MISCELLANEOUS DEPARTMENTAL NOTICES.

COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended 10th November, 1906, is subjoined (A).

Births.—The total births were 88. The birth-rate per 1,000 was 26.5,* as against 26.2 in the preceding week and 23.0 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 157. The death-rate per 1,000 was 47.3,* as against 40.0 in the previous week and 47.0 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—No persons died from cholera, smallpox, or measles; 28 died from diarrhoea and dysentery; 50 from phthisis, bronchitis, and pneumonia; 10 from different kinds of fever; and 9 from infantile convulsions.

Infantile deaths.—Of the 157 total deaths, 36 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 46 in the corresponding week of the previous year.
