISIONS of the "PASSENGERS' ACTS."

Ships of this Division shall be subject to the same requirements as those in Class 1, Division (B).

CLASS 3.—DIVISION (A).

RULES FOR FOREIGN-GOING STEAMSHIPS not certified to carry PASSENGERS.

(a) Ships of this Division shall carry, on each side, at least so many and such boats of wood or metal placed under davits (of which one on each side shall be a boat of Section (A), page 413, or of Section (B), page 413, that the boats on each side of the ship shall be sufficient to accommodate all persons on board. They shall have proper appliances for getting the boats into the water.

(b) They shall carry approved life-belts as required for ships of Class 1, Division (A).

(c) They shall carry not less than six approved life-buoys (Rule 11 (a) or 11 (b), page 414).

CLASS 3.—DIVISION (B).

RULES FOR FOREIGN-GOING SAILING SHIPS not carrying PASSENGERS.

(a) Ships of this Division shall carry boats in accordance with the table provided for Class 1, Division (B), and in addition thereto one good serviceable boat of Section (D), page 413. Such boats shall be, as far as practicable, placed under davits, with proper appliances for getting them into the water to the satisfaction of the Board of Trade officer; such boats as are not placed under davits being so carried that they also can readily be got into the water to the satisfaction of the Board of Trade officer.

(b) They shall carry approved life-belts as required for ships in Class 1, Division (B); and also one life-buoy (Rule 11 (a) or 11 (b), page 414) for each boat of wood or metal.

CLASS 4.—DIVISION (A).

RULES FOR STEAMSHIPS having PASSENGER CERTIFICATES under the "MERCHANT SHIPPING ACTS" authorising them to carry PASSENGERS anywhere within the HOME TRADE LIMITS; that is to say, between places in the UNITED KINGDOM or between the UNITED KINGDOM and PORTS in EUROPE between the River ELBE and BREST.

(a) Ships of this Division shall carry boats placed under davits in accordance with the rules and table provided for ships in Class 1, Division (A).

(b) If the boats placed under davits in accordance with this requirement do not furnish sufficient accommodation for all persons on board, then additional approved boats or approved life-rafts shall be supplied as for ships of Class 1, Division (A).

(c) Provided that if (having regard to the avoidance of undue incumbrance of the ship's deck, and to the safety of the ship for her voyage) it is not practicable for a ship of this Division to carry additional approved boats or approved life-rafts as are required for ships of Class 1, Division (A) (f), the deficiency so caused may be made up by the supply of an equivalent number of approved buoyant deck seats or other approved buoyant deck fittings to the satisfaction of the Board of Trade officer.

(d) Ships of this Division shall carry not less than six approved life-buoys (Rule 11 (a) or 11 (b), page 414).

(e) They shall also carry, in addition to the boats and appliances required above, approved life-belts (Rule 10, page 414) or other similar approved articles of equal buoyancy suitable for being worn on the person, so that there may be at least one for each person on board the ship.

CLASS 4.—DIVISION (B).

RULES for STEAMSHIPS in the same TRADES not certified to carry PASSENGERS.

(a) Ships of this Division shall carry, on each side, at least so many and such boats of wood or metal placed under davits (of which one on each side shall be a boat of Section (A), page 413, or of Section (B), page 413), that the boats on each side of the ship shall be sufficient to accommodate all persons on board. They shall have proper appliances for getting the boats into the water.

(b) They shall carry approved life-belts as for ships of Class 1, Division (A).

(c) They shall carry not less than four approved life-buoys (Rule 11 (a) or 11 (b), page 414).

CLASS 4.—DIVISION (C).

RULES for SAILING SHIPS in the same TRADES not carrying PASSENGERS.

(a) Ships of this Division shall carry a boat or boats of wood or metal, at least sufficient for all persons on board, and in such a position as to be readily got into the water to the satisfaction of the Board of Trade officer. Each boat shall be provided with one gallon of vegetable or animal oil in a vessel of an approved pattern for distributing it in the water in rough weather.

(b) They shall carry an approved life-belt (Rule 10, page 413) for each person on board.

(c) They shall carry at least two approved life-buoys (Rule 11 (a) or 11 (b), page 414).

CLASS 5.

RULES for STEAMSHIPS having PASSENGER CERTIFICATES authorising them to carry PASSENGERS within certain specified limits of the HOME TRADE; that is to say, on short specified passages along the COASTS of the UNITED KINGDOM, or between GREAT BRITAIN and IRELAND, or between the GREAT BRITAIN or IRELAND and the ISLE of MAN.

(a) Ships of this Division shall, according to their tonnage, carry boats placed under davits, as required by the table for ships in Class 1, Division (A).

(b) If the boats placed under davits in accordance with the above requirements do not furnish sufficient accommodation for all persons on board, then additional boats or approved life-raft shall be supplied as for ships of Class 1, Division (A).

(c) Provided that if (having regard to the avoidance of undue incumbrance of the ship's deck, and to the safety of the ship for her voyage) it is not practicable for a ship of this Division to carry additional approved boats or approved life-rafts as required for ships of Class 1, Division (A), the deficiency so caused may be made up by the supply of an equivalent number of approved buoyant deck seats or other approved buoyant deck-fittings to the satisfaction of the Board of Trade officer.

(d) Ships of this Division shall also carry approved life-belts (Rule 10, page 414) or other similar approved articles of equal buoyancy suitable for being worn on the person, so that there may be at least one for each person on board the ship.

(e) At least one approved life-buoy (Rule 11 (a) or 11 (b), page 414) shall also be provided for each boat of wood or metal carried by the ship, but in no case shall less than six approved life-buoys be provided.

CLASS 6.

RULES for STEAMSHIPS carrying PASSENGERS on short EXCURSIONS or PLEASURE TRIPS to SEA, or in ESTUARIES, or MOUTHS of RIVERS during DAYLIGHT, or across the STRAITS of DOVER.

(a) Ships of this class shall carry at least two boats of Section (A), page 413, or Section (B), page 413, placed under davits, and with proper appliances for getting them into the water.

(b) They shall also carry other boats, approved buoyant apparatus (Rule 9, page 414) [and] [or] approved life-belts (Rule 10, page 414) sufficient (with the boats) to keep afloat all the persons on board the ship.

(c) At least four approved life-buoys (Rule 11 (a) or 11 (b), page 414) shall be carried.

CLASS 7:

RULES for STEAMSHIPS carrying PASSENGERS on RIVERS [and] [or] LAKES, but not going to SEA, or into ROUGH WATERS.

(a) Ships of this class shall carry one boat in such a position that she can readily be got into the water. They shall also carry approved buoyant apparatus (Rule 9, page 414) or approved life-belts (Rule 10, page 414) and approved life-buoys (Rule 11, page 414) at least sufficient, together with the boat to keep afloat all persons carried on board.

(b) At least four approved life-buoys shall be carried.

NOTE.—A discretion to be exercised by the Board of Trade Officer to relieve ferry boats in narrow waters from the operation of Rule (a) of this class.

GENERAL RULES.

(1.) Boats. NOTE.—All boats shall be properly equipped as provided by these rules.

Section (A).—A boat of this section shall be a life-boat properly constructed of wood or metal, having for every 10 cubic feet of her capacity computed as in (2) at least $1\frac{1}{2}$ cubic feet of strong and serviceable inclosed air-tight compartments, such that water cannot find its way into them.

Section (B).—A boat of this section shall be a life-boat properly constructed of wood or metal, having inside and outside buoyancy apparatus together equal in efficiency to the buoyancy apparatus provided for a boat of Section (A). At least one-half of the buoyancy apparatus must be attached to the outside of the boat.

Section (C).—A boat of this section shall be a life-boat properly constructed of wood or metal, having some buoyancy apparatus attached to the inside [and] [or] outside of the boat equal in efficiency to one-half of the buoyancy apparatus provided for a boat of Section (A) or Section (B). At least one-half of the buoyancy apparatus must be attached to the outside of the boat.

Section (D).—A boat of this section shall be a properly constructed boat of wood or metal.

Section (E).—A boat of this section shall be a boat of approved form and material, which may be collapsible.

(2.) *Cubic Capacity.*—The cubic capacity of a boat shall be deemed to be her cubic capacity, ascertained (as in measuring ships for tonnage capacity) by Stirling's rule; but as the application of that rule entails much labour, the following simple plan, which is approximately accurate, may be adopted for general purposes, and when no question requiring absolutely correct adjustment is raised:—

Measure the length and breadth outside and the depth inside. Multiply them together and by '6'; the product is the capacity of the boat in cubic feet. Thus, a boat 28 ft. long, 8 ft. 6 in. broad, and 3 ft. 6 in. deep, will be regarded as having a capacity of $28 \times 8.5 \times 3.5 \times 6 = 499.8$, or 500 cubic feet. If the oars are pulled in rowlocks, the bottom of the rowlock is to be considered the gunwale of the boat for ascertaining her depth.

(3) *Number of Persons for Boats of Section (A).*—The number of persons a boat of Section (A) shall be deemed fit to carry shall be the number of cubic feet ascertained as in (2) divided by 10. Thus a boat, whose cubic contents are 500 cubic feet, is deemed to be sufficient for 50 adult persons. The space in the boat shall be sufficient for the seating of the persons carried in it, and for the proper use of the oars.

(4) *Number of Persons for other Boats.*—The number of persons a boat of Section (B), (C), (D), or (E), shall be deemed fit to carry shall be the number of cubic feet ascertained as in (2) divided by eight.

(5) *Appliances for Lowering Boats.*—Appliances for getting a boat into the water must fulfil the following conditions:—Means are to be provided for speedily detaching the boats from the lower blocks of the davit tackles; the boats placed under davits are to be attached to the davit tackles and kept ready for service at any moment; the davits are to be strong enough and so spaced that the boats can be swung out with facility; the points of attachment of the boats to the davits are to be sufficiently away from the ends of the boats to ensure their being easily swung clear of the davits; the boats' chocks are to be such as can be expeditiously removed; the davits, falls, blocks, eye-bolts, rings, and the whole of the tackling are to be of sufficient strength; the boat's falls are to be long enough to lower the boat into the water with safety when the vessel is light; the life-lines fitted to the davits are to be long enough to reach the water when the vessel is light; and hooks are not to be attached to the lower tackle blocks.

(6) *Equipments for Collapsible or other Boats and for Life-rafts.*—In order to be properly equipped each boat shall be provided as follows:—

- (a) With the full [single-banked] complement of oars, and two spare oars.
- (b) With two plugs for each plug-hole, attached with lanyards or chains, and one set and a half of thole pins or crutches, attached to the boat by sound lanyards.
- (c) With a sea anchor, a baler, a rudder, and tiller, or yoke and yoke lines, a painter of sufficient length, and a boat-hook. The rudder and baler to be attached to the boat by sufficiently long lanyards, and kept ready for use.
- (d) A vessel to be kept filled with fresh water shall be provided for each boat.
- (e) Life-rafts shall be fully provided with a suitable equipment.

(7) *Additional Equipments for Boats of Section (A) and Section (B).*—In order to be properly equipped, each boat of sections (A) and (B), in addition to being provided with all the requisites laid down in (6), shall be equipped as follows [but not more than four boats in any one ship require to have this outfit]:—

- (a) With two hatchets or tomahawks, one to be kept in each end of the boat, and to be attached to the boat by a lanyard.
- (b) With a mast or masts, and with at least one good sail, and proper gear for each.
- (c) With a life-line, in loops run round the outside of the boat and securely made fast.
- (d) With an efficient compass.
- (e) With one gallon of vegetable or animal oil, in a vessel of an approved pattern, for distributing it in the water in rough weather.
- (f) With a lantern trimmed, with oil in its receiver sufficient to burn eight hours.

(8) *Number of Persons for Life-Rafts.*—The number of persons that any approved life-raft for use at sea shall be deemed to be capable of carrying, shall be determined with reference to each separate pattern approved by the Board of Trade; provided always, that for every person so carried there shall be at least three cubic feet of strong and serviceable inclosed air-tight compartments, such that water cannot find its way into them. Any approved life-raft of other construction may be used, provided that it has equivalent buoyancy to that hereinbefore described. Every such approved life-raft shall be marked in such a way as to plainly indicate the number of adult persons it can carry.

(9) *Buoyant Apparatus.*—Approved buoyant apparatus shall be deemed sufficient for a number of persons, to be ascertained by dividing the number of pounds of iron which it is capable of supporting in fresh water by 32. Such buoyant apparatus shall not require to be inflated before use, shall be of approved construction, and marked in such a way as plainly to indicate the number of persons for whom it is sufficient.

(10) *Life-Belts.*—An approved life-belt shall mean a belt which does not require to be inflated before use, and which is capable at least of floating in the water for 2½ hours with 10 lb. of iron suspended from it.

(11) *Life-Buoys.*—An approved life-buoy shall mean either—

(a) A life-buoy built of solid cork, and fitted with life-lines and loops, securely seized to the life-buoy, and capable of floating in the water for at least 24 hours with 32 lb. of iron suspended from it; or

(b) A strong life-buoy of any other approved pattern and material, provided that it is capable of floating in the water for at least 24 hours with 32 lb. of iron suspended from it, and provided also that it is not stuffed with rushes, cork shavings, or other shavings, or loose granulated cork, or other loose material, and does not require inflation before use.

(12) *Position of Life-Belts and Life-Buoys.*—All life-buoys and life-belts shall be so placed as to be readily accessible to the persons on board, and so that their position may be known to those for whom they are intended.

Instructions to Surveyors.

Merchant Shipping Life-Saving Appliances Act, 1888.

A copy of the above Act, and of the rules made under it, accompany these instructions. The rules will come into force on March 31, 1890, and from that date, sections 292, 293, and 294 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1854, except as regards sea-fishing boats registered under the Sea Fisheries Act, 1868; section 27 of the Passengers' Act, 1855, so far as it relates to boats; and section 15 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1873, will be repealed. From the same date the regulations issued by the Board of Trade under those sections, and at present contained in paragraphs 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 32, 33, and 34 of the Instructions to Surveyors of Passenger Steamships will therefore be cancelled.

In carrying the new rules into effect, it will be the duty of the surveyors to see that the life-saving appliances provided are in complete accordance with the requirements for the classes of vessels specified therein; and in every case in which it is found that such requirements are not complied with, to serve the master or owner with a notice, Form Surveys 111, specifying the deficiency, and the requisites necessary to remedy the same. A copy of the notice should at the same time be sent to the Collector of Customs at the port at which the ship may seek to clear, or at which her transire is to be obtained, together with a request for her detention in the terms provided for in Form Surveys 112. A second copy of the notice should at the same time be transmitted to the Board of Trade.

As soon as the deficiency specified in Form Surveys 111 has been supplied, a certificate to that effect, on Form Surveys 113, should be given to the master or owner by the surveyor. A copy of the certificate should at the same time be sent to the Collector of Customs, together with a request for the release of the vessel on Form Surveys 114.

If at any time it comes to the knowledge of the surveyors that a ship has proceeded on any voyage or excursion without being provided with life-saving appliances as required by the rules, or that any other of the provisions of section 4 of the Act have not been complied with, the case should be at once reported, with as full particulars as possible, to the Board of Trade.

It will be the duty of the surveyors to make themselves thoroughly acquainted with the Act and the rules, and to allow no departure from them without the express consent of the Board of Trade. As it is possible that doubts may arise with respect to the interpretation of paragraph (f, Division A); the Board desire specially to call attention to the following observations. No vessel should be required to carry more boats, whether under davits or otherwise, than will accommodate all the persons on board, and if she carries sufficient boats under davits to do this, the requirements of paragraph (f) are to be regarded as complied with; but if in any case the total capacity of such boats is not sufficient for this purpose, there must be provided such additional boats or rafts as shall, together with those placed under davits (table d), amount in the aggregate to double the cubic contents required by column 8 of that table; so, however, that the entire boat capacity need not in any case be in excess of what is required to furnish sufficient accommodation for all persons on board (paragraph b):

It will be observed that, by General Rule Number 8, the carrying capacity of life rafts is to be estimated at the rate of one person per three cubic feet of strong and serviceable inclosed air-tight compartment, and the surveyors will therefore be guided by this rule in computing the life-raft accommodation required under the preceding paragraph.

In all cases in which claims are made for the exemption allowed under paragraph (g) for vessels which are divided into efficient water-tight compartments, the surveyors should report full particulars to the Board of Trade, and state whether in their opinion the bulkheads, and the arrangements for promptly closing any openings therein, are efficient and satisfactory.

As regards the boats of sections A, B, C, and D, General Rule No. 1, the surveyors will see that the requirements of the rules are observed, and that the capacity of the boats,

Exemptions for
bulk-heads.

and the number of persons they are fit to carry, are ascertained by the General Rules numbers 2, 3, and 4. In the case of boats constructed of any material other than wood or metal, whether collapsible or otherwise, the pattern must be approved by the Board of Trade before they are passed as a portion of the life-saving appliances required by the rules.

Life-buoys.

Life-buoys may be passed by the surveyors, provided they are made of solid cork, and fitted as described in, and will support the weight specified in General Rule Number 11 (a); but if they are made of any other material, they must be of a pattern and material approved by the Board of Trade.

Life-belts.

Life-belts must comply with the requirements of the rules as to buoyancy. If made of solid cork they may be passed by the surveyors, but if of other material the pattern and material must be specially approved by the Board of Trade.

It will be noticed that vessels to be used for the distribution of oil in the water are to be of patterns approved by the Board of Trade.

Approval of life-saving appliances by Board of Trade.

With regard to the boats, life-rafts, buoyant apparatus, &c., which are to be specially approved by the Board of Trade before they are accepted as a portion of the life-saving appliances required by the rules, the following course is to be observed. In every case the application for approval must be made by a shipowner who proposes to carry the particular appliance on board his ship if approved, and the Board must decline to examine, test, or express any opinion whatever upon any appliance except on this condition. The application must be accompanied by full descriptive particulars, with drawings or plans to scale in triplicate, and a statement that the articles are constructed in accordance with the requirements of the rules with regard to buoyancy, &c. The applicant should also specify at what port the appliances can be inspected by the Board's surveyors, and the place at which they can be practically tested, if necessary. He must further undertake that any trials which may be deemed necessary shall be made, free of any expense to the Board of Trade. The application will, in due course, be referred, together with the drawings or plans, to the principal officer for the district in which the apparatus is to be inspected; who will instruct the surveyors to make the necessary examination, and to witness the test if a practical trial is deemed advisable. The surveyors will carefully examine the drawings or plans submitted, and satisfy themselves that they are accurate, and that they contain sufficient details for the identification of the apparatus. The surveyors should then report the result of their inspection to the principal officer, who will transmit the report, together with the drawings or plans and descriptive particulars, to the Board of Trade for consideration.

Arrangements will be made for the registration of all approved designs, and in each case in which a design is so registered, a formal but tentative certificate of approval will be issued, copies of which will be supplied to those interested. Copies of the certificates of approval issued will be sent to the principal officers, in order that the appliances therein referred to may, so long as approved by the Board of Trade, be passed by the surveyors at all ports when supplied for use on board ship.

Applications for the approval of appliances should, in all cases, be made sufficiently early to afford ample time for their examination and trial, and in the case of appliances which are intended to be supplied for use on April 1, 1890, the application should, if possible, be submitted not later than December 31, 1889.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873, it was amongst other things enacted

that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of Her Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient; and that if, by any law made after the passing of the Act of 1870 by the Legislature of any British possession, provision is made for carrying into effect within such possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in such British possession, Her Majesty may, by the Order in Council applying the said Acts in the case of any foreign State, or by any subsequent Order, suspend the operation within any such British possession of the said Acts, or of any part thereof, so far as it relates to such foreign State, and so long as such law continues in force there and no longer:

An whereas by an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in 1886, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," provision is made for carrying into effect within the Dominion the surrender of fugitive criminals:

And whereas by an order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, dated November 17, 1888, it was directed that the operation of the Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873, should be suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as the provisions of the said Act of the Parliament of Canada of 1886 should continue in force and no longer:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the twenty-seventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, between Her Majesty and the President of the Republic of Colombia, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and His Excellency the President of the Republic of Colombia having judged it expedient, with a view to the better administration of justice and the prevention of crime within the two countries and their jurisdictions, that persons charged with or convicted of the crimes or offences hereinafter enumerated, and being fugitives from justice, should, under certain circumstances, be reciprocally delivered up, have named as their Plenipotentiaries to conclude a treaty, that is to say:

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, William John Dickson, Esquire, Her Minister Resident to the Republic of Colombia; and

His Excellency the President of the Republic of Colombia, Vicente Restrepo, Minister for Foreign Affairs of the said Republic;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:—

ARTICLE I.

The high contracting parties engage to deliver up to each other, under the circumstances and conditions stated in the present treaty, those persons who, being accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences enumerated in Article II., committed in the territory of the one party shall be found within the territory of the other party.

ARTICLE II.

Extradition shall be reciprocally granted for the following crimes or offences:—

1. Murder (including assassination, parricide, infanticide, poisoning), or attempt or conspiracy to murder.
2. Manslaughter.
3. Administering drugs or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of women.
4. Rape.
5. Unlawful carnal knowledge, or any attempt to have unlawful carnal knowledge, of a girl under 16 years of age, if the evidence produced justifies committal for those crimes according to the laws of both the contracting parties.
6. Indecent assault.
7. Kidnapping and false imprisonment, child-stealing.
8. Abduction.
9. Bigamy.
10. Maliciously wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.
11. Assault occasioning actual bodily harm.

12. Threats, by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort money or other things of value.

13. Perjury or subornation of perjury.

14. Arson.

15. Burglary or house-breaking, robbery with violence, larceny, or embezzlement.

16. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, director, member, or public officer of any company, made criminal by any law for the time being in force.

17. Obtaining money, valuable security, or goods by false pretences; receiving any money, valuable security, or other property knowing the same to have been stolen or unlawfully obtained.

18.—(a) Counterfeiting or altering money, or bringing into circulation counterfeited or altered money.

(b) Forgery, or counterfeiting or altering, or uttering what is forged, counterfeited, or altered.

(c) Knowingly making, without lawful authority, any instrument, tool, or engine adapted and intended for the counterfeiting of coin, or forgery of any paper money of the respective countries.

19. Crimes against bankruptcy law.

20. Any malicious act, done with intent to endanger the safety of any person travelling or being upon a railway.

21. Malicious injury to property, if such offence be indictable.

22. Crimes committed at sea:—

(a) Piracy by the law of nations.

(b) Sinking or destroying a vessel at sea, or attempting or conspiring to do so.

(c) Revolt, or conspiracy to revolt, by two or more persons on board a ship on the high seas against the authority of the master.

(d) Assault on board a ship on the high seas with intent to destroy life or to do grievous bodily harm.

23. Dealing in slaves in such manner as to constitute a criminal offence against the laws of both States.

The extradition is also to be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes, provided such participation be punishable by the laws of both contracting parties:

Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the State applied to in respect of any other crime for which, according to the laws of both the contracting parties for the time being in force, the grant can be made.

ARTICLE III.

Either Government may, in its absolute discretion, refuse to deliver up its own subjects to the other Government.

ARTICLE IV.

The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed on the part of Her Majesty's Government, or the person claimed on the part of the Government of Colombia, has already been tried and discharged, or punished, or is still under trial in the territory of Colombia or in the United Kingdom respectively, for the crime for which his extradition is demanded.

If the person claimed on the part of Her Majesty's Government, or on the part of the Government of Colombia, should be under examination for any other crime in the territory of Colombia or in the United Kingdom respectively, his extradition shall be deferred until the conclusion of the trial and the full execution of any punishment awarded to him.

ARTICLE V.

The extradition shall not take place if, subsequently to the commission of the crime, or the institution of the penal prosecution or the conviction thereon,

exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the State applied to.

ARTICLE VI.

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he prove that the requisition for his surrender has, in fact, been made with a view to try or punish him for an offence of a political character.

ARTICLE VII.

A person surrendered, can in no case be kept in prison, or be brought to trial, in the State to which the surrender has been made, for any other crime, or on account of any other matters, than those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has been restored, or has had an opportunity of returning, to the State by which he has been surrendered.

This stipulation does not apply to crimes committed after the extradition.

ARTICLE VIII.

The requisition for extradition shall be made through the diplomatic agents of the high contracting parties respectively.

The requisition for the extradition of an accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime had been committed there.

If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by the sentence of condemnation passed against the convicted person by the competent court of the State that makes the requisition for extradition.

A sentence passed in *contumaciam* is not to be deemed a conviction, but a person so sentenced may be dealt with as an accused person.

ARTICLE IX.

If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive.

ARTICLE X.

A fugitive criminal may be apprehended, under a warrant issued by any Police Magistrate, Justice of the Peace, or other competent authority in either country, on such information or complaint, and such evidence, or after such proceedings as would, in the opinion of the authority issuing the warrant, justify the issue of a warrant if the crime had been committed, or the person convicted, in that part of the dominions of the two contracting parties in which the Magistrate, Justice of the Peace, or other competent authority exercises jurisdiction; provided, however, that in the United Kingdom the accused shall, in such case, be sent as speedily as possible before a Police Magistrate in London. He shall, in accordance with this Article, be discharged, as well in Colombia as in the United Kingdom, if, within the term of thirty days a requisition for extradition shall not have been made by the diplomatic agent of his country, in accordance with the stipulations of this treaty.

The same rule shall apply to the cases of persons accused or convicted of any of the crimes, or offences specified in this treaty, and committed on the high

seas on board any vessel of either country which may come into a port of the other.

ARTICLE XI.

The extradition shall take place only if the evidence be found sufficient according to the laws of the State applied to, either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime had been committed in the territory of the same State, or to prove that the prisoner is the identical person convicted by the courts of the State which makes the requisition, and that the crime of which he has been convicted is one in respect of which extradition could, at the time of such conviction, have been granted by the State applied to; and no criminal shall be surrendered until after the expiration of fifteen days from the date of his committal to prison to await the warrant for his surrender.

ARTICLE XII.

In the examinations which they have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the authorities of the State applied to shall admit as valid evidence the sworn depositions or statements of witnesses taken in the other State, or copies thereof, and likewise the warrants and sentences issued therein, and certificates of, or judicial documents stating, the fact of a conviction, provided the same are authenticated as follows:—

1. A warrant must purport to be signed by a Judge, Magistrate, or officer of the other State.

2. Depositions or affirmations, or the copies thereof, must purport to be certified under the hand of a Judge, Magistrate, or officer of the other State, to be the original depositions or affirmations, or to be true copies thereof, as the case may require.

3. A certificate of, or judicial document stating, the fact of a conviction must purport to be certified by a Judge, Magistrate, or officer of the other State.

4. In every case, such warrant, deposition, affirmation, copy, certificate, or judicial document must be authenticated either by the oath of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal of the Minister of Justice, or some other Minister of the other State; but any other mode of authentication for the time being permitted by law where the examination is taken may be substituted for the foregoing.

ARTICLE XIII.

If the individual claimed by one of the two high contracting parties in pursuance of the present treaty should be also claimed by one or several other powers, on account of other crimes or offences committed upon their respective territories, his extradition shall be granted to that State whose demand is earliest in date.

ARTICLE XIV.

If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within two months from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive, or within such further time as the State applied to, or the proper tribunal thereof, shall direct, the fugitive shall be set at liberty.

ARTICLE XV.

All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered at the time of his apprehension shall, if the competent authority of the State applied to for the extradition has ordered the delivery of such articles, be given up when the extradition takes place; and the said delivery shall extend not merely to the stolen articles, but to everything that may serve as a proof of the crime.

ARTICLE XVI.

All expenses connected with extradition shall be borne by the demanding State.

ARTICLE XVII.

The stipulations of the present treaty shall be applicable to the Colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, so far as the laws for the time being in force in such Colonies and foreign possessions respectively will allow.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal who has taken refuge in any of such Colonies or foreign possessions shall be made to the Governor or chief authority of such Colony or possession by the chief consular officer of the Republic of Colombia in such Colony or possession.

Such requisition may be disposed of, subject always, as nearly as may be, and so far as the law of such Colony or foreign possession will allow, to the provisions of this treaty, by the said Governor or chief authority, who, however, shall be at liberty either to grant the surrender or to refer the matter to his Government.

Her Britannic Majesty shall, however, be at liberty to make special arrangements in the British Colonies and foreign possessions for the surrender of Colombian criminals who may take refuge within such Colonies and foreign possessions, on the basis, as nearly as may be, and so far as the law of such Colony or foreign possession will allow, of the provisions of the present treaty.

Requisitions for the surrender of a fugitive criminal emanating from any Colony or foreign possession of Her Britannic Majesty shall be governed by the rules laid down in the preceding articles of the present treaty.

ARTICLE XVIII.

The present treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the high contracting parties. It may be terminated by either of the high contracting parties by a notice not exceeding one year and not less than six months.

The treaty, after receiving the approval of the Congress of Colombia, shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Bogota as soon as possible.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto their respective seals.

Done at Bogota, this twenty-seventh day of October, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

Now therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to her by the said recite Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the sixteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, the said Acts shall apply in the case of Colombia, and of the said treaty with the President of the Republic of Colombia:

Provided always, and it is hereby further ordered, that the operation of the said Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873, shall be suspended within the dominion of Canada so far as relates to the Republic of Colombia and to the said treaty, and so long as the provisions of the Canadian Act aforesaid of 1886 continue in force, and no longer.
