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## DRAFT ORDINANCES.

### MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance for making provision for the Supplementary Contingent Charges for the Year 1902.

Preamble.

WHEREAS by Ordinance No. 16 of 1901 it was enacted that a sum not exceeding Twenty-one million Three hundred and Twenty-six thousand Four hundred and One rupees should be charged upon the revenue of this island for the contingent service of the year One thousand Nine hundred and Two, and it has become necessary to make further provision for the service of the said year: It is enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Rs. 1,886,053.71 to be charged upon the revenue of the island for the Supplementary Contingent Charges for the year 1902.

1 That a sum not exceeding One million Eight hundred and Eighty-six thousand and Fifty-three rupees and cents Seventy-one shall be and the same is hereby charged upon the revenue of this island and other funds of the colony for the services hereinafter mentioned; and the said expenditure shall be in conformity with the details of the estimates specified in the Schedule A hereunto annexed, whereof the following is an abstract:

Treasurer to pay the above at such times as the Governor by warrant shall order.

And to receive credit in his accounts for the payments made in pursuance thereof.

2 The Treasurer of the said island shall issue and pay the said several sums to such persons, for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, upon such days and in such proportions as the Governor for the time being, by any warrant or order in writing to be signed by him, shall from time to time order and direct; and the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the revenues of the said island.

3 The said Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid; and the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for any such sum or sums as shall be therein mentioned; and he shall and may receive credit for the same accordingly.

An Ordinance for making final provision for the Supplementary Contingent Charges for the Year 1901.

Preamble.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance No. 22 of 1901 it was enacted that a sum of Rs. 2,461,608-95 should be charged upon the revenue of this island for the Supplementary Contingent Services of the year One thousand Nine hundred and One, in addition to the sum of Rs. 22,540,191 provided by the Ordinance No. 17 of 1900 : And whereas an expenditure of Rs. 41,001-39 was incurred and brought to account for the Contingent Services of the year 1901, for which provision is not made by the aforesaid Ordinances : It is enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :

Rs. 41,001-39 charged upon the revenue of this island of the year 1901 for the final Supplementary Contingent Service of that year.

I That a sum not exceeding Forty-one thousand and One rupees and Thirty-nine cents shall be and the same is hereby charged upon the revenue of this island of the said year 1901, for the services hereinafter mentioned ; the said expenditure being in conformity with the schedule hereunto annexed, whereof the following is an abstract :
