WHEREAS by section 28 of "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof, or by a Commissioner of Assize duly appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance, for each of the Circuits into which the Island is divided, for hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offence—

For the Midland Circuit, three times at least at Kandy and such other places in such Circuit as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint; such Sessions commencing at Kandy on March 10, on August 1, and on December 1, in every year:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to order that a Criminal Session of the Supreme Court should be holden, on the day hereinafter mentioned, at Badulla, a place included within the said Midland Circuit;

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Governor, for sufficient reasons to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do order and appoint that a Criminal Session of the Supreme Court shall be holden at Badulla, in the said Midland Circuit, on or about Monday, the Tenth day of September, 1906.

## MISCELLANEOUS DEPARTMENTAL NOTICES.

## COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended 4th August, 1906, is subjoined (A).

*Births.*—The total births were 90. The birth-rate per 1,000 was 27·1,\* as against 27·1 in the preceding week and 20·3 in the corresponding week of last year.

*Deaths.*—The total deaths were 136. The death-rate per 1,000 was 41·0,\* as against 43·9 in the previous week and 33·8 in the corresponding week of last year.

*Causes of death.*—1 person died from cholera; 20 died from diarrhoea and dysentery; 20 from phthisis, bronchitis, and pneumonia; 17 from different kinds of fever; and 2 from infantile convulsions.

*Infantile deaths.*—Of the 136 total deaths, 19 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 25 in the corresponding week of the previous year.

## THE CEYLON RUBBER EXHIBITION.

### General Rules and Regulations.

- The Exhibition will be open from September 13th to September 27th (Sundays excepted).  
Charges for admission to Show—  
Rs. 5 season ticket ;  
Re. 1 daily for first week—September 13th to 20th inclusive ;  
50 cents daily for second week—September 21st to 27th inclusive.
- The Exhibition will be open between 7.30 A.M. and 6 P.M.
- All exhibits to be the *bona fide* property of the exhibitor or of the estate on behalf of which the exhibit is made.
- Competition for prizes are open to exhibitors in (1) Ceylon only, (2) Ceylon and Abroad, (3) India, (4) Malay Peninsula, as specified in the List of Prizes.
- Exhibits may bear the name of the estate from which they are exhibited or any other distinctive mark.
- All exhibits to be accompanied by a ticket giving the name of the exhibitor and the number of the class in which the article is offered for competition.
- The number to be attached to the article exhibited should be that given in the List of Awards as specified in the Catalogue.
- No single exhibit can compete for more than one prize ; this does not prevent an exhibitor from entering duplicate samples for other prizes.
- No article exhibited to be removed until the close of the Exhibition.
- Exhibitors will be given a receipt, which must be produced at the close of the Show before they can be allowed to remove their exhibits.
- Exhibitors should state when forwarding exhibits whether they are willing to send them to the Imperial Institute or other Exhibition, or whether they wish them to be returned.
- Free freight will be provided for all exhibits from the station nearest the estate in Ceylon to Peradeniya.
- Free freight will be provided for all foreign exhibits from Colombo to Peradeniya.
- Application forms entitling exhibitors to free freight for their exhibits only can be obtained from the Secretary, Ceylon Rubber Exhibition, The Customs, Colombo.
- Entries must state the nature of the exhibit, the weight (where it can be given), and the probable space required at the Exhibition.
- Entries for machinery, requiring power, are extended to August 13th, 1906.
- Entries of all exhibits except machinery requiring power to reach the Secretary on or before September 6th.
- Exhibitors sending machinery, to be driven by hand or power, will be expected to provide their own assistants to work the machinery.
- All machinery requiring power must be erected and in working order on or before the 1st September, 1906, at the grounds of the Exhibition.
- All other exhibits must reach Peradeniya not later than September 10th. They should be addressed to the Secretary, Rubber Exhibition, Peradeniya.
- The Committee will appoint Judges, whose decision shall be final.
- The Judges may not award a prize where they consider the exhibits do not justify an award, either on the ground of lack of quality or quantity of the exhibits. They may recommend to the Committee the award of special prizes for exhibits of special merit or interest.
- All arrangements for the display of the exhibits shall be made by the Committee.
- The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse to accept any exhibits.
- Government exhibits shall not be eligible for prizes in any class.



26. Space will be provided for tradesmen and others wishing to exhibit articles for sale but not for competition. The sale price must be clearly specified on each article. Salesmen will be required to erect their own stalls, the design to be submitted for the approval of the Secretary.
