IN pursuance of section 10 of "The Poisons Ordinance, 1901," it is hereby notified that HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 9 of the said Ordinance and with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make the rules set forth in the schedule hereto for the purpose of controlling and regulating the possession and sale of cocaine and preparations of cocaine and salts of cocaine and their preparations.

#### RULES REFERRED TO.

- 1. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the term "cocaine" shall include all preparations of cocaine and salts of cocaine and their preparations, and the term "doctor" shall mean a medical practitioner registered as such under Ordinance No. 2 of 1905.
- 2. In issuing any license under section 4 of the Ordinance the Government Agent may in express terms exempt from the rights granted by such license the right to sell cocaine, and it shall not be lawful for the licensee on a license containing such an exemption to sell or expose or offer for sale cocaine in any quantity.
- 3. No person licensed to sell poisons, including cocaine by retail, shall sell cocaine by retail to any person other than a person known to him or introduced by some person known to him.
- 4. No licensed person shall sell by retail more than six grains of cocaine in a dry state or any solution containing more than ten grains of the active drug to the same person on the same day, unless the buyer is a qualified medical practitioner or a chemist or druggist licensed to sell poisons.
- 5. No person licensed to sell poisons, including cocaine by retail, shall keep in stock more than one ounce of cocaine.
- 6. None of the foregoing regulations shall apply to cocaine when forming part of the ingredients of any medicine dispensed by an apothecary or chemist and druggist on a doctor's prescription; but all prescriptions, if containing cocaine, shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose to be called the Prescription Book with the name of the person to whom it was sold and the name of the doctor prescribing. The name and address of the seller shall be attached to the receptacle containing the medicine prescribed.
- 7. No person licensed to sell poisons, including cocaine, by wholesale shall sell cocaine by wholesale, except
  - (a) To persons licensed to sell poisons, including cocaine, by wholesale or retail.

(b) To a qualified medical practitioner.

- 8. No person licensed to sell poisons, including cocaine, by wholesale-
  - (a) Shall sell to any person whomsoever cocaine in less quantities than one ounce of dry cocaine.
  - (b) Shall sell cocaine to retail dealers or to qualified medical practitioners, save in quantities of one ounce.
  - (c) Shall sell cocaine in quantities exceeding one ounce, except to persons licensed to sell poisons, including cocaine, by wholesale.
- 9. All cocaine arriving in the Island consigned to any wholesale dealer shall be declared at the Customs premises as cocaine, and shall only be removed from the Customs or Post Office with a permit on the following form:—

#### Rules under Section 17 of Ordinance No. 4 of 1906.

Under Sub-section (a).—Food, Fuel, and Water.

I.—(1) In the case of every ship subject to the provisions of this Ordinance the scale on which food, fuel, and water are to be supplied to the passengers per head per diem shall be as follows:—

(2) In the case of steamships carrying an apparatus for distilling fresh from salt water, a supply equal to five-sevenths of a gallon per head per diem shall suffice.

(3) Children above one year and under twelve years shall receive half rations.
(4) Passengers who desire to provide themselves with their own food shall be allowed to do so, but fuel and water shall be supplied by the ship.

Under Sub-section (b).—Medical Stores and other Appliances and Fittings for maintaining Health, Cleanliness, and Decency.

II.—(1) Every such ship shall have on board a supply of medicines and appliances as set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed, together with written or printed instructions for their use in a language which the commander or some other officer of the ship can read:—

(2) The medicines and surgical appliances above specified shall be supplied for the use of the passengers whenever circumstances so require; and if the medical officer, or, where there is none, the master of the ship, omits, when circumstances so require, to supply the same, he shall be punished with fine which may extend to two hundred rupees.

II.—(1) Every such ship carrying more than one hundred passengers shall carry the materials for the erection of a temporary hospital to provide for the treatment of such cases of sickness as it may be considered desirable to separate (such as smallpox, cholera, yellow fever, or plague), and for any general outbreak of sickness, when it would be necessary to keep the sick passengers apart from the The part of the upper deck upon which such temporary hospital shall be erected shall be pointed out and measured off by the principal officer in charge of the Customs at the port of embarkation or any person authorized by him. framework of the hospital may be either of iron (in pieces that can be easily fitted together) or of wooden spars or bamboos. The roof must be tented, and both that and the side walls must be made of stout canvas and be perfectly water-tight, due provision being at the same time made for ventilation. The superficial area of the floor shall be not less than 72 feet, and such floor shall be raised at least 4 in. from the deck; sheet iron is preferable as the material of the floor. The space for the hospital must always be deducted from the area measured for passengers on board of such ships.

(2) The temporary hospital shall always be erected at once and made available for the use of sick passengers whenever the circumstances as described above so

require.

(3) If the master of any ship omits to erect a temporary hospital as required by this rule, he shall be punished with fine, which may extend to two hundred rupees, and with a further fine of twenty rupees for every day after the first during which the omission continues.

IV.—(1) Every such ship shall be fitted with not less than two privies sufficiently screened from public view and readily accessible and available at all times for the use of the passengers, and with one more such privy for every one hundred passengers, or part of that number, carried in excess of one hundred; but no privies shall be allowed in the between decks.

(2) A proportion of such privies, in any case not less than one if there be any females among the passengers, shall be set apart for the exclusive use of females, such proportion corresponding, as nearly as may be, to the proportion of female to male passengers.

V.—Every such ship shall be provided with and have available for the use of the passengers not less than two places for washing sufficiently screened from public view, whereof a full proportion, as described in rule IV., shall be set apart exclusively for females. A sufficient number of hand pumps shall also be provided for supplying sea water for purposes of ablution.

VI.—On every such ship cattle shall be kept securely penned in, so as not to inconvenience the passengers.

VII.—(1) Every such ship shall be provided with not less than two cabooses, or cooking ranges, on deck, properly housed and covered, to which passengers shall have ready access at certain times in each day. The ranges shall be made of substantial plate iron lined inside with bricks, and raised at least 4 in. from the deck, with an outlet or chimney at the top for the escape of smoke. Each range shall contain at least five cooking places, and an additional range shall be provided for

every two hundred passengers carried in excess of one hundred. Cooking on board in the passengers' own stoves is prohibited, and any passenger so cooking or attempting to cook shall be punished with fine, which may extend to one hundred rupees.

(2) The crew of the ship shall not be allowed to use the cooking ranges set apart for passengers during the period passengers are on board, but shall be provided with a separate cooking range.

VIII.—The master of any ship omitting to keep any privy, washing place, or cooking range available for the use of the passengers, or any cattle securely penned in, or allowing the crew of the ship to use any cooking range set apart for passengers in breach of the foregoing rules, shall be punished with fine, which may extend to two hundred rupees, and when the breach is a continuing one with a further fine of twenty rupees for every day after the first during which the breach continues.

Under Sub-section (c).—Boats, Anchors, and Cables.

IX.—Every such ship shall be provided with boats according to the scale faid down in the annexed schedule, all such boats being fully fitted with all usual appliances:—

In ships of 200 tons and upwards, no boat of less than 90 feet of cubical contents is to be counted in the number.

In ships of 600 tons and upwards, two of the boats should be lifeboats.

No greater number of boats need be taken than are sufficient to carry all the crew and passengers on board.

The cubic contents of the boats in the foregoing table are ascertained by multiplying their outside length, their outside width, and their inside depth together, and then the product by 0.6.

X.—Every such ship shall be provided with not less than three anchors and cables.

Under Sub-section (d).—Apparatus for extinguishing and Precautions against Fire.

- XI.—Every such ship shall be provided—
- (a) If she be a steamship, with hose sufficient to reach from her engines to her stem and taffrail;
- (b) If she be a sailing ship, with one fire engine or force pump, with hose sufficient to reach from her stem to her taffrail; and if her tonnage exceed 800 tons, with a second such engine or force pump, with like hose; and
- 800 tons, with a second such engine or force pump, with like hose; and
  (c) In the case both of steamships and sailing ships, with fire buckets in the
  proportion of three for every 100 tons up to 600, and two for every 100
  tons above 600, provided that fifty in all shall suffice.

XII.—If fire annihilators or fire engines are carried, they shall be placed by the master under the special charge of one of the principal officers of the ship and the ship's carpenter, who should be held responsible that, with the buckets and other fire apparatus, they are kept in a state fit for immediate use. The engine shall be worked not less than once a week, and shall be kept in proper order. As soon as possible after leaving port the officers and crew shall be divided into parties and assigned to stations in case of fire. The master of any such ship failing to comply with the requirements of this rule shall be punished with fine, which may extend to two hundred rupees.

XIII.—The cargo of every such ship shall before leaving port be properly stowed away, and the decks cleared of any loose straw, hay, or other inflammable material. If any such ship leaves port without having the cargo so stowed and the decks so cleared, the master shall be punished with fine, which may extend to two hundred rupees.

XIV.—Immediately before leaving port the passengers of every such ship shall be called on to deliver up whatever lucifer matches, gunpowder, or other inflammable articles they may have about them. Any passenger omitting or refusing to deliver up any such articles when called upon to do so shall be punished with fine, which may extend to one hundred rupees.

XV.—No naked lights shall on any account be used in the hold or storerooms or in the between decks, except under trustworthy superintendence. No person shall read in bed with a naked light. Smoking between decks is strictly prohibited. Spirits must never be opened in the hold, but should be hoisted on deck for the purpose. Any person committing a breach of this rule shall be punished with a fine, which may extend to two hundred rupees.

Under Sub-section (e).—Appliances for saving Life and making Signals of Distress.

XVI.—Every such ship shall be provided with an adequate supply of life buoys, not less than four for each vessel, signals of distress, and inextinguishable lights fitted for attachment to the life-buoys.

Under Sub-section (f).—Access of Between Passengers to the Upper Deck.

XVII.—If any portion of the upper deck of a ship be reserved for the exclusive use of a particular passenger or of passengers of a particular class, the area so reserved shall not exceed such limit as will leave free space for the access of the intermediate or between deck passengers to an extent of the upper deck equals to not less than 6 superficial feet for each such passenger.

#### VITAL STATISTICS.

## COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended January 11, 1908, is subjoined.

Births.—The total births were 125. The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum was 36.2,\* as against 23.8 in the preceding week and 21.5 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 113. The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 36.5,† as against 31.6 in the previous week and 52.8 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—No person died from cholera, smallpox, or measles; 10 died from diarrhoea and dysentery; 18 from phthisis; 16 from bronchitis and pneumonia; 9 from different kinds of fever; and 16 from infantile convulsions.

Infantile deaths.—Of the 113 total deaths, 32 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 35 in the corresponding week of the previous year.

\* Calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1908, viz., 180,262.

† The rates given for this and the preceding week are the corrected rates, i.e., the rates calculated for the population of the town estimated on July 1, 1908, on the basis that its age- and sex-constitution is the same as for the Island. The rate shown for the corresponding week of last year is the crude rate.
