#### MISCELLANEOUS DEPARTMENTAL NOTICES.

#### COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended 6th October, 1906, is subjoined (A).

Births.—The total births were 77. The birth-rate per 1,000 was 23·2,\* as against 27·7 in the preceding week and 19·0 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 104. The death-rate per 1,000 was 31·3,\* as against 34·6 in the previous week and 30·7 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—No persons died from cholera, smallpox, or measles; 14 died from diarrheea and dysentery; 16 from phthisis, bronchitis, and pneumonia; 5 from different kinds of fever; and 11 from infantile convulsions.

Infantile deaths.—Of the 104 total deaths, 28 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 27 in the corresponding week of the previous year.

EALED Tenders, Tmarked on the envelopes "Tender for the privilege of selling Fruits, &c., on the Platforms to Third Class Passengers at Galle," from January 1 to December 31, 1907, will be received up to 12 noon on Monday, October 29, 1906, from persons willing to tender for the same.

Tenders must be submitted in duplicate, the original being forwarded to the General Manager of the Railway and the duplicate direct to the Hon. the
