## MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on October 25, 1902, at 1.30 p.m.

*Present*.—The Chairman; F. J. Pigott, Esq.; C. P. Hayley, Esq.; Dr. P. D. Anthonisz, C.M.G.; N. Dias Abeysinha, Esq.; D. G. Goonawardana, Esq.; Dr. E. Ludovici; and Magdon Ismail, Esq.

1. Read and confirmed Minutes of Meeting held on September 20, 1902.

2. By leave of Council, Dr. Anthonisz amended the motion notice of which he had given, and moved—That His Excellency the Governor be graciously pleased to consider the matter of the danger to the inhabitants of the Island by having a plague hospital in the mainland of the Island, and to consider whether a detached island could not be had conveniently for the purpose, or a hospital ship provided.

Seconded by Dr. Ludovici.—Carried.

3. Submitted letter from the Ordnance Office, dated March 8, 1902, and connected correspondence in regard to five empty gunpowder barrels held in loan from the Ordnance Department.

Resolved—That payment of the value of the barrels demanded by the Ordnance Officer be made, and that the barrels be sold by public auction and the amount realized credited to the Municipal fund.

4. Submitted correspondence *re* the Kitson light.

The Council agreed to have a light on trial for a month to test its working and ascertain cost of lighting.

5. The Chairman reported sale of rents for 1903:—

Resolved—That the sale of the above rents be approved, and that the stalls of the Fort market be rented out monthly at Rs. 7.50 for each of the stalls in the Central Hall, and Rs. 3 for each of the other stalls.

- (5) Scavenging suburbs. Tender of Bopege Davit Appu at Rs. 320 per mensem accepted.
- (6) Bulls for road roller. Tender of C. S. Abdul Cader of Re. 1.25 per pair per day accepted.
- (7) Grass for cattle in the pound. Tender of Andi of 12 cents per bundle of 25 pounds accepted.
- (8) Witewashing markets. Tender of Bimbirigodage Dinnes Allis at Rs. 8.50 a month for eight months and Rs. 28 a month for four months accepted.
- (9) Transport of metal. Tender of C. S. Abdul Cader at Re. 1 for the first mile and 75 cents for the second mile accepted.
- (10) Gravel. Tender rejected. Ordered to invite tenders again.

(a) Metalled 158½ lines of road, used 416 cubes of metal; gravelled 35½ lines of road; patched ruts 242 squares used 99 cubes of metal; cleared jungle on sides of roads, 444½ lines; trimmed and lowered sides, 1,720 lines; cleared side drains, 959 lines; spread and rolled gravel, 61 squares; patched wheel tracks, 8 lines; removed nine landslips; used 137 cubes of gravel; lopped branches of trees, 76 lines.

(b) Building a culvert on Wakwella road; repair of Milidowa bridge; purchased fifty-five bridge planks and ten na beams.

(f) Galvanized roof to workshop; planks and tar for garden seats; repair of fire engine; repair of footbridge; making a tennis court in Victoria park; value of rubber hose.

(g) Repair of eight night soil carts, seven scavenging carts, two iron hand carts, four water carts, one wheelbarrow; and making a water cart, two iron hand carts, and two scavenging carts.

(h) Cost of land for Kaluwella market; compensation for trees removed to form a road at Talapitiya; cost in cases Nos. 6,216, 6,218, and 6,219.

(i) Planting shade trees and making sixty tree guards.

(j) Raising Hume road and cost of gravel, and building a culvert, Kitulanpitiya road.

(k) Building markets at Kaluwella; building retaining wall round Kaluwella market; building a verandah Kaluwella market; and fitting stone slabs for fish market, Kaluwella.

(l) Compensation for land acquired for opening roads and alleys in Fort in cases Nos. 5,918 and 5,919 cost of opening roads and alleys in the Fort.

(m) Building steps to sea bathing place for females, Fort, and fixing benches.

(n) Cost of building cattle shed inside the cattle pound.

(o) Repair of fish market roof; cost of cement; and building drain round Kaluwella market.

## LOCAL BOARD NOTICES.

## Local Board, Negombo.

## Commutation Tax for 1903.

NOTICE is hereby given to persons residing within the limits of the Local Board, Negombo, that the Board, acting under the provisions of section 35 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1898, has imposed an annual tax on account of the year 1903, payable in six days' labour, upon all persons residing within the limits of the Local Board, who would have been liable, under the provisions of the Ordinance No. 10 of 1861, to the performance of labour for the maintenance of the roads or other public means of communication by land or by water, if the Ordinance No. 31 of 1884 had not been passed.

Such labour may be commuted by a money payment of Rs. 2 in the town of Negombo and the islands of Pitipana and Munakkara, and Re. 1.50 in the island of Duwa on or before March 31, 1903. After that date the payment will be Rs. 4 and Rs. 3 respectively per head.
