## Part 1.-Departmental Orders.

1.-All Departmental Orders will in future be published in Part I. of the Coyless Police Gasette, which should be filed separately from Part II., which will consist of the old "Hue and Cry."

2.—The Inspector-General's Circular Guard File is abclished.

#### 13 .--- Rules to be observed at Cup Competition.

THE following rules must be strictly observed at the onsuing Cup Competition on 4th October, 1906 :---

1. No instructions whatever may be given to the men at the firing point.

2. Paper or artificial sights are strictly prohibited.

3. The decision of the Range Officer shall be final in all matters in connection with the firing.

4. One man of each team shall be selected to fire at a time at each wange.

5. The result of each shot shall be called out with the name of the firer by any one selected by the Range Officer.

6. Each division must furnish its own carbines.

7. Butt slips should be kept by the officer in charge of each butt in the form, which can be obtained on application to the Inspector-General of Police.

S. The Register must be kept by the Range Officer in his own hand. The Range Officer will be the Senior Officer present.

#### 14.—Police Officer not to be paid beyond the Date of Cessation of Duty.

CASES have occurred where retiring Policemen have been paid salaries beyond the date of cessation of duty as stated in their Pension papers. This has necessitated the recovery of the amounts so overpaid from their pension or allowance through the Hon, the Treasurer. Such a procedure causes inconvenience in the Treasury as well as in this office. It is therefore requested that in no case should a Police Officer be paid salary beyond the date of cessation of duty as stated in his Pension paper.
