Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Municipal Office on Friday, January 12, 1906.

THE Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated January 6, 1905.

Present .-- Mr. E. M. de C. Short, Chairman; Mr. Chas. Perera; Mr. C. P. Dias; Sir Allan Perry. Kt.; Mr. James Peiris; Mr. M. L. M. Zainudeen; Dr. C. W. van Geyzel; Dr. W. H. de Silva; Mr. F. C. Allen; Mr. H. Tiruvilangam; Mr. P. D. Warren; Mr. M. F. Khan; and Mr. L. B. Fernando.

The Chairman, with the permission of Council, moved-That an expression of the Council's appreciation of the services of Dr. Solomon Fernando during the last nine years and of regret at the loss of his services, be entered in the Minutes.

Mr. James Peiris seconded.-Carried.


