WHEREAS by section 6 of the Ordinance No. 15 of 1889, intituled "An Ordinance relating to Land Surveyors, Auctioneers, and Brokers," it is amongst other things enacted that the persons described in Schedule A to the said Ordinance shall be exempted from passing the examination required by section 4 (1) of the said Ordinance, and that it shall be lawful for the Governor, in Executive Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to extend the said exemption to other persons who may be duly qualified to practise as licensed surveyors:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, in Executive Council, in exercise of the powers in Us vested by section 6 of the above-named Ordinance, do hereby extend the said exemption from passing the said examination to Adalbert Rajadurai Savundranayagam, who is duly qualified to practise as a licensed surveyor.

WHEREAS by section 8 of "The Police Ordinance, 1865," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to establish a police force in any place other than large towns, though such force be not maintained in the manner prescribed by the said Ordinance, and to declare that certain of the provisions of the said Ordinance shall come into operation at such place, specifying the limits thereof :

And whereas it is expedient to establish a police force under the provisions of the said section 8 of the said Ordinance at Wellawatta, Dehiwala, and Sedawatta, in the District of Colombo, Western Province, being places other than large towns, within the limits hereinafter specified, and to declare that certain of the provisions of the said Ordinance shall come into operation therein :

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in Us as aforesaid and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby as from and after the 1st day of June, 1906, establish a police force at the following places, to wit, at Wellawatta and Dehiwala and at Sedawatta in the District of Colombo, Western Province, aforesaid, the limits of which places shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, be those specified in the schedule hereto ; and We do hereby declare that the following sections of the said Ordinance, save where they or any of them shall have been by any subsequent Ordinance in anywise amended, or in part repealed, shall thereafter come into operation in the said places, viz., sections 50, 51, 53, 54, 55, 57, 58, 59, 61, 62, 63, 65, 67, 69, 70, 72, 73, 74, 78, 79, 80, 85, 87, 90, 91, 94, 95, and 98.

"THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1897."

HIS Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 4 of "The Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance, 1897," and with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make the following regulations for the purpose of preventing the spread of disease, and the same are hereby published for general information, as provided for by section 13 of the said Ordinance :—

PART I.

Regulation 31.—The proper authority may, for the purpose of these regulations or for the purpose of building temporary hospitals or segregation camps, enter upon and take possession of any lands, or demand the use of any cart, horses, or bullocks, and any person opposing such entry or refusing to comply with such demand will be liable under sections 6 and 7 of the Ordinance No. 3 of 1897 to imprisonment for six months and to a fine of Rs. 1,000.

Regulation 32.—It shall be lawful for the proper authority to destroy or otherwise deal with any property, whether movable or immovable, for the purpose of rendering material likely to spread disease innocuous, and payment of compensation for loss of any property wholly or partially destroyed shall be left to the discretion of the proper authority.

Regulation 33.—The foregoing regulations Nos. 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, and 32 apply to estates.

"THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1897."

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers in him vested by section 4 of the above-named Ordinance, and with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to amend the regulations dated the 16th December, 1901, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 20th day of December, 1901, by substituting for No. 9 of Part III. of the said regulations the following regulation, namely :—

PART III.

Regulation 9.—The proper authority may, for the purposes of these regulations or for the purpose of building temporary hospitals or segregation camps, enter upon and take possession of any lands, or

demand the use of any cart, horses, or bullocks, and any person opposing such entry or refusing to comply with such demand will be liable under sections 6 and 7 of the Ordinance No. 3 of 1897 to imprisonment for six months and to a fine of Rs. 1,000.

“ THE DESIGNS ORDINANCE, 1904.”

GENERAL RULES MADE UNDER “ THE DESIGNS ORDINANCE, 1904,”
AND ORDINANCE No. 9 of 1906.

1. On application for registration of a design to the Registrar-General the drawings, photographs, or tracings of such design, or representations or specimens furnished under section 7 of “ The Designs Ordinance, 1904,” shall be furnished by the applicant in triplicate.

2. For the purpose of registration of designs, goods shall be classified according to the classes indicated in the first schedule hereto provided, that if any doubt arises as to which class any particular description of goods belongs, the doubt shall be determined by the Registrar.

3. The fees to be paid under the said Ordinance shall be the fees specified in the second schedule hereto.

4. Before the delivery on sale of any article to which a registered design has been applied, the proprietor of such design shall, if such article is included in any of the classes 1 to 12 in the first schedule hereto, cause each such article to be marked with the letter “ R ” and the number appearing on the certificate of registration, and shall, if such article is included in the classes 13 or 14 in the first schedule hereto, cause each such article to be marked with the letters “ REG.”

FIRST SCHEDULE.

- Class 1.—Articles composed wholly or chiefly of metal not included in class 2.
- Class 2.—Jewellery.
- Class 3.—Articles composed wholly or chiefly of wood, bone, ivory, papier-maché, or other solid substances not included in other classes.
- Class 4.—Articles composed wholly or chiefly of glass, earthenware, or porcelain, bricks, tiles, or cement.
- Class 5.—Articles composed wholly or chiefly of paper (except hangings).
- Class 6.—Articles composed wholly or chiefly of leather, including bookbinding of all materials.
- Class 7.—Paper hangings.
- Class 8.—Carpets and rugs in all materials, floor cloths, and oil cloths.
- Class 9.—Lace, hosiery.
- Class 10.—Millinery and wearing apparel, including boots and shoes.
- Class 11.—Ornamental needlework on muslin or other textile fabrics.
- Class 12.—Goods not included in other classes.
- Class 13.—Printed or woven designs on textile piece goods.
- Class 14.—Printed or woven designs on handkerchiefs and shawls.

"THE TRADE MARKS ORDINANCE, 1888."

THE following general rules made by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in him by section 40 (1) of "The Trade Marks Ordinance, 1888," as amended by Ordinances No. 4 of 1890, No. 6 of 1904, and No. 9 of 1906, for the several purposes mentioned in the said section 40 (1), are hereby published for general information.

PRELIMINARY.

Preliminary. 1. These rules may be cited as the "Trade Marks Rules, 1906," and shall come into operation from and immediately after the publication of the same in the *Government Gazette*.

INTERPRETATION.

Interpretation. 2. In the construction of these rules any words herein used, defined by the said Ordinance, shall have the meaning thereby assigned to them respectively.

FEES.

Fees. 3. The fees to be paid in pursuance of the said Ordinance shall be the fees specified in the First Schedule hereto, and shall be paid by means of revenue stamps affixed to the several documents.

FORMS.

Forms. 4. The forms in the Second Schedule to these rules may be used in all cases to which they are applicable.

CLASSIFICATION OF GOODS.

Classification of goods. 5. For the purposes of trade marks registration and of these rules, goods are classified in the manner appearing in the Third Schedule hereto. If any doubt arises as to what class any particular description of goods belongs to, the doubt shall be determined by the Registrar-General.

APPLICATION FOR REGISTRATION.

Application by firm. 6. An application for registration of a trade mark, if made by any firm or partnership, may be signed by some one or more members of such firm or partnership, as the case may be. If the application be made by a body corporate, it may be signed by the Secretary or other principal officer of such body corporate.

Agency. 7. An application for registration and all other communications between the applicant and the Registrar-General may be made by or through an agent duly authorized to the satisfaction of the Registrar-General.

Acknowledgment of application. 8. On receipt of the application the Registrar-General shall furnish the applicant with an acknowledgment thereof.

Contents of form of application. 9. When application is made to register a trade mark which was used by the applicant or his predecessors in business before the coming into operation of the said Ordinance, the application shall contain a statement of the time during which, and of the persons by whom, it has been so used in respect of the goods mentioned in the application.

Size, &c., of documents. 10. Subject to any other directions that may be given by the Registrar-General, all applications, notices, counter-statements, representations of marks, papers having representations affixed, or other documents required by the said Ordinance or by these rules to be left with or sent to the Registrar-General, shall be upon foolscap paper of a size of 13 in. by 8 in., and shall have on the left-hand part thereof a margin of not less than one inch and a half.

Qualification of metal goods. 11. In the case of an application for the registration of a trade mark used on any metal goods, the applicant shall state in the specification of goods in the form of application of what metal or metals the goods in respect to which he applies are made.

Representations
of trade mark.

12. Subject to any other directions that may be given by the Registrar-General, three representations of each trade mark must be supplied upon paper of the size aforesaid, and must be of a durable nature. One of such representations must be made upon or affixed to the form of application; the others upon separate half-sheets. In the case of trade marks exceeding the limits of the foolscap paper of the size aforesaid, such marks may be pasted and folded upon the sheets of foolscap.

Where a drawing or other representation or specimen cannot be given in manner aforesaid, a specimen or copy of the trade mark may be sent either of full size or on a reduced scale, and in such form as the Registrar-General may think most convenient. The Registrar-General may, if dissatisfied with the representation of a trade mark, require a fresh representation, either before he proceeds with the application or before he registers the trade mark. The Registrar-General may also, in exceptional cases, deposit in the Registrar-General's Office a specimen or copy of any trade mark which cannot conveniently be shown by a representation, and may refer thereto in the register in such manner as he may think fit.

Representations
of a series of
trade marks.

13. When an application relates to a series of trade marks differing from one another in respect of the particulars mentioned in section 7 of the said Ordinance, a representation of each trade mark of the series shall be made or affixed upon the form of application, and also upon each of the separate half-sheets of paper aforesaid.

Translation of
foreign
characters.

14. Whenever a mark consists of or includes words printed in other than Roman characters, there shall be given at the foot or on the back of each representation a translation of such words, signed by the applicant or his agent.

Mode of sending
notices, &c.

15. Any application, statement, notice, or other document authorized or required to be left, made, or given at the Registrar-General's Office or to the Registrar-General or to any other person under these rules, may be sent through the post, and if so sent shall be deemed to have been left, made, or given respectively at the time when the letter containing the same would be delivered in the ordinary course of post.

In proving such service or sending, it shall be sufficient to prove that the letter was properly addressed and put into the post.

EXERCISE OF DISCRETIONARY POWERS.

Hearing by
Registrar-
General.

16. Before exercising any discretionary power given to the Registrar-General by the said Ordinance adversely to the applicant for registration of a trade mark, the Registrar-General shall give him ten days' notice of the time when he may be heard personally or by his agent before the Registrar-General.

Notice of wish
to be heard
before Registrar-
General.

17. Within five days from the date when such notice would be delivered in the ordinary course of post the applicant shall notify to the Registrar-General whether or not he intends to be heard upon the matter.

Notification of
decision.

18. The decision of the Registrar-General in the exercise of any such discretionary power as aforesaid shall be notified to the applicant.

ADVERTISEMENT OF APPLICATION.

Advertisement
of application.

19. Every application shall be advertised by the Registrar-General in the *Government Gazette* and in one or more of the local newspapers, during such times and in such manner as the Registrar-General may direct.

If no representation of the trade mark be inserted in the *Gazette* and in one or more of the local newspapers in connection with the advertisement of an application, the Registrar-

General shall refer in such advertisement to the place or places where a specimen or representation of the trade mark is deposited for exhibition.

Costs of advertisement to be prepaid.

20. Before advertising in the *Government Gazette* and in one or more of the local newspapers, the Registrar-General may require the applicant to pay the costs of advertising in such local newspaper or newspapers as the Registrar-General may elect.

Means of advertising trade mark to be supplied to Registrar-General.

21. For the purposes of such advertisement the applicant may be required to furnish a wood block or electrotype (or more than one if necessary) of the trade mark, of such dimensions as may from time to time be directed by the Registrar-General, with such other information or means of advertising the trade mark as may be required by the Registrar-General; and the Registrar-General, if dissatisfied with the block or electrotype furnished by the applicant or his agent, may require a fresh block or electrotype before proceeding with the advertisement.

Advertisement of series.

22. When an application relates to a series of trade marks differing from one another in respect of the particulars mentioned in section 7 of the said Ordinance, the applicant may be required to furnish a wood block or electrotype (or more than one if necessary) of any or of each of the trade marks constituting the series; and the Registrar-General may, if he thinks fit, insert with the advertisement of the application a statement of the manner in respect of which the several trade marks differ from one another.

OPPOSITION TO REGISTRATION.

Opposition to registration.

23. The notice required by section 11 of the said Ordinance to be given to the Registrar-General shall be given by delivering at or sending to the Registrar-General's Office a copy of the application or other initiatory proceeding, bearing an endorsement by the applicant or his proctor that notice of the application or other initiatory proceeding has been served on the opponent.

REGISTER OF TRADE MARKS.

Time of registration of trade marks.

24. As soon as may be after the expiration of two months from the date of the first advertisement of the application, the Registrar-General shall, subject to any application or other proceedings under section 11 of the said Ordinance and the determination of the court thereon, if he is satisfied that the applicant is entitled to registration, and on payment of the prescribed fee, enter the name, address, and description of the applicant in the Register of Trade Marks as the registered proprietor of the trade mark in respect of the particular goods or classes of goods described in his application.

When applicant dies before registration, the trade mark may be registered for successor to goodwill of business.

25. In case of the death of any applicant for a trade mark after the date of his application and before the trade mark applied for has been entered on the register, the Registrar-General, after the expiration of the prescribed period of advertisement, may, on being satisfied of the applicant's death, enter on the register in place of the name of such deceased applicant the name, address, and description of the person owning the goodwill of the business, if such ownership be proved to the satisfaction of the Registrar-General.

Entries to be made in register.

26. Upon registering any trade mark the Registrar-General shall enter in the register the date on which the application for registration was received by the Registrar-General (which day shall be deemed to be the date of registration) and such other particulars as he may think necessary.

Notice of registration.

27. The Registrar-General shall send notice to the applicant of the registration of the trade mark, together with a reference to the advertisement of such trade mark in the *Government Gazette* and local newspapers.

Request by subsequent proprietors.

28. When a person becomes entitled to a registered trade mark by assignment, transmission, or other operation of law,

	a request for the entry of his name in the register as proprietor of the trade mark shall be addressed to the Registrar-General and left at the Registrar-General's Office.
Signature of requests.	29. Such request shall, in the case of an individual, be made and signed by the person requiring to be registered as proprietor, and in the case of a firm or partnership by some one or more members of such firm or partnership, or in either case by his or their agent respectively, duly authorized to the satisfaction of the Registrar-General, and in the case of a body corporate by its agent authorized in like manner.
Contents of request.	30. Every such request shall state the name, address, and description of the person claiming to be entitled to the trade mark (hereinafter called the claimant), and the particulars of the assignment, transmission, or other operation of law by virtue of which he requires to be entered on the register as proprietor, so as to show the manner in which, and the person or persons to whom, the trade mark has been assigned or transmitted, and so as to show further that it has been so assigned or transmitted in connection with the goodwill of the business concerned in the particular goods or classes of goods for which the trade mark has been registered.
Affidavit to accompany request.	31. Every such request shall be accompanied by an affidavit, to be thereunderwritten, verifying the several statements therein, and declaring that the particulars above described comprise every material fact and document affecting the proprietorship of the trade mark as claimed by such request.
Further proof of title if required.	32. The claimant shall furnish to the Registrar-General such other proof of title and of the existence and ownership of such goodwill as aforesaid as he may require for his satisfaction.
Body corporate.	33. A body corporate may be registered as proprietor by its corporate name.
Definition of "applicant."	34. The term "applicant" in rules 16, 17, and 18 shall include each of several persons claiming to be registered as proprietor of the same trade mark.
Registrar-General may require statements from rival claimants.	35. Whether all of such persons so claiming require to be heard before the Registrar-General or not, he may, before exercising the discretion vested in him by section 13 of the said Ordinance, require such persons, or any or either of them, to submit a statement in writing, within a time to be notified by him, or to attend before him and make oral explanation with respect to such matters as the Registrar-General may require.
Certified copy of order of court to be left at Registrar-General's Office.	36. When an order has been made by the court in any of the following cases: (a) disallowing an opposition to registration under section 10 of the said Ordinance, or (b) under the provisions of sections 15, 28, or 30 of the said Ordinance, the person in whose favour such order has been made, or such one of them if more than one as the Registrar-General may direct, shall forthwith leave at the Registrar-General's Office a certified copy of such order. The register shall thereupon be rectified or altered, or the purpose of such order shall otherwise be duly entered in the register, as the case may be.
Removal of mark from register.	37. Where a trade mark has been removed from the register for non-payment of the prescribed fee or otherwise, under the provisions of section 22 of the said Ordinance, the Registrar-General shall cause to be entered in the register a record of such removal and the cause thereof.
Alteration of address in register.	38. If the registered proprietor of a trade mark send to the Registrar-General, together with the prescribed fee, notice of an alteration in his address, the Registrar-General shall alter the register accordingly.
Publication of rectification or variation of register.	39. Whenever an order is made by the court for making, expunging, or varying an entry from or in the register, the Registrar-General shall, if he thinks that such rectification or variation should be made public, and at the expense of the

person applying for the same, publish by advertisement or otherwise, and in such manner as he thinks just, the circumstances attending the rectification or variation in the register.

Notice to Registrar-General of intention to apply to Court for alteration of trade mark under section 30 of Ordinance.

40. Whenever the registered proprietor of any trade mark intends to apply for leave of the court to add to or to alter such trade mark, under section 30 of the said Ordinance, the notice to be given to the Registrar-General shall be given fourteen days at least before such application; if leave be granted on such application, the applicant shall forthwith supply to the Registrar-General such a number of representations of the trade mark as altered as he may deem sufficient.

INSPECTION OF REGISTER.

Hours of inspection.

41. The register of trade marks shall be open to the inspection of the public, on payment of the prescribed fee, on every week day between the hours of 11 and 4, except on the days and at the times following:—

- (a) On public holidays and bank holidays;
- (b) On any special day appointed by the Governor under the provisions of section 9 of "The Holidays Ordinance, 1886," to be a public holiday or a bank holiday;
- (c) Days which may from time to time be notified by a placard posted in a conspicuous place at the Registrar-General's Office;
- (d) Times when the register is required for any purpose of official use.

POWER TO DISPENSE WITH EVIDENCE.

Dispensing with evidence.

42. Where under these rules any person is required to do any act or thing, or to sign any document, or to make any affidavit on behalf of himself or of any body corporate, or any document or evidence is required to be produced to or left with the Registrar-General, or at the Registrar-General's Office, and it is shown to the satisfaction of the Registrar-General that from any reasonable cause such person is unable to do such act or thing, or to sign such document or make such affidavit, or that such document or evidence cannot be produced or left as aforesaid, it shall be lawful for the Registrar-General, upon the production of such other evidence, and subject to such terms as the Registrar-General may think fit, to dispense with any such act or thing, document, affidavit, or evidence.

AMENDMENTS.

Amendment of documents.

43. Any document or drawing or other representation of a trade mark, for the amending of which no special provision is made by the said Ordinance, may be amended, and any irregularity in procedure which in the opinion of the Registrar-General may be obviated without any detriment to the interests of any person, may be corrected, if the Registrar-General thinks fit, and on such terms as he may direct.

ENLARGEMENT OF TIME.

The Registrar-General may enlarge time.

44. The time prescribed by these rules for doing any act, or taking any proceeding thereunder, may be enlarged by the Registrar-General, if he thinks fit, and upon such notice to other parties, and proceedings thereon, and upon such terms, as he may direct.

CERTIFICATES.

Certificate by Registrar-General.

45. The Registrar-General, when required, for the purpose of any legal proceeding or other special purpose, to give a certificate as to any entry, matter, or thing which he is authorized by the said Ordinance or any of these rules to make or do, may, on receipt of a request in writing, and on payment of the prescribed fee, give such certificate, and shall specify on the face of it the legal proceeding or other purpose for which such certificate is granted.

AFFIDAVITS.

- Manner in which and persons before whom affidavit is to be taken.
46. The affidavits required by the said Ordinance and these rules, or used in any proceedings thereunder, shall be made and subscribed as follows :—
- 1) In Ceylon, before any justice of the peace or any officer authorized by law to administer an oath or affirmation for the purpose of any legal proceeding.
 - (2) In the United Kingdom, before any justice of the peace or any commissioner or other officer authorized by law in any part of the United Kingdom to administer an oath for the purpose of any legal proceeding ;
 - (3) In any other part of Her Majesty's Dominions, before any court, judge, justice of the peace, or any officer authorized by law to administer an oath there for the purpose of a legal proceeding ; and
 - (4) If made out of Her Majesty's Dominions, before a British Minister, or person exercising the functions of a British Minister, or a Consul, Vice-Consul, or other person exercising the functions of a British Consul, or a notary public, or before a judge or magistrate.
- Notice of seal of officer taking affidavit to prove itself.
47. Any document purporting to have affixed, impressed, or subscribed thereto or thereon the seal or signature of any person hereby authorized to take such affidavit in testimony of such affidavit having been made and subscribed before him, may be admitted by the Registrar-General without proof of the genuineness of any such seal or signature, or of the official character of such person, or his authority to take such affidavit.

CLASSIFICATION OF GOODS

General Note.—Any wares made of mixed materials (for example, of both cotton and silk) shall be included in such one of the classes appropriated to those materials as the registrar may desire.

Classification of Goods.

*Illustrations.**

Class 1.

Chemical substances used in manufactures, photography, or philosophical research and anticorrosives.

Such as—Acids (including vegetable acids), alkalies, artists' colours, pigments, mineral dyes.

Class 2.

Chemical substances used for agricultural, horticultural, veterinary, and sanitary purposes.

Such as—Artificial manure, cattle medicines, deodorisers, vermin destroyers.

Class 3.

Chemical substances prepared for use in medicine and pharmacy.

Such as—Codliver-oil, medicated articles, patent medicines, plasters, rhubarb.

Class 4.

Raw or partly prepared vegetable, animal, and mineral substances used in manufactures, not included in other classes.

Such as—Resins, oils used in manufactures and not included in other classes, dyes other than mineral, tanning substances, fibrous substances (*e.g.*, cotton, hemp, flax, jute), wool, silk, bristles, hair, feathers, cork, seeds, coal, coke, bone, sponge.

Class 5.

Unwrought and partly wrought metals used in manufactures.

Such as—Iron and steel (pig or cast), rough iron, iron bar and rail (including rails) for railways, iron bolt and rod, sheet iron and boiler and armour plates, hoop iron, pig lead, rolled lead, sheet lead, wire, copper, zinc, gold in ingots.

Class 6.

Machinery of all kinds and parts of machinery, except agricultural and horticultural machines included in class 7.

The regulation to take effect from the 1st June, 1906 :—

Regulation 19.—No person or goods coming in or brought by a coasting vessel from any port or place in India shall land or be landed anywhere on the coast of the Northern Province of this Island, or on any island adjacent thereto, or on the west coast of this Island between Colombo and the southern limit of the Northern Province, or on any island adjacent to such west coast : provided that nothing in this regulation shall be taken as prohibiting the landing of goods from any such vessel or boat at the ports of Kayts and Kankasanturai, and provided also that it shall be lawful for the Government Agent of the Northern Province to permit labourers for the Government service to land at Kayts after due medical examination and, if necessary, segregation.

Any goods landed in contravention of the provisions of this regulation, and any vessel or boat from which any person or goods may land or be landed in contravention of the provisions of this regulation, shall be liable to forfeiture and may be seized by any Police or Customs Officer, and may be destroyed or otherwise disposed of as the Principal Collector of Customs shall direct.

3. Clerks in Government service, from whatever funds they may be paid, who have completed three years' satisfactory service and are not members of the Customs, Postal, Survey, or Railway Departments, and those clerks employed by Provincial and District Road Committees, whose appointments date prior to July 1, 1875, are eligible for examination irrespective of age and without fee. Their applications (in the same form, Schedule A) for admission to the examination should be forwarded to the Director of Public Instruction through the Heads of their Departments.

4. Applications are to reach the Director of Public Instruction not later than 2 P.M. on Saturday, June 30, 1906; any applications received after that hour, by whatever cause delayed, will be absolutely rejected.

5. The Director of Public Instruction will return to the candidate his application, approved or disapproved as the case may be, after taking, if necessary, the orders of Government thereon. The approved application shall constitute the candidate's ticket of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination at the station at which they present themselves their forms of application, approved by the Director of Public Instruction. A candidate not producing such form, whatever may be the reason for his not so doing, will be refused admittance to the examination.

6. Examinations will be held at Colombo and Jaffna only, in the places and under the supervision of the officers specified in Schedule B. Heads of Departments are required to grant to officers of their Departments, whose applications to present themselves for examination have been returned to them approved by the Director of Public Instruction, leave to present themselves at the most conveniently situated station at which the examination is to be held.

7. The examination will be competitive. The number of places assigned for competition will be thirty.

8. The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.

9. The subjects for examination are those set out in Schedule C to this notice. The examination shall be held in two parts: the first part, a qualifying examination in Handwriting, Spelling, and Arithmetic. Any candidate failing to obtain two-thirds of the marks allotted for Handwriting and half those allowed for Spelling and Arithmetic respectively shall be excluded from the remainder of the examination. Special attention will be paid to Handwriting, and candidates whose writing is untidy or illegible or contains defects in the formation of letters will be rigorously excluded. The kind of writing preferred will be that generally known as the "Civil Service" hand. The second part of the examination shall be in the remaining subjects in Schedule C. Should a candidate obtain less than one-third of the aggregate marks for the three subjects—Composition, General Paper, Précis Writing—or less than one-fourth marks in any other subject, or, if he be a Sinhalese or Tamil, less than one-half of the marks in his native language, such marks shall not be counted in his favour. In all the written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling.

10. Clerks of the description given in section 3 above, who have served Government continuously for over six years, will be allowed to compete amongst themselves, and will be eligible, if they obtain a minimum of 66 per cent. in Writing and 33 per cent. in the other compulsory subjects, for seven of the appointments offered for competition. Three of the appointments will be reserved as prizes for deserving clerks of the same description, who have served Government continuously for ten years and upwards, to be selected irrespective of examination. No service under the age of sixteen years will be reckoned for this purpose.

MISCELLANEOUS DEPARTMENTAL NOTICES.

COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended 26th May, 1906, is subjoined (A).

Births.—The total births were 80. The birth-rate per 1,000 was 24·1,* as against 29·5 in the preceding week and 18·7 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 124. The death-rate per 1,000 was 37·3,* as against 33·4 in the previous week and 31·0 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—No persons died from cholera, smallpox, or measles; 23 died from diarrhoea and dysentery; 26 from phthisis, bronchitis, and pneumonia; 16 from different kinds of fever; and 11 from infantile convulsions.

Infantile deaths.—Of the 124 total deaths, 29 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 33 in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Tenders should be submitted in duplicate, the original being forwarded to the Controller of Government Stores and the duplicate to the Hon. the Auditor-General, both being required to be forwarded at the same time. No tender forms will be issued on the day the tenders are due.

2. A deposit of Rs. 50 will be required before any form of tender is issued; and should any person decline to enter into the contract and bond after he has tendered, or fail to furnish approved security, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown. All other deposits will be returned upon signature of contract. The deposit must be made in the Bank of Madras to the credit of the Controller of Government Stores, No. 3 Account, and the deposit receipt must be produced to the officer issuing the form of tender as his authority for making the issue.

3.
