Part I.—Departmental Orders.

1.—All Departmental Orders will in future be published in Part I. of the *Ceylon Police Gazette*, which should be filed separately from Part II., which will consist of the old "Hue and Cry."

2.—The Inspector-General's Circular Guard File is abolished.

3.—Supply of Hooks to men in Colombo and the Depot.

Order No. 5.

HOOKS to support the belt will be supplied to all men in Colombo and the Depot at the rate of two hooks per man. They should be fixed on to tabs sewn on to the inside of the coat and brought through the side seams of the coat, and the belt should be worn inside and resting on the hooks.

All recruits will be given hooks when being fitted out with blue serge clothing, and officers should be careful to see that they wear them. The other Provinces will be supplied gradually.
