Africa, East Coast—Pomba (Pembu) Bay—Non-existence of certain Shoals, &c.

The following notice to Mariners (No. 736 of 1902) issued by the British Admiralty is republished:—

The following information relating to Pomba (Pemba) has been received from Lieutenant and Commander Eustace La T. Leatham, H.M.S. Partridge:—
