PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

IN the Name of His Majesty EDWARD THE SEVENTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir HENRY ARTHUR BLAKE, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

HENRY A. BLAKE.

WHEREAS by section 19 of "The Forest Ordinance, 1885," as amended by section 6 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1892, it is enacted that whenever the following events have occurred, viz:—

- (a) The period fixed under section 7 of the first-mentioned Ordinance for preferring claims has elapsed, and all claims (if any) made within such period have been disposed of by the Forest Settlement Officer; and
- (b) If such claims have been made, the periods fixed for appealing from the orders passed on such claims have elapsed, and all appeals (if any) presented within such period have been disposed of by the Supreme Court; and
- (c) All lands (if any) to be included in the proposed forest, which may be acquired under section 13 of the said "Forest Ordinance, 1885," have become vested in the Crown—

the Governor shall, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, specify the limits of the forest which it is intended to reserve, and declare the same to be reserved from a date fixed by such Proclamation :

And whereas all things necessary for declaring the forest hereinafter mentioned to be a reserved forest have been fulfilled, and all periods hereinbefore recited have elapsed, and it is expedient to specify the limits of such forest, and to declare such forest to be reserved :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, in exercise of the power in Us vested as aforesaid, do by this Our Proclamation specify the limits of the said forest to be those specified in the schedule hereto, and do declare the said forest to be a reserved forest as from and after the First day of October, 1906, reserving, nevertheless, the following rights :—

1. Rights to the landowners in the villages of—

- (a) Harakgama kanda
- (b) Widurupola
- (c) Radakandurewela
- (d) Gawaramana—

in Udapalata korale of Udukinda, in the Province of Uva, to use the water of the Sita Eliya-oya flowing through the reserved forest for the purpose of irrigating their fields.

2. Right of individuals in possession either as proprietors or tenants of lands in the aforesaid villages to forest produce hereinafter specified, such right being limited and restricted to that part of the forest lying to the east of the following bounds, viz., the path from Sita Eliya to the point where it joins the Ambawela-Nuwara Eliya road, thence the Ambawela-Nuwara Eliya road to the point where it crosses a trench cut as a continuation of the eastern boundary of title plan 49,376, thence the trench so cut as far as the Province boundary. The right to forest produce reserved is as follows :—

- (a) To individuals in possession either as proprietors or as tenants of lands in the aforesaid villages of Harakgamakanda, Widurupola, Radakandurewela, and Gawaramana, the right of taking creepers for building houses and of taking honey for their personal use only.
- (b) To individuals in possession either as proprietors or tenants of lands in the aforesaid village of Harakgamakanda, the right of taking timber sufficient for making fifty ploughs annually.
- (c) To individuals in possession either as proprietors or as tenants of lands in the aforesaid village of Widurupola, the right of taking timber sufficient for making sixty ploughs annually.
- (d) To individuals in possession either as proprietors or as tenants of lands in the aforesaid village of Radakandurewela, the right of taking timber sufficient for making twenty-five ploughs annually.
- (e) To individuals in possession either as proprietors or as tenants of lands in the aforesaid village of Gawaramana, the right of taking timber sufficient for making forty ploughs annually.

The right to the above-mentioned timber being restricted and confined to the following species :—

- (a) Boralu.
- (b) Gurenda.
- (c) Kududawla.
- (d) Kaha.
- (e) Panderu.

Permits for the above specified timber to be issued by the Assistant Conservator of Forests, Nuwara Eliya, or other officer empowered by Government.

3. Right of way of the proprietors of Mahagastota estate over the reserved forest for foot passengers, cattle, and vehicles along the cart road from Blackpool bridge to Mahagastota factory.

4. Right of pasture of the proprietors of the aforesaid Mahagastota estate to the west of the 3rd milepost on the Nuwara Eliya-Ambawela road.

5. Right of way over the reserved forest for foot passengers, horses, and cattle along the Nuwara Eliya-Ambawela District Road Committee road and along the road joining it from Sita Eliya.

6. Right of way for foot passengers along the path leading from Albion estate to Kiiwana Eliya and along the path from Sita Eliya to Magoda.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this First day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Six.

BY-LAW REFERRED TO.

RULES.

1. No person licensed to carry on the trade of a butcher in the planting district shall slaughter cattle and sheep at any place other than the slaughter-house at Ragalla estate.
2. The exposure shed adjoining the Ragalla Police Station is hereby appointed as the spot in which the licensed butchers of the planting district of Ragalla shall, as required by section 12, sub-section (1), of the Ordinance No. 9 of 1893, expose for public view all cattle intended for slaughter for a period of not less than 24 hours immediately preceding the time of slaughter.
3. No cattle or sheep shall be slaughtered at the slaughter-house, except on such days and between such hours as may be determined by the Assistant Government Agent, Nuwara Eliya, notice of which shall be posted at the said slaughter-house.
4. No animals shall be slaughtered for human food until after they have been inspected and approved by the Medical Officer, Uda Pussellawa, as fit to be slaughtered for human food. Animals rejected as unfit for slaughter shall be immediately removed.
5. The said District Medical Officer may prohibit the slaughter of any animal notwithstanding that it has been approved as aforesaid if it should before slaughter be found to be diseased or otherwise unfit to be slaughtered for human food.
6. If on any animal which has been approved as aforesaid being slaughtered the carcase shall appear diseased or unfit for human food, the said District Medical Officer shall cause the meat to be immediately destroyed or so disposed of as to prevent its being exposed for sale or used for human food.
7. The person in charge of the slaughter-house shall not permit the slaughter of any animals which have not been approved as aforesaid as fit to be slaughtered for human food, or the slaughter of which the said District Medical Officer has prohibited as provided by rule 5.
8. No person shall remove from the slaughter-house, except under the directions of the said District Medical Officer, any meat which the latter has declared to be unfit for human food.
9. The fee for slaughtering shall be 75 cents for each head of cattle.
10. The person in charge of the slaughter-house shall keep a register in the form annexed of all cattle brought to the slaughter-house.
