Part I. — Departmental Orders.

1.—All Departmental Orders will in future be published in Part I. of the Ceylon Police Gazette, which should be filed separately from Part II., which will consist of the old "Hue and Cry."

2.—The Inspector-General's Circular Guard File is abolished.

Order No. 42.

Criminal Investigation Department Cart Hire.

ERGEANTS and Constables of the Criminal Investigation Department should receive the sanction of the Superintendents. Additional Superintendents Superintendents, Additional Superintendents, or Assistant Superintendents of Colombo or the Provinces before they engage carts or travel by coach.

2. Sergeants and Constables of the Criminal Investigation Department are under the Police regulations bound to report themselves to the senior officer of Police of the District in which they are working. If it is necessary for them to proceed direct to the scene without so reporting themselves, they should receive the sanction of the Superintendent of Police, Colombo, or of the Assistant Superintendent, Colombo South, to engage carts or to travel by coach beforehand. On the completion of their inquiry they are bound to report themselves to the senior officer of the Police of the District. If further inquiries are necessary, and if it is necessary that Sergeants or Constables should proceed by cart or coach to hold such inquiries, they will obtain sanction to do so from the senior officer of the Police of the District.

3. In the event of circumstances arising, when it is impossible to obtain sanction beforehand, the Sergeants and Constables of the Criminal Investigation Department will obtain a certificate from the senior officer of the Police of the District that the cart hire or coach fare incurred by them, without previous sanction, was necessitated by the urgency of the particular inquiry which they were making.

Travelling Claims.

O claims for coach or cart hire from men employed on investigation duty will in future be entertained without a certificate from the Superintendent of Police, Assistant Superintendent of Police, Additional Superintendent of Police, or Additional Assistant Superintendent of Police, that the expense was incurred with his previous sanction, and that it was imperatively necessary. Officers are reminded that they must make it a point of honour to protect the interests of Government.
