Regulations for the Registration of Medical Practitioners.

The following diplomas and certificates will be entertained by the Council of the Ceylon Medical College in applications by persons to obtain certificates under section 13 of Ordinance No. 2 of 1905:—

- (a) License in Medicine and Surgery (Ceylon).
- (b) Any medical qualification which is capable of being registered under the Medical Acts of Great Britain and Ireland, provided that this qualification has been obtained from one of the examining bodies of Great Britain or Ireland.
- (c) The Medical Degrees and the License in Medicine and Surgery of—
 - (1) Madras University.
 - (2) Calcutta University.
 - (3) Bombay University.
 - (4) Allahabad University.
 - (5) Punjab University.
- (d) The Medical Degrees of the Universities of the British Colonies.
- (e) In the case of persons who do not hold a Diploma or License to practise Medicine and Surgery, applications must be supported (1) by certificates from two practitioners already registered under the Ordinance and qualified for registration by possession of a Degree or Diploma which is accepted as a qualification for registration to the effect that the applicant possesses the requisite knowledge and skill for efficient practise as a Medical Practitioner; (2) by an affidavit that the applicant has practised Medicine and Surgery in Ceylon for not less than ten years. Applications by such persons will only be entertained if made on or before the 31st December, 1907, and certificates under section 13 of the Medical Registration Ordinance will only be granted in cases where the Council is satisfied that it is desirable in the interests of the public the same should be given.

Regulations for Admission of Ceylonese to certain Appointments.

(2)—THE SURVEY DEPARTMENT.

Appointments to the Temporary Class.

Appointments to the Temporary Class of the Survey Department will from January 1, 1908, be preferentially made from the "Department of Surveying and Levelling of the Technical College," provided there are sufficient candidates to fill vacancies. Members of this class who are undergoing a course of training at the College for the Survey Department will enter and serve under the same regulations as those who are working for the Licensed Surveyors' Examination, but they will pay no fee; all instruments and other tools will be supplied, and they will not be eligible to enter for the Licensed Survey Examination until they have served a period of five years in the Survey Department to the satisfaction of the Surveyor-General. Technical books must in all cases be obtained by the student at his own expense.

2. Selections by examination from this class will be made from time to time as vacancies occur by an officer of the Survey Department from among those pupils who are nominated by the Superintendent of the College as probably suitable, and it is thought that a young man who applies himself diligently to his work may become eligible for selection in a year or even less. Having passed the examination to the satisfaction of the Surveyor-General, he will enter upon his duties in any part of the Island in which he may be called upon to serve, and he will be refunded the actual expenses of the journey from Colombo. From the date of his appointment he will receive pay at the rate of Rs. 2 a day; he will be on probation for two years, and liable to dismissal by the Surveyor-General during that time. At the expiration of the second year, if the surveyor is reported by his immediate superior to the Surveyor-General as efficient, he will be transferred to a separate grade, to be termed "Supernumerary Surveyor, Technical College Grade." After serving for one year in this grade, and continuing to give satisfaction as above, he will draw an extra 50 cents a day, and after a further period of two years, *i.e.*, after a full period of three years in Supernumerary Surveyor, Technical College Grade, he will draw a further 50 cents a day, or a total of Re. 1, provided always that he continues to give satisfaction to the Surveyor-General in the discharge of the duties entrusted to him. The drawing of the extra rate of 50 cents and Re. 1 will be dependent on the approval of the Surveyor-General, and may be stopped by him for unsatisfactory work or behaviour, the period of such stoppage to be deducted from the period said to be served on that rate.

3. On receiving the rate of Rs. 3 a day he will be entitled to enter for the Departmental Junior Examination, the syllabus of which is as follows:—

- (1) English Composition.
- (2) Arithmetic.
- (3) Euclid, 1st and 2nd books.
- (4) Mensuration.
- (5) Surveying and Levelling (paper and report by officers under whom the candidate has worked).
- (6) Elementary Trigonometry.
- (7) Adjustments of Theodolite and Level (paper and practically).
- (8) Drawing: plan and free hand.
- (9) Standing orders.

All subjects are compulsory.

4. All students who pass the Survey Department Junior Examination will rank for promotions to the third grade on the establishment with the present members of the Department according to date of passing the examination, *i.e.*, seniority for appointment to the third grade will date from the date of passing the examination irrespective of whether the officer came originally from the Technical College or not, all else being equal, but the Surveyor-General reserves the right to make recommendations to Government for the appointment to the third grade of any specially selected officer who shall have proved himself to possess qualifications superior to those possessed by officers who have passed the examination on prior dates.

5. Any student who has served the full three years' course in the Department, on Civil Engineering and has gained a certificate in accordance with the regulations of that Department of the College shall, if he applies for admission to the Survey Department, be entitled, if selected, to draw Rs. 3 a day for two years on probation, subject to the rule governing the Temporary Surveyor's Class, and if at the end of that time he shall have given satisfaction to the Surveyor-General in the discharge of the duties entrusted to him, he will be classified as Supernumerary Surveyor, Technical College Grade, and may enter the next Departmental Junior Examination. This period of probation to count for the College Diploma in Civil Engineering.

6. No student of the Technical College or person at present in the employ of the Survey Department shall lose seniority (except as provided in paragraph 4), provided he qualifies for promotion to the third grade within six years from this date or the date of his entry into the Department.

7. On the occurrence of vacancies in the temporary grade of the Survey Department, preference will be given to selected or passed students of the Technical College as provided above, but if there are no candidates available or suitable at the time, the Surveyor-General may make a selection from outside candidates, such selection to be notified to the Director of Public Instruction on being sanctioned by Government.

8. From the date of appointment to the third grade all officers, whether from the Technical College or elsewhere, must conform to the standing orders of the Department regarding further promotion. After being promoted to the second grade an officer is entitled to enter for the Senior Examination, and after passing this he shall, if he is found to possess the requisite administrative abilities, be eligible for promotion to the rank of Assistant Superintendent of Surveys with salary commencing at £300 a year and rising by yearly increments of £25 to £350.

9. Nothing in the foregoing rules is to act prejudicially to the interest of those who are now being trained by officers of the Department on the approval of the Surveyor-General, or who have passed such tests as they may have been put to and already registered as suitable for an appointment.

College Regulations.

DEPARTMENT OF SURVEYING AND LEVELLING.

ONE AND HALF YEAR COURSE.

Syllabus.

The Entrance Examination will be as follows :—

Handwriting, Orthography, Composition, Arithmetic, Geometry (First book of Euclid), Algebra (up to and including Quadratic Equations), Plain Trigonometry (Elementary), Geography, and Drawing.

Candidates who hold certificates of having passed the Senior Cambridge or other examination of similar standing, or have matriculated at the London University or other similar institution from time to time approved by His Excellency the Governor, will be exempted from this examination in all subjects, except colloquial Tamil or Sinhalese, if their certificates show that they have passed in Mathematics.

The Syllabus of the College course will be as follows :—

Fieldwork.—Chain surveying; theodolite surveying and levelling, including adjustments of the theodolite and level; laying out curves.

Drawing.—Setting out; plotting; drawing up; computing; and making a report on a survey.

The course will include also Mathematics and Mensuration, and classes on the Theory of Surveying and Levelling up to the limits required for the Surveyor-General's Examination for the Government License for Surveying and Levelling.

Fees.

The fees will be Rs. 150 paid in advance, and in addition a deposit of Rs. 100 will be made on admission. Those who enter for the purpose of undergoing the course of training to qualify for selection to be appointed to the Temporary Class of the Survey Department will not be required to pay the fee, but they must pay the deposit of Rs. 100. They will not be eligible in that case for the Diploma in Surveying and Levelling at the end of the course.

The Diploma is granted to those who pass the final examination in Surveying and Levelling held by the Surveyor-General for the purpose.

Regulations for granting the License of the Surveyor-General to Students of the Course in Surveying and Levelling at the Ceylon Technical College.

Students in the Department of Surveying and Levelling of the Technical College, who pass the prescribed course and gain the Diploma at the final examination of the course held at the Technical College, and satisfy as well the officer appointed to represent the Surveyor-General at that examination, shall be eligible for the license and for registration as surveyors or as surveyors and levellers without further examination and payment of the fees prescribed in section 5 of the Ordinance No. 15 of 1889. Such candidates for the license must be more than 21 years of age when they apply, and they must pay the registration fee and the stamp duty on the license as provided for in sections 2 and 7 of the Ordinance, and must be holders of the Diploma of the Ceylon Technical College bearing the signature of the person appointed by the Governor to conduct the final examination in Surveying and Levelling.

MISCELLANEOUS DEPARTMENTAL NOTICES.

AN examination for admission into the Post and Telegraph Department will be held at the Government Training College, Colombo, on April 13, 1908, and the following day.

2. Only candidates nominated by the Postmaster-General will be allowed to compete.
3. Candidates must be over 18 and under 24 years of age on the first day of examination.

7. The examination will be held in two parts : the first part will be a qualifying examination in Handwriting, Spelling, and Arithmetic. Any candidate failing to obtain half the marks allotted for Handwriting, Spelling, and Arithmetic, respectively, will be excluded from the remainder of the examination. The second part of the examination will be in the remaining subjects mentioned in paragraph 6 of this notice. Attention is drawn to the addition of Sinhalese and Tamil to the subjects for examination. Candidates will be required to read and translate specimens of ordinary handwriting in these languages, and in selecting candidates consideration will be given to those who have obtained marks in the vernacular.

8. Candidates who have passed either the London Matriculation Examination or the Madras Matriculation or the Calcutta Entrance Examination in the First or Second Division, or the Senior or Junior Cambridge Local Examinations in (1) English, (2) Euclid and Algebra, in addition to the compulsory subjects, will only be required to pass in Dictation and either Sinhalese or Tamil.

1. *Handwriting.*—Including tests in round, text, and small hand. Special attention is drawn to this subject as a high standard of proficiency will be insisted upon, and no certificate will be granted to any candidate who fails to reach the standard fixed. The characteristic most desired is legibility. Each letter should be clearly and accurately formed so that its identity may be distinguished apart from its position in the word—the u's distinguished from the n's, &c.,—and the turnings should be round and not angular. Particular attention should be paid to the junction of the letters in a word. The writing should be of moderate thickness and regular, and the loops and tails of letters should be short and full.

Handwriting may be tested in one or more of the following ways :—

Addressing envelopes of various sizes, copying a draft letter, manuscript, a tabular statement, or printed matter, &c. Copying and ruling up, where necessary, a receipt or other commercial form or document in general use, and the displaying of headings or other matters by different sizes of writing.

Handwriting will be taken into consideration in all the answer papers.

2. *Arithmetic*.—Two papers will be set in this subject: (1) Tots, (2) a general paper in Arithmetic. No candidate will be granted a certificate who fails in either paper.

The general paper will include simple and compound rules, weights and measures in ordinary use, vulgar and decimal fractions including approximations, the metric system of weights and measures, percentages, simple interest, exchange. In setting questions a knowledge of ordinary commercial terms will be expected.

3. *English*.—(1) Orthography and Dictation, (2) Composition, (3) Précis and Indexing, (4) Reading and Oral Composition.

(1) Spelling will be taken into account in all the papers.

(2) *Composition*.—(a) To write a letter or theme on a prescribed subject.

(b) To correct ordinary faulty sentences and phrases.

(c) To re-draft a badly constructed letter.

(3) *Précis and Indexing*.—The candidate will be expected to make a précis in the form of a narrative of one or of a number of letters and documents dealing with a particular subject, so that any one who had not time to read the original might by reading the précis be put in possession of all the main features. The merits of such a précis are (a) to contain all that is of importance in the letter or documents, and nothing that is unimportant; (b) to present this in a consecutive and readable shape, expressed as distinctly as possible and as succinctly as is compatible with completeness and distinctness. Attention should be paid to handwriting, spelling, grammar, and style.

(4) *Reading*.—To read with distinct and clear expression a prescribed passage from a standard prose author, or from a newspaper or other periodical. Questions will be put on matters arising out of the passage read to test the candidate's ability in oral expression and conversation.

4. *Bookkeeping*.—General principles of Bookkeeping by double entry.

5. *Shorthand*.—Writing in shorthand from passages dictated at the rate of 60 and 70 words per minute. Transcription of the shorthand.

Spelling, punctuation, and handwriting will be taken into account in judging of the candidate's work.

6. *Typewriting*.—To copy in correct form commercial letters and tabular statements from manuscript copy.

Special attention must be paid to accuracy, correct spelling, syllabication, punctuation, and general intelligence. Candidates will be allowed to bring their own machines for the examination.

7. *Geography*.—"The products of Ceylon. Lines of communication in Ceylon. General knowledge of mercantile centres elsewhere which trade with Ceylon. Interchange of products. Routes of the principal steamship lines."

VITAL STATISTICS.

COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended November 23, 1907, is subjoined.

Births.—The total births were 93. The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum was 27·4,* as against 28·0 in the preceding week and 27·7 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 97. The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 31·9,† as against 36·1 in the previous week and 40·9 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—No person died from cholera, smallpox, or measles; 8 died from diarrhoea and dysentery; 13 from phthisis; 10 from bronchitis and pneumonia; 6 from enteric fever; and 6 from infantile convulsions.

Infantile deaths.—Of the 97 total deaths, 26 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 35 in the corresponding week of the previous year.

* Calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1907, viz., 176,724.

† The rates given for this and the preceding week are the corrected rates, i.e., the rates calculated for the population of the town estimated on July 1, 1907, on the basis that its age- and sex-constitution is the same as for the Island. The rate shown for the corresponding week of last year is the crude rate.
