THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES' ORDINANCE, No. 24 OF 1889.

T is hereby notified that HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR, in exercise of the powers vested in him by sections 7 and 8 of the above-named Ordinance and with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the rules set forth in Schedule I. hereto, which have been made, under the provisions of section 16 of the said Ordinance, by the Village Committee elected by the inhabitants of the subdivisions set forth in Schedule II. hereto, in substitution for rules No. 4 and No. 25 of the rules dated March 2, 1907, and the same are published for general information.

SCHEDULE I.

4. Commutation of labour.—Any person liable to work under rule 1 can commute his year's labour for a money payment of cents fifty, which cents fifty shall be paid by him on or before March 21 in every year. For extraordinary works under rule 1 any person may be called on to work for an additional period not exceeding six days.

25. Village schools.—Whenever Government sanctions the establishment of a school, the building for such school shall be built and repaired at the expense of the Village Committee Fund, or by communal labour, or by both.

VITAL STATISTICS.

COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

NHE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended October 26, 1907, is subjoined.

Births.-The total births were 98. The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum was 28.9,* as against 26.8 in the preceding week and 28.5 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 104. The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 34:1,† as against 39.7 in the previous week and 37.6 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.-No person died from cholera, smallpox, or measles; 13 died from diarrhœa and dysentery; 17 from phthisis; 17 from bronchitis and pneumonia; 5 from different kinds of fever; and 9 from infantile convulsions.

Infantile deaths.-Of the 104 total deaths, 26 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 32 in the corresponding week of the previous year.
