Upon all other telegrams a delivery charge of 50 cents between the hours of 6 A.M. and 6 P.M. and Re. 1 between the hours of 6 P.M. and 6 A.M., if within 5 miles of a station, must be prepaid.

Telegrams will not be accepted for delivery at any destination more than 5 miles

distant from a station.

IT is hereby notified for general information that it having come under the notice of the Governor that Crown land is frequently sold without the boundaries being clearly defined at the time of sale, His Excellency has impressed upon the Government Agents the fact that it is unfair both to the individual and to the State to issue a Crown grant for land the boundaries of which are not defined on the ground and recognizable by the purchasers and the headmen who put them in possession, and has directed that in future no Crown land should be put up for sale without a certificate from the Chief Headman who reports on it that the boundaries are clearly recognizable.

By-laws referred to.

- 1. A registration fee of 25 cents per annum shall be paid upon each dog kept within the said town.
- 2. Such registration fee shall be due on and after May 1, 1908, and shall be paid in advance before June 1 in each year.
- 3. To facilitate the recovery of such registration fee the occupier of every house within the said town shall, on or before December 1 in each year, furnish to an officer authorized by the Government Agent, Galle, to demand the same a list in the form in schedule annexed of the dog or dogs kept in such house, and the names of the owners thereof.
- 4. On payment of the registration fee on any dog the Government Agent shall, unless the owner provides his own collar to be stamped, furnish the owner with a stamped collar to be worn by such dog on payment of a fee of 25 cents.
- 5. Every inhabitant within the said town becoming possessed of any dog or dogs after the furnishing of the list referred to in by-law 3 shall furnish the officer appointed by the Government Agent mentioned in the said by-law with an additional list of such dog or dogs within one month after acquiring the same, and the owner of such dog or dogs shall become liable to the registration fee for the current year within fifteen days after the list required by this by-law becomes due.
- 6. It shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Government Agent to require the production of any dog for which registration is applied for, and to decline to issue a certificate of registration until it is produced.
- 7. It shall be lawful for the Government Agent to refuse to issue a certificate of registration, or to cancel a certificate already issued for any dog, which in his opinion is so maimed or diseased as to be unfit to live, or which is habitually ill-treated or continually neglected by its owner.
- 8. The owner of every dog for which a certificate has been refused or cancelled shall, on being noticed to do so, produce the dog at the house of the officer appointed by the Government Agent at a time to be stated in the notice and deliver it to the said officer, and every such dog may be destroyed or otherwise disposed of as the Government Agent shall think fit.
- 9. It shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Government Agent to seize all stray dogs and deal with them in terms of sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 10 of the Ordinance No. 25 of 1901.

A PROCLAMATION.

W HEREAS it is enacted by the First Section of Law 4 of 1884—"The Seeds and Plants Importation Law, 1884"—that it shall be lawful for the Governor to revoke or vary any Proclamation made by him under that section:

And whereas General Sir Henry Wylie Norman, G.C.B., G.C.M.G., C.I.E., Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief in and over the Island of Jamaica and its Dependencies, by Proclamation made on December 2, 1887, prohibited until further Proclamation the importation into this Island of seeds or plants or any description of earth or soil or any article packed therewith that may have come either directly or indirectly from any of the following countries, viz., Natal, South India, Ceylon, Mauritius, Java, and Fiji:

Now therefore I, the Governor, do hereby revoke the afore-mentioned Proclamation bearing date December 2, 1887, and I hereby proclaim that I prescribe the following conditions as conditions under which alone the importation of any of the articles aforesaid shall be permitted that may have come either directly or indirectly from any of the countries aforesaid, viz., that all such articles (including seeds) imported from the afore-mentioned countries shall be fumigated in accordance with the instructions published in the *Jamaica Gazette* of January 9, 1908.

VITAL STATISTICS.

COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended January 25, 1908, is subjoined (D).

Births.—The total births were 86. The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum was 24.9,* as against 33.9 in the preceding week and 24.8 in the corresponding week of last year.

The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 37.1,† as against Deaths.—The total deaths were 115.

35.2 in the previous week and 38.6 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—No person died from cholera, smallpox, or measles; 19 died from diarrhœa and dysentery; 17 from phthisis; 14 from bronchitis and pneumonia; 5 from different kinds of fever; and 9 infantile from convulsions.

Infantile deaths.—Of the 115 total deaths, 35 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 30 in the corresponding week of the previous year.
