Treasury Minute dated November 30, 1868:

THE attention of this Board has been frequently given to cases of bankruptcy and insolvency on the part of persons holding offices in the Public Service, and likewise to a practice which has been found to prevail, to some extent, amongst Clerks and others, of putting their names on what are called accommodation bills, and thus getting themselves involved in the pecuniary difficulties of others.

My Lords have reason to believe that there are persons, discounters of bills, who, taking advantage of the inexperience of young men, usually when they first enter into the Public Service, and inducing them to put their names on bills, supply them with money at exorbitant rates of interest, in the expectation that by threats of the exposure and consequent dismissal of these young men their parents or other relatives may be induced to discharge these exorbitant demands.

It has been the anxious desire of every Department in the State of late years, and Parliament has liberally co-operated, to raise the Civil Servants of the Crown in efficiency and general estimation; but it is obvious that all efforts on the part of Government or the Heads of Departments to raise the standard of the Civil Service must be to a great extent unsuccessful so long as Members of the Service thus allow themselves to be involved in pecuniary difficulties, and to become the victims of usurious money-lenders.

It is unnecessary for my Lords to point out that this pernicious practice must be destructive of those feelings of honour and independence which my Lords are happy to state are, and their Lordships trust will be always, characteristic of all classes of Her Majesty's Civil Servants. The young man who puts his name upon a bill for a sum of money, suffering a discount which sometimes amounts, as my Lords are informed, to 50 or even 60 per cent., must necessarily lose all feelings of independence and self-respect; he becomes the miserable dependent of the usurer who has ministered to his extravagance; his course must be downwards, and he too frequently resorts to the meanness of an untruth, in the hope of concealing his indiscretion or extravagance.

Very painful instances have occurred, in which, from these causes, my Lords have been obliged to dismiss from the Civil Service of Her Majesty gentlemen whose abilities and attainments might have raised them to high positions.

But the practices referred to lead to further and serious public inconvenience: not only does the general character of the Service suffer materially, but the value of the individual officer is necessarily deteriorated by the position in which he is placed in consequence of such improvident habits. As observed in a Minute of the Board of Stamps and Taxes, dated the 23rd of June, 1862, "an efficient performance of his official duty is not to be expected from any person involved in pecuniary difficulties, as the time and thoughts of such a person, instead of being engaged in his official business, must necessarily be occupied in constant efforts to meet the exigencies of the day: and further, it is highly inexpedient that any officer in such circumstances should be placed in a position of trust."

Not unfrequently the pecuniary embarrassment of an employé in the Public Service is the cause of absence from his duties, either with the view of avoiding the importunity of his creditors or of obtaining protection under the Bankruptcy Act. And where such protection is accorded, independently of the inconvenience and discredit to the Service, as is well observed in the Minute of the Board of Customs of 9th April, 1866, "the officer is placed by this course in a very difficult position, as it generally happens that upon the final discharge of the party the Court orders a portion of his salary to be appropriated to the liquidation of his debts, varying in amount according to the circumstances of each case." By this course the Public Service is damaged. The officer upon his return to duty is called upon to act, very probably in a responsible situation, with diminished salary, disproportional to the value of the service required of him, and with a character in some manner impaired.

It is the firm determination of the Board of Treasury to adopt every means within their Lordships' power for correcting such evils as these in the Public Service, and with this object my Lords have caused to be prepared, for the guidance of the Departments subordinate to this Board, the accompanying rules, founded upon those which have been long in existence in the Revenue Establishments and in the Audit Department. Their Lordships' desire that these rules may be transmitted to all Public Departments, in the hope that, by an uniform course of action in such cases by the Heads of Offices, an effectual check may be placed upon the practices referred to.

My Lords, however, appeal with confidence not only to the Heads of Departments and gentlemen of experience and position in the Civil Service, but to the Junior Members of the Service themselves, to co-operate with them in repressing the evils to which they have referred.

Appointments in the Civil Service, at the very outset, are now made the reward of merit. Promotion by merit is the established rule in the Service; and to every young man who becomes the servant of the Crown in the Civil Service a way is open to independence and even eminence.

But my Lords are desirous of impressing upon the Members of the Civil Service that, in proportion as these advantages are increased, in the same degree does it become imperative as a duty, and one which my Lords on their part are, to the utmost of their power, resolved to discharge, to maintain rigidly the moral standard of the Service and the independent position of its Members.

My Lords are fully aware that there are cases in which pecuniary embarrassments are the result of causes beyond control. A gentleman in the Civil Service with a small salary may unavoidably fall into difficulties from sickness in his family or from other similar causes; there can be no discredit in such cases, and there will be found no indisposition to treat them with the consideration they deserve.

The rules which my Lords would enforce and recommend for general observance are as follows:

1. That it is to be understood that serious pecuniary embarrassment, from whatever cause, must be regarded as a circumstance which necessarily has the effect of impairing the efficiency of a Public Servant, and of rendering him less valuable than he would otherwise be.

2. That such embarrassment, if occasioned by imprudence or other reprehensible cause, will be held to be an offence, as affecting the respectability of the Service and the trustworthiness of the individual; any person who has so conducted himself will be considered to have forfeited that honourable position in the Service which is necessary to give him a claim to promotion or increase of salary from length of service; and these benefits will not be permitted to accrue to him again until he shall have relieved himself from the discredit of such a position. Aggravated cases of this description will be noticed whenever they become known; and such measures will be taken either in the manner above adverted to, or in a manner more summary and severe, as the circumstances may appear to deserve.

3. That the mere fact, under whatever plea, of becoming a party to accommodation bills, whether for his own purposes or for another person, and whether resulting in pecuniary embarrassment or not, will subject a Civil Servant to the consequences described in the preceding paragraph.

4. That in the event of any Civil Servant being arrested, or being adjudicated a bankrupt, or entering into a composition with his creditors under the Bankruptcy Act, he will, on the fact being known, be suspended from duty and salary, and will not be reinstated unless, after examination of the facts and of the schedule prepared by the Court, it shall appear that his difficulties have been occasioned by unavoidable misfortune, and not by extravagance or culpable improvidence, or unless the case shall be characterised by previous circumstances of extenuation.

5. That any person who shall not immediately, on his being arrested, or proceedings being taken with a view to bankruptcy, inform the Head of his Department of the fact, shall, upon its becoming known, be removed from the Service without any expectation of being reinstated.

BY-LAWS regarding Carriages licensed to ply for Hire along the road from Kandy to Teldeniya via Gonawatta ferry.

1. All licensed carriages other than bakkeries shall be divided into first and second class carriages.

2. The Government Agent shall determine the class of, and the number of persons to be carried in, each licensed carriage; and such class and number shall be painted in a conspicuous part on the outside of such carriage, and shall at all times be plainly and distinctly visible and legible. An infant carried in arms or on the lap, or one child not so carried but under eight years of age, shall not be deemed a passenger; but two children under eight years of age not so carried shall be considered an adult passenger, and so on in the same proportion for any number of children. No person to whom any license shall have been granted shall refuse to carry the full number so determined, or shall carry more than the said number.

3. Every carriage shall have and carry two good and sufficient lamps, one on either side of the driver ready for lighting; and the same shall be lighted if the carriage be used between the hours of 6.30 P.M. and 5.30 A.M.

4. An Inspector, being thereto authorised by the Government Agent in writing, shall, at least once a month or oftener, if such Inspector deem necessary, inspect all carriages licensed to ply for hire, in the above-mentioned road, and the harness and the horse or horses used in drawing such carriage, and the other equipments, and shall submit a report thereof to the Government Agent. If any such carriage or horse or horses or other equipment shall at any time, upon such inspection be found unfit for public use, notice in writing of the same shall be given by the Government Agent to the owner of such carriage, and after such notice he shall not use or suffer to be used, or let to hire, such carriage until the same or the harness or the horse and horses used for and in drawing the same, or the other equipments, shall have been declared by the Government Agent to be in a fit condition.

5. The table of fares fixed by these by-laws, printed or inscribed on a card or plate, shall be affixed inside in some conspicuous part of every carriage plying for hire, and such card or plate shall be left so affixed and legible and undefaced during all the time the carriage shall ply or be used for hire:—

For a second class carriage drawn by one horse,—the above rates to be reduced by one-third.

For a first or second class carriage drawn by two horses,—the rates as for a first or second class carriage drawn by one horse to be increased respectively by one-third.

6. No carriage, which is unsafe or in bad repair, or otherwise unfit for the accommodation and conveyance of passengers, shall be used to carry passengers.

7. No driver of any carriage shall suffer the same to stand or loiter in any street, or alongside of any other carriage (except for the purpose of setting down or taking up any passengers), nor shall he obstruct the driver of any other carriage in taking up or setting down any person, or wilfully, wrongfully, or forcibly prevent or endeavour to prevent the driver of any other carriage from taking a fare.

8. Every driver shall wear a jacket or coat, and shall carry a badge, such badge to be provided by the Government Agent and to bear the number of the carriage license.

9. In case of any property being left in any such carriage by any person who may have hired or used the same, the owner or driver of such carriage shall, within 24 hours after such property shall have been found in such carriage, take the same or cause it to be taken in the state in which it was found to the district kachcheri or nearest police station to be there deposited for reclamation; and the owner or driver delivering such property or causing the same to be delivered shall be entitled to a remuneration of 25 cents, payable by the owner of such property (if the same does not consist of jewellery) before the same be allowed to be removed. If, however, the property found consist of jewellery, the owner thereof shall pay to the owner or driver a fee or remuneration of one rupee.

If the property so found in any such carriage and deposited in the district kachcheri or nearest police station shall not be claimed by the true owner thereof within one month of such deposit, the said property shall be sold by public auction after due notice of such intended sale in one or more of the local papers, and the proceeds of such sale, less expenses incurred in and about the publication of such sale, shall go to the general revenue.

SEALED Tenders (in duplicate), marked on the envelopes "Tender for the purchase of Hora Trees," will be received at the Colonial Secretary's Office up to noon on Monday, March 3 next, from persons willing to purchase one hundred hora trees, 6 ft. or more in girth at breast-height, standing in the forest called Indekadumukalana, Udugaha pattuwa, Hewagam korale.

Persons willing to purchase shall tender at a rate per tree. Any person whose tender for one hundred trees is accepted will be allowed to select them in the above-mentioned forest, subject to the approval of the Assistant Conservator, Western Province. He will be bound to take one hundred trees, provided that number of trees 6 ft. in girth breast-high are found in such forest, and in the opinion of the Assistant Conservator may be felled without detriment to the forest.

The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender.

The Government reserves to itself the right of accepting more than one tender up to a grand total of five hundred trees ; but in the event of more than one tender being accepted, the highest bidder will be entitled to priority of selection on the above conditions and the others according to rates offered.

The purchaser shall be required to fell the whole of the trees purchased within one year.

The purchaser shall, before beginning work, sign a contract, copy of which can now be seen at the office of the Assistant Conservator, Western Province.

At the time of signature of the contract the purchaser shall pay one-half of the purchase money and the other half within one year.

The tenders must be made on forms which will be supplied upon application to the Assistant Conservator of Forests at the Colombo Kachcheri, and no tender will be considered unless it is furnished on the recognised form.

A deposit of Rs. 100 will be required before any form of tender is issued; and should any person decline to enter into the contract after he has tendered, such deposit shall be forfeited to the Crown. All other deposits will be returned upon signature of a contract.

The temporary light will be fixed white and show round from S. 10° E. to N. 52° E. The bearings are true, and taken from the light. It will be elevated 193 ft. above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 15 nautical miles.

It will be exhibited from the night of February 20, 1890; on which night the permanent light will be discontinued.

IT is hereby notified that the rules set forth in the Schedule hereto have been made by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under the provisions of Ordinance No. 27 of 1884, or the Province of Sabaragamuwa:—

SCHEDULE.

1. Every occupier of any land on which any well (or pit) shall be made shall fence every such well (or pit) within a period of thirty days after notice in that behalf has been served upon him.
2. Every inspector of wells shall hold an annual inspection of all the wells in his district.
3. Every occupier shall be noticed by such inspector to repair the fencing of his wells when necessary, and to execute such repairs within three days from the date of such notice.
4. Every such notice may be served either personally on the occupier, or by leaving it at his usual place of abode, or by affixing it on a conspicuous part of the land where the well is situated.
5. (1) Masonry or brick fencing shall consist of a solid wall built of bricks or stone set in well-slaked mortar or cement round the well to the height of two and a half feet, and not less than nine inches in thickness throughout.
- (2) Timber fencing shall consist of posts not less than nine inches in circumference, not more than one foot apart, and fastened with three cross pieces.
- (3) Stake fencing shall consist of warichches close together with three cross pieces.
6. It shall be optional to the Government Agent of the Province to select any one or more of these descriptions of fencing as the fencing to be used in his Province, and to determine to what towns and villages the different descriptions of fencing shall be applied.
7. The height of the fencing of all wells shall be not less than two and a half feet.
