NOW Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in exercise of the powers vested in Us by section 4 of "The Dog Registration Ordinance, 1901," and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, as from and after December 1, 1907, bring the town of Madampe in the Chilaw District, North-Western Province, under the operation of the said Ordinance, and do define the limits of the said town for the purposes of the said Ordinance to be those set forth in the schedule hereto.

#### SCHEDULE.

- 28. It shall be lawful for the proper authority to cause persons diseased or suspected to be diseased with plague, cholera, smallpox, or enteric fever in any house or place hereunder described to be removed to some public hospital or other place provided by Government:—
  - (1) In any house or place in which goods are exposed for sale.

(2) In any house or place of public resort.

(3) In any building in which there are no means of isolating such persons from the other inmates, or in any building where the retention of such persons is likely to prove a source of danger to others.

Provided that it shall be competent for the proper authority, in case the removal of any person so diseased or suspected to be diseased in any house or place in which goods are exposed for sale is objected to and the house or place is not otherwise open to objection, to allow such person to be retained, on condition, however, that the sale of goods shall not be carried on in such house or place until the proper authority shall grant permission.

Provided further, that it shall be lawful for the proper authority to allow any person so diseased or suspected to be diseased to be removed to any locality which such person or his or her friends may choose, and to which the medical authorities of the town or place, if any, do not object, instead of to the public hospital or place

provided by Government.

It shall be lawful for the proper authority to cause any persons found in an infected locality, or who have come from any place where disease exists, to be removed to a place of observation set apart for the purpose, or to be kept under surveillance for such period as the proper authority shall direct.

THE following regulations made by the Council of the Ceylon Medical College, in exercise of the powers vested in them by section 13 of "The Medical Registration Ordinance, 1905," and approved by HIS EXCELLENCY THE OFFICER ADMINISTERING THE GOVERNMENT, with the advice of the Executive Council, are hereby, in pursuance of section 13 of the said Ordinance, published for general information.

## Regulations for the Registration of Medical Practitioners.

The following diplomas and certificates will be entertained by the Council of the Ceylon Medical College in applications by persons to obtain certificates under section 13 of Ordinance No. 2 of 1905:—

(a) License in Medicine and Surgery (Ceylon).

- (b) Any medical qualification which is capable of being registered under the Medical Acts of Great Britain and Ireland, provided that this qualification has been obtained from one of the examining bodies of Great Britain or Ireland.
- (c) The Medical Degrees and the License in Medicine and Surgery of-
  - (1) Madras University.
  - (2) Calcutta University.(3) Bombay University.
  - (4) Allahabad University.
  - (5) Punjab University.

(d) The Medical Degrees of the Universities of the British Colonies.

(e) In the case of persons who do not hold a Diploma or License to practise Medicine and Surgery, applications must be supported (1) by certificates from two practitioners already registered under the Ordinance and qualified for registration by possession of a Degree or Diploma which is accepted as a qualification for registration to the effect that the applicant possesses the requisite knowledge and skill for efficient practise as a Medical Practitioner; (2) by an affidavit that the applicant has practised Medicine and Surgery in Ceylon for not less than ten years. Applications by such persons will only be entertained if made on or before the 31st. December, 1907, and certificates under section 13 of the Medical Registration Ordinance will only be granted in cases where the Council is satisfied that it is desirable in the interests of the public the same should be given.

- 7. The examination will be held in two parts: the first part will be a qualifying examination in Handwriting, Spelling, and Arithmetic. Any candidate failing to obtain half the marks allotted for Handwriting, Spelling, and Arithmetic, respectively, will be excluded from the remainder of the examination. The second part of the examination will be in the remaining subjects mentioned in paragraph 6 of this notice. Attention is drawn to the addition of Sinhalese and Tamil to the subjects for examination. Candidates will be required to read and translate specimens of ordinary handwriting in these languages, and in selecting candidates consideration will be given to those who have obtained marks in the vernacular.
- 8. Candidates who have passed either the London Matriculation Examination or the Madras Matriculation or the Calcutta Entrance Examination in the First or Second Division, or the Senior or Junior Cambridge Local Examinations in (1) English, (2) Euclid and Algebra, in addition to the compulsory subjects, will only be required to pass in Dictation and either Sinhalese or Tamil.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

## COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended November 9, 1907 is subjoined.

Births.—The total births were 66. The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum was 194,\* as against 27.1 in the preceding week and 26.5 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 88. The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 28.9,† as against

31.2 in the previous week and 47.3 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—No person died from cholera, smallpox, or measles; 8 died from diarrhee and dysentery; 13 from phthisis; 16 from bronchitis and pneumonia; 3 from enteric fever; and 9 from infantile convulsions.

Infantile deaths.—Of the 88 total deaths, 27 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 36 in the corresponding week of the previous year.

#### VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON.

#### Report of the Registrar-General for the Month of October, 1907.

This Report deals with the Vital Statistics of the several towns of the Island proclaimed under sections 31 to 36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895. The Registrars of these towns are qualified medical men. No death occurring there is registered unless the cause is ascertained by the Registrar's personal inspection of the deceased, or certified by a qualified medical man in attendance on the deceased; and no dead body is buried or cremated without registration being effected. This system was commenced on the 1st January, 1893, in the town of Colombo under the Ordinance No. 20 of 1891, and has been gradually extended till it now embraces 30 towns, including the town of Lunuga's, which was brought under the operation of the special provisions of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895 with effect from the beginning of the month.

- 2. Table I. in the Appendix shows the population at the last decennial Census of 1901 and the present estimated population, and the births and deaths registered during the month, their rates, and the infantile mortality in each town.
- 3. The estimated population of the 30 towns is 460,943, or about one-ninth of the total population of the Island. The population of Colombo (176,724) is nearly two-thirds of the population of all the other towns taken together (284,224).
- 4. The births registered in the 30 towns numbered 1,210—of which 621 were of males and 589 of females—and correspond to an annual birth-rate per 1,000 of 30.91. The highest birth-rate for the month was in Lunugala (84.91), and the lowest in Mullaittivu (8.46). In the other towns the birth-rate ranged from 54.63 in Tangalla to 13.18 each in "Hatton and Dikoya" and Chilaw. Colombo records a rate of 27.45, as against 25.40 in the preceding month.
- 5. The number of deaths registered in the 30 towns was 1,282—of which 699 were of males and 533 of females—and correspond to an annual death-rate of 28.74 per mille. 415 of the total deaths, or about one-third, occurred in hospitals (with 11 deaths in jails), and exaggerated the normal mortality of the towns.
- 6. Corrected death-rates as well as crude death-rates are shown for the several towns. By a corrected rate is meant the rate calculated for the population of each town on the basis that its age- and sex-constitution is the same as for the Island. In the calculation of these rates a further correction has been made by excluding from the total deaths the deaths of estate coolies and other persons who are not town residents. The corrected rate should thus furnish a more satisfactory test of the comparative health of towns than the crude rate. I am unable to give the corrected rates for "Hatton and Dikoya," Kalpitiya, and Lunugala towns, because the age- and sex-constitution of their populations was not ascertained at the last Census. The population of Lunugala (as now constituted) was not enumerated at the Census of 1901, and the figure given is an estimate made at the beginning of this month.
- 7. The lowest corrected mortality during the month was observed in Mannar (10.08), and the highest in Vavuniya (143.73). In the other towns the death-rate ranged from 14.19 in Nawalapitiya, 14.86 in Matara, 15.72 in Trincomalee, 16.12 in Chilaw, 20.52 in Nuwara Eliya, and 20.58 in Moratuwa, to 61.06 in Gampola and 64.87 in Mullaittivu. Colombo shows 32.11, as against 32.79 during the preceding month.
- 8. The infantile mortality for the 30 towns was equal to a rate of 216 per 1,000 births registered. In the towns having a population of 5,000 or more the mortality ranged from 500 in Mannar and 400 in Nuwara Eliya to 138 in Moratuwa, 121 in Kalutara, 91 in Negombo, 56 in Badulla, and nil in Kurunegala. The infantile mortality in the town of Colombo was 265.
- 9. Table II. in the Appendix gives for each town and race the principal causes of deaths registered during the month, and shows the infantile mortality separately from the other mortality.
- 10. Out of 1,282 deaths from all causes in the 30 towns, 261 or more than one-fifth were among infants under one year. Of these, the chief causes were 81 Convulsions, 56 Debility, 31 Bronchitis and Pneumonia (of which 17 Bronchitis), 29 Prematurity, 24 Tetanus, 10 Diarrhea, and 6 Dysentery.
- 11. Out of the 1,021 deaths of persons one year and over in age, there were 227 due to Diarrhea and Dysentery, of which 40 were in Colombo, 17 in Jaffna, 15 each in Nawalapitiya and Kurunegala, and 14 each in Kandy and Badulla; 120 Phthisis, of which 73 in Colombo, 14 in Galle, and 11 in Kandy; 97 Pneumonia, of which 46 in Colombo and 12 in Galle; 30 Enterio Fever, of which 16 in Colombo and 11 in Moratuwa; 25 Malarial Cachexia; 18 Remittent Fever, of which 9 in Jaffna; 18 Bronchitis, of which 12 in Colombo; 49 Dochmius Duodenalis, of which 42 were of Tamil coolies.
- 12. Thus, of the total number of deaths of all ages in the towns, Diarrhose and Dysentery accounted for nearly 19 per cent., Bronchitis and Pneumonia more than 11 per cent., Phthisis more than 9 per cent., and various kinds of fever more than 5 per cent.
