### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Honourable ARTHUR HAMILTON GORDON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

ARTHUR GORDON.

WHEREAS by section 4 of "The Tolls' Ordinance, 1867," it is enacted that, subject to the provisions and limitations in the said Ordinance contained, tolls shall be levied upon all horses, oxen, vehicles, and boats in respect of the roads, bridges, ferries, and canals specified in the several schedules to the said Ordinance annexed, at such rates as the Governor from time to time shall by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, be pleased to appoint, provided that the same shall in no case exceed the rates thereafter specified :

And whereas by section 1 of the Ordinance No. 12 of 1885 it is enacted that from and after the passing thereof it shall be lawful for the Legislative Council of the Island of Ceylon, by means of any resolution duly passed at any public session thereof, to establish tolls in respect of any public road, bridge, ferry, or canal in this Island, anything in the said "Tolls' Ordinance, 1867," to the contrary notwithstanding; and by section 2 of the same Ordinance it is further enacted that when tolls shall so by any such resolution be established the

provisions of the said "Tolls' Ordinance, 1867," shall, in so far as they are not repugnant to the said first in part recited Ordinance, apply to such tolls:

And whereas by a resolution of the said Legislative Council duly passed at a public session thereof on the Fifth day of February, 1890, a toll has been duly established at Migahawatta, at or near Madarawa bridge, on the road from Talawatuhenpitiya to Udupila, from the First day of March, 1890, and it is expedient to specify the rates at which such toll shall be levied in respect of the said road:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, do hereby, by this Our Proclamation and under and by virtue of the powers in that behalf by the said "Tolls' Ordinance, 1867," on Us conferred, appoint that toll shall be levied in respect of the said road at the rates in the Schedule hereto specified:—

WHEREAS by section 10 of Ordinance No. 14 of 1867 it is enacted that every person having once paid toll in respect of himself or of any vehicle, animal, or boat at any place, payment at which shall have been declared by the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to clear any other place, shall, on the production at such other place of a ticket denoting such payment to have been made, pass the same without any further payment of toll, except where such person, vehicle, animal, or boat shall at such latter place have become liable to a different rate of toll:

It is hereby proclaimed that the Governor has, under and by virtue of the provisions in that behalf in the said section contained, declared that payment at the toll at Migahawatta, at or near Maradawa bridge, on the road from Talawatuhenpitiya to Udupila, shall clear the several tolls established at the stations on the Kelaniya to Henaratgoda road for any return journey made on the same day on which payment at the said toll in respect of the road from Talawatuhenpitiya to Udupila shall have been made; and further, that payment at any one of the said several tolls established at the stations on the Kelaniya to Henaratgoda road shall in like manner clear the said toll in respect of the road from Talawatuhenpitiya to Udupila for any such return journey so made as aforesaid on the same day on which payment at any of such tolls shall have been made.

The Leander reports that a large flat stone, with 6 ft. of water over it at low water springs, lies S. by E. (mag.) 56 yards from the pear-shaped buoy off the Dry Dock. Shoal water extends considerably to the northward of a line between pear-shaped buoy and post. Lines 6 and 7° of the China Sea Directory, vol. IV., page 507, are incorrect, as it would be unsafe for a ship of over 280 ft. in length to lay at the mooring buoy.

The mooring buoy lies N.  $72^{\circ}$  E., 317 yards from the centre of the Caisson, and the pear-shaped buoy S.  $43^{\circ}$  W., 115 yards from the mooring buoy.

CHINA SEA, NINGPO DISTRICT.

Loka Island Light.

Notice is hereby given that on or about January 12, a light will be exhibited from the tower on the north point of Loka island, which will take the place of the temporary light advertised in Notice to Mariners No. 229 of this Series.

The apparatus of the new light is fixed dioptric of the fourth order, and is arranged to show sectors of white and red light between the following approximate bearings:

White from N.  $15^{\circ}$  W. to N.  $85^{\circ} 30'$  W.

Red from N.  $85^{\circ} 30'$  W. to S.  $82^{\circ}$  W.

White from S.  $82^{\circ}$  W. to S.  $24^{\circ}$  W.

Red from S.  $24^{\circ}$  W. round by south to S.  $87^{\circ}$  E.

White from S.  $87^{\circ}$  E. to N.  $82^{\circ}$  E.

From N.  $82^{\circ}$  E. round by north to N.  $15^{\circ}$  W. the light will be entirely obscured by Loka island.

The bearings are magnetic and taken from seaward; and until a further notice is issued the sectors are subject to alteration.

The light will be elevated 128 ft. above the sea, and in clear weather the white light should be visible from a distance of 15 miles.

The tower is round, built of stone, with a total height from the base to the crown of the lantern of 29 ft.

The tower and lightkeeper's dwellings are painted white. The approximate geographical position is latitude,  $29^{\circ} 58.15'$  N.; longitude,  $122^{\circ} 27' 20''$  E.

N.B.—This light will be exhibited mainly in the interests of Chinese junks and fishing boats, and the provision of the red sectors is experimental. Until further notice, therefore, vessels of foreign type are warned not to make use of it.

Additional Lights in Great Sandy Island Strait.

NOTICE is hereby given that on and after Thursday, January 2, the following additional lights will be exhibited to enable vessels to navigate Great Sandy Island Strait by night:

One white light near the white beacon, marking the northern extremity of the bank N.W. of Snout Point;

One white light bearing north-easterly; and

One white light S. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. easterly from the first light giving with it two leads—one towards Fig-tree Camp, the other towards the Fairway Buoy;

Two lights—the front red, the other white—are placed near the Fig-tree Camp, and lead southwards of Stewart's Island;

Two lights—one white, the other red—on the bank northwards of the Stewart's Island Cutting, and leading through the centre of the channel;

Two lights—one white and the other red—on Moonboon Islands leading over to that Island;

One green light on a dolphin N.E. of Moonboon Island in 11 ft. at low water;

One white light off the western shore of Great Sandy Island;

Two lights—one red and one white—leading through Roundbush Cutting;

One red light, on a dolphin, standing in 11 ft. of water at low water, in line with the back light of the next pair of lights, and then in line with that of the last pair, leads N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W., and then N.N.E. easterly, respectively, to the entrance of the cutting northward of the Roundbush;

Two lights—one red and the other white—lead through that cutting, towards a red beacon standing on a projecting spit on the west side of the channel, and afterwards lead through a cutting further to the N.E. near the lower White Cliffs;

One red light on the above red beacon;

Two white lights are placed on the shore of Great Sandy Island below the watering place, and lead just to the eastward of the Junction Buoy.

Directions at Night.

After passing the South Fairway Buoy bring the two white leading lights in one, on a north-easterly bearing, until within a short cable's distance of the lower light; then stand northwards passing it on the starboard hand bringing it on with a third white light to the S. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. easterly; keep them in line until the Fig-tree Lights are

nearly reached, when gradually bring them in line and keep them so until the Stewart's Island Cutting Lights are coming in line; keep them in line until the Moonboon Lights are in one. Leave the Moonboon line when within half a cable of the red light, and pass at a ship's length on the port hand the green light to the north-east of the Island; then pass on the starboard hand the white light on the Great Sandy Island shore at a similar distance; then keep the red and white Roundbush Lights in line until a red light to the N.N.W. is brought in line with the back light of the next or South White Cliffs lead; keep this line until nearing the red light, when steer to pass it on the port hand at a ship's length, and bring it in line with the back light of the Roundbush lead. As the South White Cliff Lights are closing, haul up and keep on that line until approaching a red light on the beacon on the West Banks, then haul well out to the N.N.E. and leave it at a good cable's distance, a spit running out thence in that direction. When well past the red light, haul in again and bring it in line with the same leading lights.

When the steep shore of Great Sandy Island is approached follow it round the bight at a distance of a short half cable, and after passing the creek bring the two white lights on the Island in line, which lead into the main channel just to the eastward of the Junction Buoy.

On coming southwards, when passing the South White Cliffs keep the leading lights in line until the black beacon at the western end of the first Cutting is passed, then haul out to the W.S.W. until abreast the red light on the West Banks, when haul in and regain the line of lights.

Persons willing to purchase shall tender at a rate per tree. Any person whose tender for one hundred trees is accepted will be allowed to select them in the above-mentioned forest, subject to the approval of the Assistant Conservator, Western Province. He will be bound to take one hundred trees, provided that number of trees 6 ft. in girth breast-high are found in such forest, and in the opinion of the Assistant Conservator may be felled without detriment to the forest.

The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender.

The Government reserves to itself the right of accepting more than one tender up to a grand total of five hundred trees; but in the event of more than one tender being accepted, the highest bidder will be entitled to priority of selection on the above conditions and the others according to rates offered.

The purchaser shall be required to fell the whole of the trees purchased within one year.

The purchaser shall, before beginning work, sign a contract, copy of which can now be seen at the office of the Assistant Conservator, Western Province.

And whereas it is expedient to prohibit the use of the net known as the *réna-dela* within the limits of the Negombo lake as specified in the Schedule hereto annexed:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation prohibit the use of the net commonly known as the *réna-dela* in the Negombo lake:

Bounded on the north by a straight line drawn from a point one mile due east of the 29th milepost on the North Coast road, through that milepost due west to the sea; on the south by a line drawn from a point one mile due east of the 33rd milepost on the North Coast road, through that milepost due west to the sea near Kudramalai Point; on the east by a straight line running north and south and connecting the two most easterly points above-named; and on the west by the sea.
