GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

THE following by-law made by the Municipal Council, Colombo, under the provisions of Ordinance No. 8 of 1901, has been confirmed by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and is hereby published for general information.

This by-law should be read with those published in the Government Gazette on December 31, 1897.

By-law relating to the Removal and Disposal of Night Soil.

(10)a On the application of any person employing the services of a Municipal Officer for the removal of night soil, the services of a day cooly or a special cooly will be given.

The services of the day cooly will be as follows :—

He will be required to attend at the premises of the householder and perform the work specified for about 15 minutes per diem.

He must empty all chamber vessels, and the contents of smaller buckets, &c., into a regulation bucket or other bucket of no larger size than a regulation bucket provided by the householder for the purpose, (b) clean, disinfect (if disinfectants are provided by the householder) and replace them in their proper positions, (c) place the regulation bucket so filled in a convenient and secluded place (this spot must be first agreed upon with the householder) appointed for the purpose so as to be easy of access to the night cooly, (d) fill up all coir dust receptacles with coir dust from the supply delivered by the night cooly, (e) sweep, clean, or flush closets or compartments.

The services of a special cooly will be as follows :—

His services shall be at the entire disposal of such applicant for a period of eight hours per day. This cooly will [have to] be at his work and leave at a given time to be arranged with the applicant, and will devote the whole of that time to cleansing and keeping latrines and closets clean, and attending to all work in connection with the latrines on such premises.

The rates of payment to the said Municipal Council by any such person employing the services of a day or special cooly shall be as follows :—

For a day cooly at the rate of one rupee for every month or fraction of a month.

For a special cooly at the rate of fifteen rupees for every month or fraction of a month.

All such payments shall be made in advance, and every person who has become liable to the payments mentioned in this by-law shall continue to be so liable until he gives notice in writing to the Chairman of the Council that he wishes the services of the day or special cooly to be discontinued together with the date from which he wishes such services to be discontinued.

All sums payable under this by-law if not paid on or before the 10th day of the month in respect of which or of any part of which it is due, or in the case of a first application as soon as notice is given of the commencement of the service of the day or special cooly shall be recoverable as hereinafter provided.

ඉල්ලා ගන්නා ලද අගයෙන් සම්පූර්ණ කැමැත්ත හැරීමට එබඳු කුලියාරයෙක් දවසකට පැ 8ක් වැඩකරණට මිනුය. මහ ඉල්ලාගන්නා අග සහ පාලනකරයන් පරිද්දෙන නිමව වේලාවට වැඩට පැමිණ නිමව වේලාවට එයින් නිදහස්ව ගන්නට මිනුය. මෙම සම්පූර්ණ කාලය තුරම මහ වැසිතිලි සුබකර පිරිසිදුව තබාගැනීම සහ එම ස්ථානයේ ස්වයං වැසිතිලි සම්බන්ධ සියළුම වැඩ කරණට මිනුය.

WHEREAS by section 10 of "The Tolls Ordinance, 1896," it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor may, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, by resolution to be notified in the *Government Gazette*, determine at what places tolls shall be collected, and alter such places and other places appoint for the collection thereof :

And whereas it is expedient to determine the place at which the toll in respect of the bridge over the Ritigaha-oya at Mudamana, in the District of Kegalla, shall be collected : It is hereby notified that the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has by a resolution dated the 17th October, 1902, determined that such toll shall, from and after the First day of January, 1903, be collected at a place not more than 225 yards from the eastern end of the aforesaid bridge on the eastern side thereof, and not more than 300 yards from the western end of the bridge on the western side thereof.

By-laws referred to.

1. It shall be lawful for the Government Agent, or any person authorized in writing by him for the purpose, to visit and inspect at any time any burial or cremation ground, and all books or documents relating thereto.
2. No grave shall be less than 5 feet in depth or at a less distance than 4 feet from another.
3. No grave shall be re-opened within three years, nor vault within six months, from the last interment therein, except upon orders from a competent authority.
4. The ashes and remains at the spot where any cremation has taken place shall be buried within three days of the cremation at a depth of not less than 3 feet.
5. A table of fees for burial and cremation shall be submitted by the keeper of every burial and cremation ground for the approval of the Government Agent, and only such fees as are approved by the said Government Agent shall be charged.
6. No burial or cremation shall take place in a registered burial or cremation ground without the permission of the keeper of the said ground, who will be held responsible for the due observance of these by-laws.
7. Any person applying to have a burial or cremation in a registered burial or cremation ground shall be bound to obey the lawful orders of the keeper of the said ground.
8. Any person entitled to the possession of a burial or cremation ground, within the limits of the Board of Health town of Bandarawela, shall apply in writing to the Government Agent to have the same registered as such, stating the name of the keeper of the ground and annexing to his application a figure of survey of the premises certified by the Surveyor-General or a duly licensed surveyor. And the person named as keeper in such application shall subscribe the same in acknowledgment of his acceptance of the office and duties of such keeper.
9. If no keeper be named, or if the keeper so named shall not have signed the application in manner aforesaid, then the person who shall have made the application for the registration of a burial or cremation ground shall be held to be the keeper of the ground, and shall be responsible for any breach of by-laws in respect thereto.
10. In the event of the death, or inability from any cause to fulfil his duties, of the keeper of a burial or cremation ground, application to have the same registered shall be made as provided in by-law 8 aforesaid, and no burial or cremation shall take place in such ground until registration on such application has been effected, except on the special license of the Government Agent.
11. It shall be the duty of the keeper of every burial or cremation ground within the limits of the Board of Health town of Bandarawela, to keep a register of all burials or cremations carried out on the premises of which he is the keeper, in the form prescribed by the Government Agent, and to cause to be delivered a copy of this register to the office of the Government Agent not more than twenty-four hours after a burial or cremation shall have taken place therein.
12. It shall be the duty of every keeper of a burial or cremation ground to keep the same clean and in good order to the satisfaction of the Government Agent.
13. Every burial or cremation ground shall be enclosed by a substantial wall or fence approved by the Government Agent.
14. If the keeper of a registered burial or cremation ground is unable from any cause to perform his duties, or, if he cannot be found at the time when his services are required, the Government Agent may authorize any fit and proper person to perform any of the duties which by these rules are assigned to keepers of registered burial or cremation grounds.
15. Any person who is aggrieved by any order given by the keeper of a registered burial ground, or by any act or omission on his part, may complain to the Government Agent, and the Government Agent shall give such orders as may be necessary to secure the proper observance of these rules.

THE following regulation made by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in them by section 7 of "The Explosives Ordinance, 1902," relating to the storage of explosives, are hereby published for general information.

Draft Regulation.

Buildings and works, called in the regulation under the above-mentioned Ordinance, published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* of June 20, 1902, "Protected Works" from which stores for explosives are to be separated, shall be classified as follows:—

"Protected Work of Class I." means any dwelling-house, shop, room (whether or not used for the filling of cartridges for small-arms with explosive), workshop (whether or not used for the adaptation or preparation of explosive), mineral or private railway (whether worked by steam or otherwise), magazine for explosive, store for explosive, premises registered for the keeping of explosive, and any furnace, kiln, or fire for the use of any boiler, engine, or machine, or manufacturing purpose, if such house, shop, room, workshop, railway, magazine, store, registered premises, or the premises on which such furnace, kiln, or fire is situated, be occupied by the licensee, or if the occupier thereof gives his consent in writing to the same being considered as included in protected works of Class I.; and also any highway, public footpath, promenade, or open place of resort for the public, or for persons carrying on any trade or business, and any canal, navigable water, dock, river wall, sea wall, pier, jetty, or reservoir.

"Protected Work of Class II." means any dwelling-house, shop, room (whether or not used for the filling of cartridges for small-arms with explosive), workshop (whether or not used for the adaptation or preparation of explosive), railway (whether worked by steam or otherwise), magazine for explosive, store for explosive, premises registered for the keeping of explosive, and any furnace, kiln, or fire for the use of any boiler, engine, or machine, or for any manufacturing purpose, which is or are not included in protected works of Class I. or Class III.; and any factory not included in protected works of Class III., any Church, Chapel, University, College, School, Hospital, Public Institution, Town Hall, Court of Justice, Theatre, covered market, buildings wherein persons are accustomed to assemble or public buildings in charge of the Commissioners of His Majesty's works, and public buildings.

"Protected Work of Class III." means any factory or magazine occupied by a Department of the Government, unless the Government consent in writing to such factory or magazine being included in protected works of Class II.

THE following by-laws framed by the Government Agent of the Western Province, under section 38 of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," and confirmed by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, are published for general information.

By-laws for the Regulation of Burial and Cremation Grounds in the Western Province.

1. The following by-laws have been passed under the provisions of section 38 of Ordinance No. 9 of 1899 for the regulation of burial and cremation grounds in the Western Province, and shall be in force throughout the Province, except in Municipal towns and Local Board towns.

2. Every burial ground shall be in charge of the Police Vidane of the village in which it is situated. Every Police Vidane in charge of a burial ground shall keep a register of all burials or cremations in it in the form A. Such register shall be forwarded to the proper authority at the end of each quarter, namely, March 31, June 30, September 30, and December 31, in each year.

3. No burial or cremation shall take place without a written permit, in form B, from the Police Vidane of the village in which the death has taken place, or, in his absence, from the Police Vidane of the adjoining village.

4. No grave shall be less than 5 feet in depth or at a distance of less than 4 feet from another. No grave shall be re-opened within three years of the date of the last interment therein, except on an order made by a court of competent jurisdiction.

5. Should it be necessary, for the purpose of preventing the disturbance of one funeral party by another, and not otherwise, the Police Vidane in charge of a burial ground may require that one burial or cremation shall be concluded before the other commences, and the Police Vidane shall have power to keep order within the burial ground, and his orders shall be obeyed by all concerned.

6. When the deceased leaves no relatives and friends, the Police Vidane shall cause a grave to be dug and the corpse to be buried.

7. The Police Vidane in charge of a burial ground shall, on being so ordered by the proper authority, enclose the burial ground in his charge with a wall or live fence, and make such roads or paths to, and within, the burial ground, as the proper authority may deem necessary. He shall also keep the burial ground in his charge free of jungle and under-wood.

8. For the purposes mentioned in the last preceding by-law, the Police Vidane in charge of a burial ground shall be furnished by the Village Committee within the division in which the burial ground is situate with free labour under the rules framed under section 6 (1) of Ordinance No. 24 of 1889, and with such funds as may be necessary.

9. No vaults or tombstones shall be erected without the previous sanction of the proper authority.

10. The Mudaliyar of each korale shall, on or before April 30, August 31, and December 31, in each year, inspect all burial grounds situated within the korale, and shall forward a report within fifteen days after each inspection, to the proper authority regarding their condition and requirements.

11. By-laws to come into operation on and after January 1, 1903.

By-laws referred to.

1. It shall be lawful for the Chairman of the Local Board, or any person authorized in writing by him for the purpose, to visit and inspect at any time any burial or cremation ground, and all books or documents relating thereto.

2. No grave shall be less than 5 feet in depth or at a less distance than 4 feet from another.

3. No grave shall be re-opened within three years, nor vault within six months, from the last interment therein, except upon orders from a competent authority.

4. The ashes and remains at the spot where any cremation has taken place shall be buried within three days of the cremation at a depth of not less than 3 feet.

5. A table of fees for burial and cremation shall be submitted by the keeper of every burial and cremation ground for the approval of the Chairman of the Local Board, and only such fees as are approved by the said Chairman shall be charged.

6. No burial or cremation shall take place in a registered burial or cremation ground without the permission of the keeper of the said ground, who will be held responsible for the due observance of these by-laws.

7. Any person applying to have a burial or cremation in a registered burial or cremation ground shall be bound to obey the lawful orders of the keeper of the said ground.

8. Any person entitled to the possession of a burial or cremation ground, within the limits of the Local Board of Badulla, shall apply in writing to the Chairman of the Local Board to have the same registered as such, stating the name of the keeper of the ground and annexing to his application a figure of survey of the premises certified by the Surveyor-General or a duly licensed surveyor. And the person named as keeper in such application shall subscribe the same in acknowledgment of his acceptance of the office and duties of such keeper.

9. If no keeper be named, or if the keeper so named shall not have signed the application in manner aforesaid, then the person who shall have made the application for the registration of a burial or cremation ground shall be held to be the keeper of the ground, and shall be responsible for any breach of by-laws in respect thereto.

10. In the event of the death, or inability from any cause to fulfil his duties, of the keeper of a burial or cremation ground, application to have the same registered shall be made as provided in by-law 8 aforesaid, and no burial or cremation shall take place in such ground until registration on such application has been effected, except on the special license of the Chairman.

11. It shall be the duty of the keeper of every burial or cremation ground, within the limits of the Local Board of Badulla, to keep a register of all burials or cremations carried out on the premises of which he is the keeper, in the form prescribed by the Chairman, and to cause to be delivered a copy of this register to the Local Board office not more than twenty-four hours after a burial or cremation shall have taken place therein.

12. It shall be the duty of every keeper of a burial or cremation ground to keep the same clean and in good order to the satisfaction of the Chairman.

13. Every burial or cremation ground shall be enclosed by a substantial wall or fence approved by the Chairman.

14. If the keeper of a registered burial or cremation ground is unable from any cause to perform his duties, or if he cannot be found at the time when his services are required, the Chairman may authorize any fit and proper person to perform any of the duties which by these rules are assigned to keeper of registered burial or cremation grounds.

15. Any person who is aggrieved by any order given by the keeper of a registered burial ground or by any act or omission on his part may complain to the Chairman, and the Chairman shall give such order as may be necessary to secure the proper observance of this rules.

THE following copy of an Order of His Majesty in Council giving effect to a Declaration signed on June 26, 1901, and ratified on June 25 last, between the United Kingdom and Austria-Hungary, amending Article XI. of the Treaty of 1873 between Her Majesty Queen Victoria and the Emperor of Austria for the mutual surrender of Fugitive Criminals, is published for general information.

**EXTRADITION DECLARATION OF JUNE 26, 1901, BETWEEN GREAT
BRITAIN AND AUSTRIA-HUNGARY.**

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1895, it was amongst other things enacted that where an arrangement has been made with any Foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such Foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the Third day of December, One thousand Eight hundred and Seventy-three, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and His Majesty the Emperor of Austria and King of Hungary for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, in the case of which Treaty "The Extradition Act, 1870," was applied by Order in Council of the Seventeenth March, One thousand Eight hundred and Seventy-four:

And whereas a Declaration was concluded on the Twenty-sixth day of June, One thousand Nine hundred and One, between His Majesty and His Majesty the Emperor of Austria, King of Hungary, amending Article XI. of the said Treaty of the Third of December, One thousand Eight hundred and Seventy-three, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Declaration is in the terms following:—

As it is considered necessary by the Government of Great Britain and Ireland and by the Governments of Austria and Hungary to extend the period of fourteen days fixed in Article XI. of the Treaty for the mutual surrender of criminals, concluded on the 3rd December, 1873, between Her late Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, &c., on one side, and His Majesty the Emperor of Austria, King of Bohemia, &c., and Apostolic King of Hungary, on the other, the respective Plenipotentiaries, undersigned, have agreed that—

The last paragraph of Article XI. of the said Treaty of Extradition shall be altered as follows:—

"Provided, however, that he shall be discharged if, within the shortest time possible, and at the utmost within one month, a requisition for his surrender, in accordance with the terms of Article IX. of this Treaty, be not made by the Diplomatic Representative of the State which requests his extradition."

The present Declaration shall have the same force and duration as the Extradition Treaty of the 3rd December, 1873, to which it relates.

The present Declaration shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged as soon as possible at London.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

Done in duplicate at London, the 26th day of June, 1901.

And whereas the ratifications of the said Declaration were exchanged at London, on the Twenty-fifth day of June, One thousand Nine hundred and Two:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the Sixth day of October, One thousand Nine hundred and Two, the said Acts shall apply in the case of Austria and Hungary under and in accordance with the said Treaty as amended by the said Declaration above set forth.

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in One thousand Eight hundred and Eighty-six, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," shall continue in force there, and no longer.
