Section VI.

7. No armed parties of soldiers or sailors from any ships of war or transport, except those of His Majesty's Service, are to be landed from any vessel without the permission of the Governor obtained through the Consular Office of the country to which the troops belong.

Power is reserved to the Governor to limit the number of men to be landed and to forbid the landing of unarmed parties, except on such conditions as he may from time to time prescribe.

In the event of foreign ships of war or transports intending to land more than 250 men, a form to be handed to the Commander by the Pilot shall be filled in and returned to the Pilot.

WHEREAS by section 4 (1) of Ordinance No. 3 of 1903 it is enacted that when it appears to the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time, that by reason of the existence or apprehension of crime and outrage in any district it is desirable to quarter police in such district, he may, by Proclamation, which shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, declare that for the reason aforesaid such district requires police, and may order police to be quartered in such district :

And whereas it appears to the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, that by reason of the existence of crime and outrage in the district defined in the schedule hereunto annexed, it is desirable to quarter police in the said district :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that by reason of the existence of crime and outrage therein the said district in the Western Province requires police, and do hereby order that a police force consisting of one police sergeant and four constables be quartered in the said district in the said Western Province as from and after January 27, 1908.

And We do further hereby define the limits of the said district to be those set out in the schedule hereunto annexed.

WHEREAS by section 94 of "The Road Ordinance, 1861," it is amongst other things enacted that whosoever shall leave or permit to be left on any road to which the provision in sub-sections (4) and (5) of the said section 94 shall be extended as thereafter mentioned any cart or other carriage without the oxen, horses, or other animals being yoked or harnessed thereto, unless such cart or carriage shall have accidentally broken down there, and in case of such accident for a longer time than may be necessary for its removal, or shall drive any cart drawn by one or more bullocks or suffer the same to remain in any thoroughfare between the hours of sunset and sunrise without having a light attached thereto, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees :

And whereas it is further enacted by the said section that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, to declare that the aforesaid provisions shall extend and be applicable to any road in this Colony, or to any section of such road, whenever it shall appear to the said Governor and Council that a sufficient number of halting places has been constructed along the same :

And whereas it has been made to appear to Us, the said Governor and Council, that a sufficient number of halting places have been constructed along the roads mentioned in Schedule A hereto annexed in the District of Mannar in the Northern Province :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, in exercise of the power in Us vested as aforesaid and with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation declare that the hereinbefore recited provisions in sub-sections (4) and (5) of section 94 of the said Ordinance shall, from and after the date hereof, extend and be applicable to the said roads mentioned in Schedule A hereto annexed.

By-laws referred to.

1. A registration fee of 25 cents per annum shall be paid upon each dog kept within the said town.
2. Such registration fee shall be due on and after May 1, 1908, and shall be paid in advance before June 1 in each year.
3. To facilitate the recovery of such registration fee the occupier of every house within the said town shall, on or before December 1 in each year, furnish to an officer authorized by the Government Agent, Galle, to demand the same a list in the form in schedule annexed of the dog or dogs kept in such house, and the names of the owners thereof.
4. On payment of the registration fee on any dog the Government Agent shall, unless the owner provides his own collar to be stamped, furnish the owner with a stamped collar to be worn by such dog on payment of a fee of 25 cents.
5. Every inhabitant within the said town becoming possessed of any dog or dogs after the furnishing of the list referred to in by-law 3 shall furnish the officer appointed by the Government Agent mentioned in the said by-law with an additional list of such dog or dogs within one month after acquiring the same, and the owner of such dog or dogs shall become liable to the registration fee for the current year within fifteen days after the list required by this by-law becomes due.
6. It shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Government Agent to require the production of any dog for which registration is applied for, and to decline to issue a certificate of registration until it is produced.
7. It shall be lawful for the Government Agent to refuse to issue a certificate of registration, or to cancel a certificate already issued for any dog, which in his opinion is so maimed or diseased as to be unfit to live, or which is habitually ill-treated or continually neglected by its owner.
8. The owner of every dog for which a certificate has been refused or cancelled shall, on being noticed to do so, produce the dog at the house of the officer appointed by the Government Agent at a time to be stated in the notice and deliver it to the said officer, and every such dog may be destroyed or otherwise disposed of as the Government Agent shall think fit.
9. It shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Government Agent to seize all stray dogs and deal with them in terms of sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 10 of the Ordinance No. 25 of 1901.

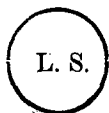

A P R O C L A M A T I O N .

WHEREAS it is enacted by the First Section of Law 4 of 1884—"The Seeds and Plants Importation Law, 1884"—that it shall be lawful for the Governor to revoke or vary any Proclamation made by him under that section :

And whereas General Sir Henry Wylie Norman, G.C.B., G.C.M.G., C.I.E., Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief in and over the Island of Jamaica and its Dependencies, by Proclamation made on December 2, 1887, prohibited until further Proclamation the importation into this Island of seeds or plants of any description of earth or soil or any article packed therewith that may have come either directly or indirectly from any of the following countries, viz., Natal, South India, Ceylon, Mauritius, Java, and Fiji :

Now therefore I, the Governor, do hereby revoke the afore-mentioned Proclamation bearing date December 2, 1887, and I hereby proclaim that I prescribe the following conditions as conditions under which alone the importation of any of the articles aforesaid shall be permitted that may have come either directly or indirectly from any of the countries aforesaid, viz., that all such articles (including seeds) imported from the afore-mentioned countries shall be fumigated in accordance with the instructions published in the *Jamaica Gazette* of January 9, 1908.

VITAL STATISTICS.

COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended January 25, 1908, is subjoined (D).

Births.—The total births were 86. The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum was 24·9,* as against 33·9 in the preceding week and 24·8 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 115. The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 37·1,† as against 35·2 in the previous week and 38·6 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—No person died from cholera, smallpox, or measles; 19 died from diarrhoea and dysentery; 17 from phthisis; 14 from bronchitis and pneumonia; 5 from different kinds of fever; and 9 infantile from convulsions.

Infantile deaths.—Of the 115 total deaths, 35 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 30 in the corresponding week of the previous year.

* Calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1908, viz., 180,262.

† The rates given for this and the preceding week are the corrected rates, i.e., the rates calculated for the population of the town estimated on July 1, 1908, on the basis that its age- and sex-constitution is the same as for the Island. The rate shown for the corresponding week of last year is the crude rate.
