WHEREAS by section 94 of "The Road Ordinance, 1861," it is enacted that whosoever shall leave, or permit to be left, on any road to which the provision in sub-section (4) of the said section 94 shall be extended, as hereinafter mentioned, any cart or other carriage without the oxen, horses, or other animals being yoked or harnessed thereto, unless such cart or carriage shall have accidentally broken down there, and in case of such accident for a longer time than may be necessary for its removal, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees:

And whereas it is further enacted by the said section that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, to declare that the aforesaid provision shall extend and be applicable to any road in this Colony or to any section of such road whenever it shall appear to the said Governor and Council that a sufficient number of halting-places has been constructed along the same:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Us, the said Governor and Council, that a sufficient number of halting-places, as set forth in the Schedule B hereto, has been constructed along certain roads in the District of Mullaittivu, Northern Province, set forth in the Schedule A hereto:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers in Us vested as aforesaid and with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation declare that the hereinbefore recited provision in sub-section (4) of section 94 of the said Ordinance shall, as from and after the date hereof, extend and be applicable to the said several roads set forth in the Schedule A hereto.

SCHEDULE A.

- I.—The road from Mullaittivu to Mankulam, known as the New Trace.
 II.—The road from Tanniyuthu to Kallolunkanpuliankulam, known as the Old Trace.
 III.—The road from Vavuniya to the boundary of the Mannar District, known as the Parayanalankulam road.
 IV.—The road from Vavuniya to the boundary of the North-Central Province, known as the Trincomalee road.
 V.—The portion of the road from Mannar to Madawachchi within the District of Mullaittivu, known as the Mannar-Madawachchi road.

GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

IN pursuance of section 10 of "The Poisons Ordinance, 1901," it is hereby notified that HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 9 of the said Ordinance and with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make the rules set forth in the schedule hereto for the purpose of controlling and regulating the possession and sale of cocaine and preparations of cocaine and salts of cocaine and their preparations.

Rules referred to.

1. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the term "cocaine" shall include all preparations of cocaine and salts of cocaine and their preparations, and the term "doctor" shall mean a medical practitioner registered as such under Ordinance No. 2 of 1905.
2. In issuing any license under section 4 of the Ordinance the Government Agent may in express terms exempt from the rights granted by such license the right to sell cocaine, and it shall not be lawful for the licensee on a license containing such an exemption to sell or expose or offer for sale cocaine in any quantity.
3. No person licensed to sell poisons, including cocaine by retail, shall sell cocaine by retail to any person other than a person known to him or introduced by some person known to him.
4. No licensed person shall sell by retail more than six grains of cocaine in a dry state or any solution containing more than ten grains of the active drug to the same person on the same day, unless the buyer is a qualified medical practitioner or a chemist or druggist licensed to sell poisons.
5. No person licensed to sell poisons, including cocaine by retail, shall keep in stock more than one ounce of cocaine.
6. None of the foregoing regulations shall apply to cocaine when forming part of the ingredients of any medicine dispensed by an apothecary or chemist and druggist on a doctor's prescription; but all prescriptions, if containing cocaine, shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose to be called the Prescription Book with the name of the person to whom it was sold and the name of the doctor prescribing. The name and address of the seller shall be attached to the receptacle containing the medicine prescribed.
7. No person licensed to sell poisons, including cocaine, by wholesale shall sell cocaine by wholesale, except —
 - (a) To persons licensed to sell poisons, including cocaine, by wholesale or retail.
 - (b) To a qualified medical practitioner.
8. No person licensed to sell poisons, including cocaine, by wholesale—
 - (a) Shall sell to any person whomsoever cocaine in less quantities than one ounce of dry cocaine.
 - (b) Shall sell cocaine to retail dealers or to qualified medical practitioners, save in quantities of one ounce.
 - (c) Shall sell cocaine in quantities exceeding one ounce, except to persons licensed to sell poisons, including cocaine, by wholesale.
9. All cocaine arriving in the Island consigned to any wholesale dealer shall be declared at the Customs premises as cocaine, and shall only be removed from the Customs or Post Office with a permit on the following form:—

RULES REFERRED TO.

1. It shall be unlawful for any person, within the limits of the Game Sanctuary, to carry any gun for the purpose of hunting, unless he shall have obtained a permit in writing from the Government Agent or the Assistant Government Agent of the District.

2. No person shall, on any pretext whatever, take or allow to be taken or to stray any dog for the purpose of hunting within the limits of the Game Sanctuary.

3. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish in any lagoon within the limits of the Sanctuary, or to settle on the coast for the purpose of fishing, except with the permission in writing of the Government Agent or the Assistant Government of the District. In the case of lagoon fishing, such permits at no one time to exceed six in number.

IT is hereby notified for general information that Chief Headmen classified in the Third Class of the schedules attached to the Minute dated February 14, 1906, regulating the payment of batta to witnesses and jurors attending the Supreme Court, and that dated January 7, 1907, regulating the payment of batta to District Court witnesses, will, from January 1, 1908, be paid batta at the rates prescribed for persons specified in the Second Class of the said schedules.

Memorandum.

Notice with regard to any Open Competitive Examinations for the Civil Service of India, Clerkships (Class I.) in the Home Civil Service, or Eastern Cadetships in the Colonial Service that may be held in the year 1908, and also for any other competition that may be held in combination therewith.

1. In view of the importance of legible handwriting in the public service, candidates are warned that the provision as to deductions for bad handwriting in these competitions will be strictly enforced.

2. Candidates are warned that full marks cannot be obtained on any paper, unless the whole of it is answered, or, in cases where the number of questions to be answered is specified, unless the full number specified is answered.

3. *Modern Languages.*—Paper I. will consist of translation from and into the language. In Paper II. (Language and Literature) candidates will be invited to answer in the foreign language some of the questions, and marks will be allotted for accuracy, facility, and elegance in the composition of these answers. Separate papers in original composition will, if necessary, be set to Foreign Office candidates. Passages for translation may be set, and questions asked, demanding a knowledge of the respective languages in their early stages; but it will not be obligatory upon candidates to master in detail the old forms in use, as regards French, German, or Spanish, before 1500; or, as regards Italian, before the time of Dante.

4. *General Modern History.*—Candidates are warned that high marks will not be awarded in this subject, unless the text of the prescribed books has been carefully studied by them. Candidates must be prepared to answer questions on historical geography and to draw sketch maps.

5. *English History.*—The number of marks assigned to the question or questions dealing with the text of the prescribed books will be, both in Period I. and in Period II., about one-sixth of that assigned to the whole subject. Candidates must be prepared to answer questions on historical geography and to draw sketch maps.

6. *Greek and Roman History.*—Candidates must be prepared to answer questions on historical geography and to draw sketch maps.

7. *Political Economy.*—Candidates should pay attention to the study of statistical methods.

8. *Natural Sciences.*—Candidates are warned that the practical examinations carry a large proportion of the marks.

It is proposed to make a similar addition to the list of subjects for open competitive examinations held after 1908 for the Civil Service of India and for Eastern Cadetships in the Colonial Services.

VITAL STATISTICS.

COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended January 4, 1908, is subjoined.

Births.—The total births were 82. The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum was 23·8,* as against 20·6 in the preceding week and 23·3 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 98. The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 31·6,† as against 29·8 in the previous week and 51·3 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—No person died from cholera, smallpox, or measles; 16 died from diarrhoea and dysentery; 10 from phthisis; 15 from bronchitis and pneumonia; 3 from different kinds of fever; and 8 from infantile convulsions.

Infantile deaths.—Of the 98 total deaths, 32 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 42 in the corresponding week of the previous year.

* Calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1908, viz., 180,262.

† The rates given for this and the preceding week are the corrected rates, i.e., the rates calculated for the population of the town estimated on July 1, 1908, on the basis that its age- and sex-constitution is the same as for the Island. The rate shown for the corresponding week of last year is the crude rate.
