Destruction of Uniform.

GENERAL Circular No. 207 of November 15, 1899, is hereby amended. Condemned clothing will in future not be completely destroyed by fire, but will be partially destroyed by fire and buried. This order is issued to save unnecessary expense in the consumption of kerosine oil required to completely destroy the clothing.
