5.—Survey Plans.

Extract from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary's letter to the Inspector-General of Police, No. 240/03374 of May 25, 1906.

HIS Excellency sees no reason for the very elaborate survey plans which are now so commonly produced in criminal cases. In the large majority of cases rough sketches with distances accurately marked, which can be made by any intelligent man, should suffice. Where great accuracy is required as to interior details, &c., the work should be entrusted to a qualified surveyor, and the Surveyor-General, who is the best judge of a fair remuneration, should be consulted as to the fees to be paid to him.

6.—Mourning for the late the Hon. Mr. H. Wace, C.M.G.

Order No. 3.

All officers of the Police entitled to wear white uniform will wear mourning for the late the Hon. Mr. H. Wace, C.M.G., until June 29. The mourning band should not exceed three inches in depth, and should be worn on the upper part of the left arm.
